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

WHAT IS THE ELIGIBILITY CENTER?

- » A unit within the NCAA responsible for evaluating and certifying college-bound student-athletes for collegiate competition at Division I and II schools.
- » We focus on:
 - Academic preparedness.
 - Sports participation.
 - High school courses.
 - Customer service.
- » If you want to compete at an NCAA Division I or II school, you must meet NCAA Eligibility Center:
 - Academic initial-eligibility requirements.
 - Amateurism requirements.






TWO ACCOUNT TYPES

Profile Page Account and Certification Account

» Register for either account at eligibilitycenter.org.





FREE PROFILE PAGE ACCOUNT



Students interested in a Division III school or currently are not sure in which division they want to compete.



No registration fee to create a Profile Page account.



Transition to a paid Certification account at any time your student opts to pursue a Division I or II path.



CERTIFICATION ACCOUNT



Students must be certified by NCAA Eligibility Center to compete at a Division I or II school.



Registration fee:

- » Domestic students: \$90.
- » International students \$150.




Before students take official visits or sign an NLI, they must have a complete (paid) Certification account.





WHAT IS A CORE COURSE?



- » NCAA core courses are:
 - On your school's list of NCAA-approved core courses.
 - Taught at or above the high school's regular academic level.
 - Taught by a qualified instructor.
 - Considered four-year college preparatory.




COVID-19 WAIVER EXTENSION

2022-23 or 2023-24 Enrollment



COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: EXTENDED



» Students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA school during 2022-23 or 2023-24 must meet specific criteria to be eligible.



COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: TEST SCORES




Test Score Task Force

- » Standardized test scores are excluded from NCAA initialeligibility criteria for students who initially enroll full time in an NCAA school during the 2022-23 or 2023-24 academic years.
 - Test Score Task Force recommendation for permanent removal will be voted on at Convention in January 2023.



COVID-19 AUTOMATIC WAIVER: DISTANCE OR E-LEARNING

» The Eligibility Center will not require a separate review of distance or e-learning programs used during the 2022-23 academic calendar in response to closures due to COVID-19.

NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER COVID-19 RESPONSE FAQ

Given the continuing impact of COVID-19 on the educational environment, the NCAA Eligibility Center has partnered with the NCAA membership to identify the following changes to the initial-eligibility certification process for students who initially enroll full time in a collegiate institution during the 2022-23 or 2023-24 academic year. The Eligibility Center will continue to monitor the environment and make necessary adjustments to prioritize health, safety and fairness for all prospective student-athletes.

COVID-19 Automatic Waiver Criteria for 2022-23 or 2023-24 Enrollment

- Q1: Given the unique circumstances due to COVID-19, will there be any flexibility in the initial-eligibility standard for students who initially enroll full time in a collegiate institution during the 2022-23 or 2023-24 academic year?
- A1: Yes. Students who initially enroll full time during 2022-23 or 2023-24 will receive an automatic initial-eligibility waiver in the academic certification process that provides the highest level of relief for which they are eligible, per the criteria below:

Note: Students certified based solely on international credentials are exempt from core-course progression.



Complete 16 core-course units in the required subject areas.




Earn a core-course GPA ≥ 2.3 in the required subject areas.



Submit proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.




DIVISION I: QUALIFIER





DIVISION I: CORE-COURSE TIME LIMITATION



- » When you enter ninth grade, you have four years (eight semesters) to complete your core-course requirement.
- » You must graduate on time, with your class.

The Eligibility Center will use the best combination of courses to meet the 10/7 requirement. Courses can be repeated or replaced so long as they are not needed to meet the 10/7 requirement.

- » Three possible academic certification outcomes for student-athletes:
 - o Early Academic Qualifier.
 - o Qualifier.
 - o Partial Qualifier.

Complete 16 core-course units in the required subject areas.




Earn a core-course GPA ≥ 2.2 in the required subject areas.

DIVISION III

- » Each Division III school determines its own eligibility for:
 - o Admission.
 - Financial aid.
 - Practice and competition.
- » The NCAA Eligibility Center does not perform certifications for Division III student-athletes.
- » Division III college-bound student-athletes may register for a free Profile Page, but it is not required.







SPORTS PARTICIPATION

When students register for a Certification account, they must:

- » Select the sport(s) they would like to play in college.
- » Update their information frequently if they play for multiple teams or attend events outside the traditional high school setting.
- » Request final amateurism certification before they enroll full time at a Division I or II school.

Note: Over 94% of students do not require additional questions from the EC after they request final amateurism.

THE COLLEGE ATHLETE MODEL

The NCAA is committed to allow name, image and likeness opportunities for student-athletes consistent with the college athlete model.

The college athlete model is not the professional model, meaning students will compete against other students, not professionals or employees.

The NCAA is best positioned to provide a uniform and fair name, image and likeness approach for all student-athletes on a national scale.

NCAA student-athletes now have opportunity to benefit from their name, image and likeness.

- » All three divisions have adopted a uniform, interim policy suspending NIL rules for all incoming and current student-athletes in all sports.

HOW YOU CAN HELP...

If students want to play sports in college, they must:

- » Share their NCAA ID with Division I and II schools recruiting them.
- » Apply to schools of their choosing to be accepted.
- » Request final amateurism certification before enrolling full time in college.
 - Starting April 1 (fall).
 - Starting Oct. 1 (winter/spring).
- » Ask their counselor to submit their final transcript with proof of graduation.
- » Understand considerations for documented education impacting disabilities.
