News-2-You



A New Era of "Spelling" Mr. Goudy, Winsted Elementary

The 2023-24 school year is underway and is off to a tremendous start here in 4th grade.

We have been multiplying, dividing, decoding, learning about electricity, reading numerous stories, and spending some time developing our classroom community. One thing you'll notice I didn't mention is spelling. Often known as a controversial topic due to its heavy memorization tactics, we are looking at approaching it in a different way.

Like any sturdy building, it needs to be built with a firm foundation. Spelling is the same way. Although some spelling comes down to visual memorization and letter sequencing, having solid phonemic awareness is another area that can help spellers at all levels. Taking verbal sounds we hear and applying them to paper is an example. This is where UFLI and VOCAB SURGE come in.

The University of Florida Literary Institute (UFLI) was established with two main goals in mind: - Support teachers in their development of knowledge and skills necessary to teach reading effectively - Support developing readers, especially those who struggle with early literacy.

Vocabulary Surge was created to: - Address limited vocabulary and phonemic awareness

These programs will help build a better foundation of not only the meaning of words, but certain patterns that the English language uses to spell them. Instead of memorizing words and repeating them at the end of the week, our intention is to focus on mini lessons that incorporate recognizable patterns along with committing more time for our students to read. With the effort from the students, staff, and support from home, we believe that our students will become better readers, and in turn much better spellers.
