  - 5. All students graduate from high school


Districts create a plan and align curriculum and instruction to ensure career and college readiness. The goal areas are measured by the new North Star Accountability system.

   It is about collaboration, support and partnership, NOT punishment.

# **Indicators**



#### **Academic Achievement**

The number of students at the "Meets Standards" or "Exceeds Standards" achievement levels divided by all students in tested grades. Calculated separately for **math** and **reading**.



#### **Progress Toward English Language Proficiency**

The average progress English learners made toward individual growth targets on the ACCESS for ELLs test.



#### **Academic Progress**

A score based on students' achievement levels from one year to the next. Calculated separately for **math** and **reading**.



#### **Graduation Rates**

The percentage of students who graduated in four years and seven years.



#### Consistent Attendance

The percentage of students attending more than 90 percent of the days they are enrolled.

### 2022 HLWW North Star Results (District Results)

First year of data in 2 years due to the pandemic. "When identifying schools for support before the 22-23 school year, only data from 19 and 22 is used. 19 data will receive double the weight of data from 22. These are temporary changes due to the Covid-19 pandemic on test administration and test data usability."

### How do we meet the needs of our students?

- Digging into our formative and summative data to find the gaps in standards instruction.
  - Weekly meetings with grade level and intervention teachers to alter programming for students during block time
- Participating in COMPASS MTSS professional development to help direct services where they are most needed.
- Elementary: Identifying our students who are not reading at grade level and planning for their programming.
  - Title Services
  - ADSIS services
  - Using PRESS interventions for our K-6 students
- Continued use of STAR testing data to guide progress monitoring. Continued use of a measure of student progress towards the MN State Standards throughout the year.
- Continued use of PLC (Professional Learning Communities) time to review and utilize data from various formative and summative assessments.
- High School:
  - Study Table program
  - flexible scheduling during Laker Time to meet with teachers
- Middle School:
  - WIN time: 4 days/week during advisory for reteaching current curriculum
  - % are now teamed. This allows for intervention time to work on targeted areas for a 2 week period to close gaps
  - o Extended school day for students who need extra support
- Continue to provide quality professional development to staff to meet their needs for instruction and mental health needs in our students
  - Character Strong
  - PASS Survey Results
- Provide more/ clear information to parents as to how they can support their student at home.
- Clearer understanding of the importance of the STAR and MCA tests to help teachers make educational decisions.
