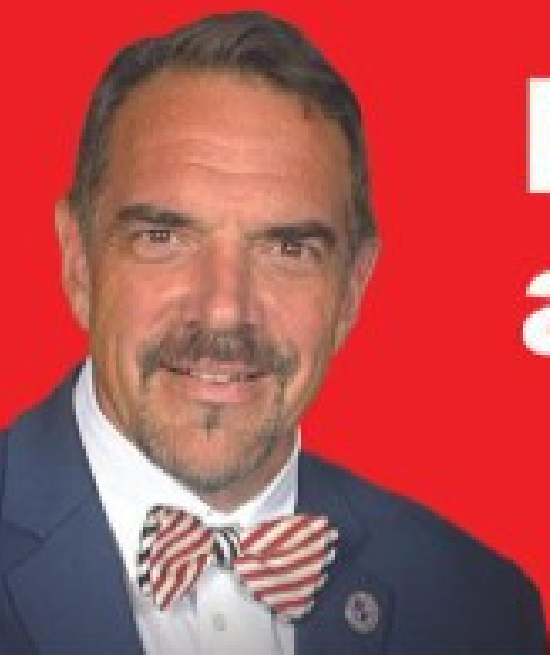

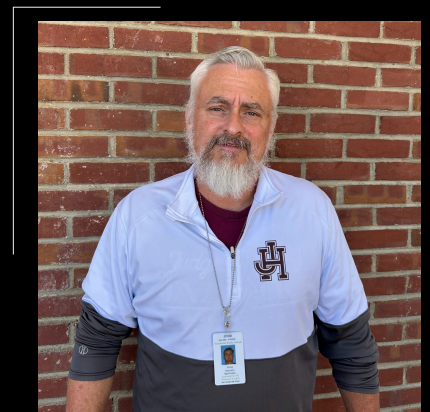

Kelly Huynh Co-Head Sideline and Competition Cheer Coach

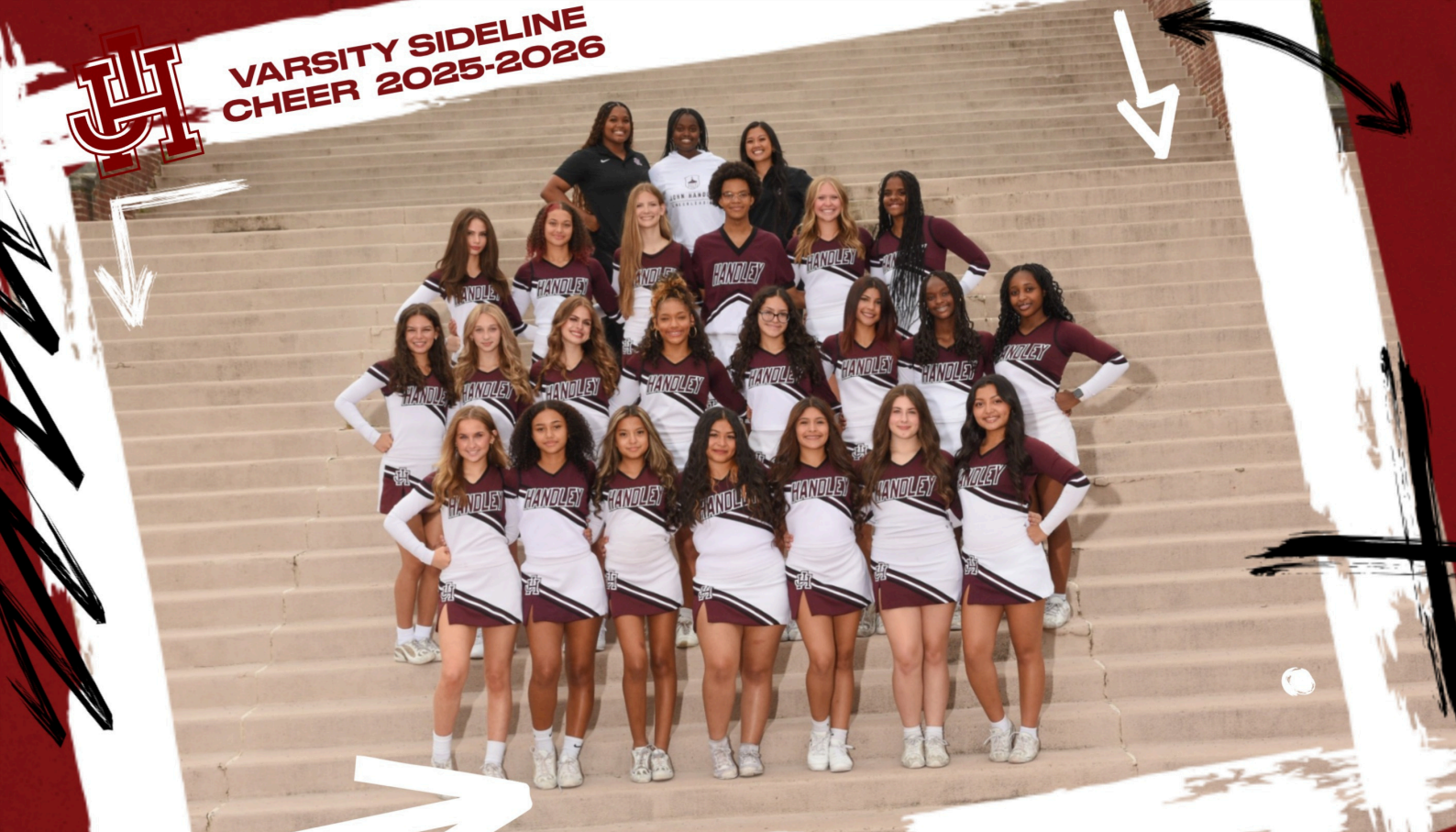

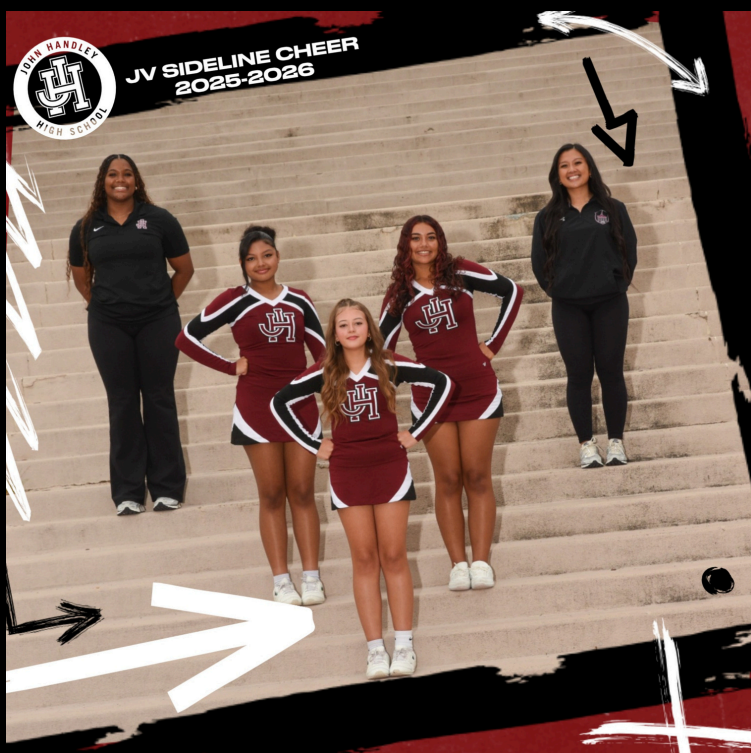

Mark Stickley – Head Cross Country Coach

A former Strasburg Ram, Coach Stickley went on to become a Hokie and earn a Bachelor of Science Degree in Agricultural Engineering from Virginia Tech in 1985. He ran track and cross country for the Hokies, earning All-American honors in track. He held the school record for the Hokies in the 10,000-meter run for 39 years and was inducted into the Virginia Tech Hall of Fame in 2005 for both cross country and track. Coach Stickley has previously qualified for the United States Olympic Trials in the marathon and the 10,000 meters. He also qualified for five United States teams, including the World Cross Country Championships four times. This is his 23rd year coaching boys cross country at Handley and 6th season as the girl's coach. Coach Stickley owns and operates Runners Retreat in Winchester. He and his wife, Beth, live in Winchester and are the proud parents of three Handley graduates, Ryan ('22), Ashanti ('23), and Garrett ('24).

