

### **District Assessment Plan - - measures achievement, informs curriculum decisions**

The Assessment Plan is designed to ensure accountability. It uses multiple measurements to assess student achievement. The plan is reviewed annually.

### **Objectives for Testing Program:**

- Assess student achievement on state standards and district outcomes
- Evaluate curriculum and instruction

### **Use of Test Results**

- Develop focused instruction and interventions for increased student achievement
- Examine data for instructional planning
- Design and implement staff development programs to meet specific academic areas


### What are the tests and what do they measure?


- The STAR assessment is a computer-based test that measures individual student performance and progress in English, language arts, math and science in relation to the MN State Academic Standards. These results and accompanying instructional tools are available during the school year to help staff make instructional decisions and set individual student goals. The STAR assessment is given in grades K-10.
- The Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCA) evaluates student achievement on the high state standards in math, reading, and science.
- ACCESS is a reading, writing, listening and speaking assessment for English Learners (EL)
- ASVAB Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures
  developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. It is administered
  annually to more than one million military applicants, high school, and post-secondary students.
- PSAT/NMSQT- Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship measures student's verbal and mathematical aptitude, to compete for national scholarships. Minnesota colleges will accept this test as the college admissions test
- ACT American College Test (ACT) is recommended for students who are thinking of attending a four-year university or college. All registrations are handled through the high school counselor's office. ALL Grade 11 students will be given the opportunity to take the ACT as part of the assessments given by the MN Department of Education. It is required by the Department of Education to offer the ACT to students during the school day. It is NOT required that the student take the ACT on this day.
- Additional teacher-created classroom assessments also serve an important function in measuring progress and achievement but are not included in this chart.




### **Renaissance Learning- STAR Test**

STAR assessments are computer adaptive tests designed to give an accurate, reliable and valid data quickly in order for teachers to make good decisions about their instruction and to provide a quality intervention. STAR Reading and Math tests are given 3 times a year in the Fall, Winter and Spring. Teachers may choose to give the STAR tests in between the required benchmark times as well to help diagnose and problem solve students who may need more support.











### Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCA)

Student proficiency is measured by the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCA) tests, Minnesota's state requirement for testing.

In the Spring, the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments are given to all students in grades three – eighth, tenth and eleventh. The MCAs are designed to measure the effectiveness of existing school programs. These tests chart the progress of schools and districts over time, generate information for school improvements and school accountability and allow for comparison of schools and districts in Minnesota. Schools use these results to make curricular and instructional decisions for all students.







### **Achievement Gap Targets - Math**








The Science Test measures how Minnesota students are doing on academic standards science. The assessments are direct measures of student performance. Overall, the HLWW Public School District exceeded the Minnesota state average.





The American College Test is taken voluntarily by students in their junior or senior years as an entrance exam for postsecondary schools. HLWW Public Schools average results are listed below in comparison to the state norms. The highest possible score on the ACT Test is 36. HLWW scored a composite average 19.5 in the March 2022 administration.

# North Star Accountability Results

Beginning in the 2017-2018, the state of MN under the regulations of the Every Child Succeeds Act enacted the North Star Accountability system. This is to replace No Child Left Behind legislation of the past. Statewide goals have been established in order to create a clear focus for school districts. The North Star Accountability system is designed to help support schools where they may need and to recognize those schools that are meeting those goals. The results for HLWW are as follows:
