

Charlie Crosby, James Pan, Mitchell Brown and Dominic Frerichs are the MSHSL Class A State Champions in the 200 Medley relay with an Automatic All-American time of 1:32.66. These young men also achieved great individual accomplishments. Dominic Frerichs finished 11th overall in his 200 IM, 12th overall in his 100 freestyle and 6th overall in the 400 free relay at the MSHSL State Tournament. Charlie Crosby finished as the State Champion in the 50 freestyle with a time of :20.41 and breaking the MN State Class A meet record at prelims with a time of :20.31. Both times qualify as an Automatic All-American. Charlie was also the State Champion in the 100 backstroke finishing with a time of :48.57. In Prelims Charlie broke the MN State Class A meet record with a :47.65. Achieving an Automatic All-American time standard. Charlie's 50 free and 100 back were also new school records. Mitchell Brown finished 3rd at the MSHSL State Meet in the 100 butterfly with a time of :50.29, breaking a ten-year old school record. Mitchell finished 4th in his

100 breaststroke with a time of :57.17. Mitchell was also on the 200 freestyle relay with James Pan finishing 2nd at the MSHSL State Meet with an Automatic American time and a new school record. James Pan finished 2nd in his 200 IM at the MSHSL State Meet with a time of 1:49.74. Not only a new school record, but also an All-American Consideration time. James finished 2nd in his 100 breaststroke with a :55.14. A new school record and an Automatic All-American time. Both James and Charlie were named Section 2A Athlete of the Year. All of the guys are fantastic swimmers, but what stands out the most is their guided leadership, support they demonstrate to their teammates along with their humility.




Olivia Mobley

Olivia's hockey during February was nothing less than phenomenal. During the month, she continued her outstanding season, recording 14 goals and 9 assists in 6 games – representing nearly 4 points per game. Along with a section championship, these efforts propelled her team to an unprecedented 3rd straight Class A state championship. In addition, Olivia received numerous individual awards, including being named the Metro Player of the Year for girls hockey. Additionally, Olivia was also named Ms. Hockey.

During Olivia's hockey career, she amassed a total of 283 points. Based on Olivia's performance, she set four individual Breck girls hockey school hockey records.

At section finals, Andrew broke the section records he set last year in both the 200 IM and 100 breaststroke. At Class A state, he broke his 100 Breaststroke record at both prelims and finals, and JUST missed his 200 IM record both days. He was able to defend both of his titles in the 200 IM and 100 Breast, taking first place in each. Again this season, both his 200 IM and 100 breaststroke times at state were automatic All-American times. All four years of high school, Andrew has maintained his 4.0 GPA while also performing in the band and orchestra as the oboist. He also played trombone in the pep and jazz bands all four years at Minnehaha. This year, he is a National Merit Finalist, an AP Scholar with Distinction, and an MSHSL Triple A finalist, excelling in academics, athletics, and the arts. Andrew is headed to Swarthmore College next year where he will swim, study pre-med, and perform music.