Tori Whitty – Assistant Cross Country Coach

Coach Whitty is a graduate of Wilmington Area High School where she ran cross country and track. She earned a Bachelor's degree from Waynesburg University and then went on to Slippery Rock University to earn her Master's Degree. Coach Whitty is a science teacher at John Handley High School. Before this, she taught and coached cross country and track at Hedgesville High School in West Virginia for four years. This is her third year coaching at JHHS. Coach Whitty is also an Outdoor Track and Field Coach for the Judges.

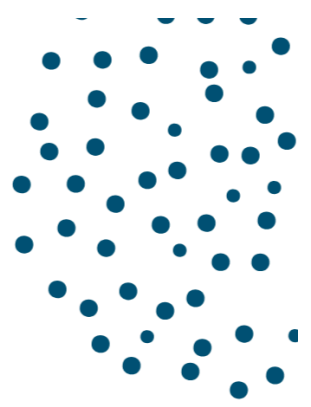

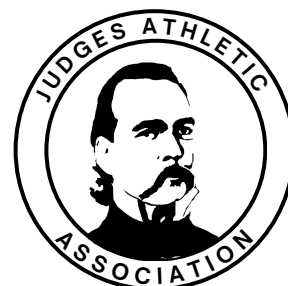

Giving Back

Since the first scholarship in 1959, the Judges Athletic Association has awarded more than 2 million dollars in scholarships to deserving student-athletes. The JAA also provides annual gifts to the athletic department of \$15,000 or more for uniforms and equipment. Major gifts to the athletic department include \$50,000 to help with the current Larry Nelson Weight Room and \$75,000 for the new track resurfacing in the Handley Bowl.

Annually at the JAA Awards Banquet, they honor more than 40 athletes and their coaches who have nominated them for their excellence in their sport. Scholarships are given to deserving seniors based on need, participation, and academics. Each senior athlete is given a commemorative gavel as a thank-you for participating at Handley. In addition to these awards and scholarships, there are 5 major awards given to student-athletes, recognizing them for academics, athletics, leadership, and perseverance. The JAA also yearly recognizes two people from the community for their service, to the JAA, and the athletic department.

Each year the JAA inducts a class into the Hunter Maddex Hall of Fame, honoring athletes, coaches, and contributors. In 2010, the JAA Hunter Maddex Hall of Fame started the Edwin Barksdale wing to honor the outstanding athletes for Frederick Douglas School who would have otherwise attended Handley had it not been for segregation.

Winnie Legge Award – JAA Award for Best All-Around Athlete



Winnie Legge coached athletics at Handley in 1927. Before his coaching career, he had coached at Shepherd College and Virginia Tech. Mr. Legge attended Virginia Tech from 1914 to 1918 as a four-year football, basketball, baseball, and track letterman. During his four years at Virginia Tech, Mr. Legge earned 16 athletic letters and came to be regarded as one of the greatest athletes in the history of that university. The J.A.A. Winnie Legge Award is given annually to the Senior Student-Athletes at Handley, who display excellence in all-around athletic ability.

Otis “Snag” Sargent Award– for Excellence in Athletics & Academics



Otis “Snag” Sargent played football, basketball, and baseball at Handley High School, where he received his long-standing nickname, “Snag,” for his outstanding ability to catch football passes. After he graduated from Handley, Mr. Sargent returned to coach football, basketball, and track at his alma mater. His 1945 football team is one of only four undefeated, untied teams in Handley history. Snag Sargent later owned Snag’s Sport Shop in downtown Winchester. As a businessman, he was active in civic affairs and community service. Snag Sargent, a Winchester legend, succeeded in many endeavors and enjoyed the respect of his peers. The Otis “Snag” Sargent Award is given annually to the Senior Student-Athletes who display excellence in athletics and academics.

