

## ***Lockdown information at Surrey Public School***

***Children are our most precious resource and it is our responsibility to ensure their safety!***

All Schools in ND are required to conduct emergency and disaster drills; Surrey School conducts several of these drills throughout the school year. Below are the ND century code for Emergency/disaster drills and ND DPI's definition of a lockdown.

### **15.1-06-12. Emergency and disaster drills - Implementation.**

Each public and nonpublic school shall conduct fire, tornado, and other emergency or disaster drills, including lockdown drills.

What is a lockdown?

A school lockdown confines all staff and students to the classroom due to a perceived or real threat; isolation of staff and students inside the school limits exposure to risk to outside contaminants: people, exposures or situations. The practice of lockdown drills acclimates both staff and students to the process and probability, and ultimately avoids unnecessary responses.

Surrey School has two types of lockdowns:

1. Intruder lockdown- Threatening situation
2. Non-violent lockdown- Non-threatening situation

Due to the sensitivity of lockdowns and the safety of your child, lockdown procedures are not disclosed.