Ron Rice Award – JAA Award for Excellence in Athletics and Leadership



In 1966, Ron Rice came to Handley High School to teach math and to become the school’s head football coach. He took a football program that had posted a 2-7-1 record the previous year and led the team to a 7-2-1 record his first year due to charismatic leadership and hard work. Two years later, he coached one of only four Handley football teams that have enjoyed undefeated, untied seasons. Mr. Rice was an inspiring leader of young people; he could change the negative to the positive. His outstanding leadership guided one of the great eras in Handley’s athletics history. The Ron Rice Award is given annually to the Senior Student-Athletes at Handley who display excellence in athletics and demonstrate, both on and off the field, school spirit and leadership qualities.

Jimmy Omps Award- JAA Award for Perseverance



In 2005, the JAA recognized the contributions of long-time Handley athletic director James “Jimmy” Omps by establishing an award in his honor. Omps himself was the initial recipient of this award. Jimmy Omps, or “J.O.” as he is affectionately called, graduated from Handley in 1953 and returned to Handley in 1959 as a math teacher and assistant basketball coach. He later became head varsity basketball coach, athletic director, and director of student activities. His meticulous organizational skills and work ethic served Handley Athletics well for many years. J.O. is a member of the Hunter Maddex Hall of Fame, the Shepherd University Hall of Fame, and the Virginia High School League Hall of Fame. He has received numerous awards recognizing his talents and hard work in athletic administration, including national and state awards as High School Athletic Director of the Year. When asked to select the criteria for this award, J.O. requested that the JAA honor the student who displayed persistence, diligence, reliability, team spirit, and high character while not necessarily being the most outstanding athlete on their team.

H. Russell Potts, Jr. Award- JAA Award for Academic Excellence



In the term 'student-athlete,' the student comes first, and the athlete comes second. Striving to recognize student achievement in the academic realm, the JAA has recognized the senior student-athlete who has achieved the highest grade point average for many years. In 2003, the JAA decided to formalize this award by naming it in honor of H. Russell Potts, Jr., a long-time friend and supporter of the JAA. A graduate of Handley, "Russ" is personally responsible for securing funding for many of the scholarships the JAA awards. His great affection for Handley High School is well-known, as is his support for education in general, both in his personal life and in his former role as Chairman of the Virginia Senate Education and Health Committee. In recognition of Senator Potts' support for education and his tireless efforts on behalf of the JAA and Handley athletics, the JAA awards the H. Russell Potts, Jr. Scholar-Athlete Award to the senior student-athlete who has achieved the highest grade point average.

Thurman H. Potts Award- JAA Award for Community Service



The Thurman Potts Award for Community Service is given in honor of Thurman Potts. Thurman was a three-sport letterman at John Handley High School. Upon graduation, Thurman Potts joined the United States Army and served his country during World War II. During his service, Potts sacrificed his life, saving the lives of fellow service members who were in perilous danger. In his honor, The Judges Athletic Association honors a Handley Athlete who demonstrated personal sacrifice in the service of the school or community.

JAA AWARDS FOR COMMUNITY MEMBERS

Ancil Gray Award- for Outstanding Contribution to Handley Athletics

Ancil Gray was a woodworking teacher at Handley from the 1940s through the 1960s. He loved athletics and had been a state-champion high school miler in his home state of West Virginia. He coached the golf team at Handley and served as a starter for track meets. Moreover, he used his mechanical abilities and craftsmanship to assist the athletic department in many ways. He maintained athletic equipment and constructed one of Handley's first set of hurdles. He was always willing to lend his time and talents in a volunteer capacity to help improve the conditions of the Handley student-athletes. For this reason, each year, the JAA honors a community member for their outstanding contribution to the Handley athletic program by awarding the Ancil Gray Award.

Eddie Manuel Award- for Distinguished Service to the JAA

As a Handley student in the late 1940s, Eddie Manuel earned his JH letter as Coach Hunter Maddox's football team manager. As a Handley alumnus in 1957, Eddie Manuel was one of the founders of the Judges Athletic Association. He is still remembered as "Mr. JAA," Eddie's dream was to create an organization of supporters that could provide the students of Handley with opportunities to excel on the playing field and with scholarship funds to pursue higher education after their Handley years. Eddie Manuel's impact on Handley and its student-athletes for over fifty years has been immeasurable. Each year, the JAA recognizes the outstanding contributions of a member of the community to the JAA by awarding them the Eddie Manuel Distinguished Service Award.

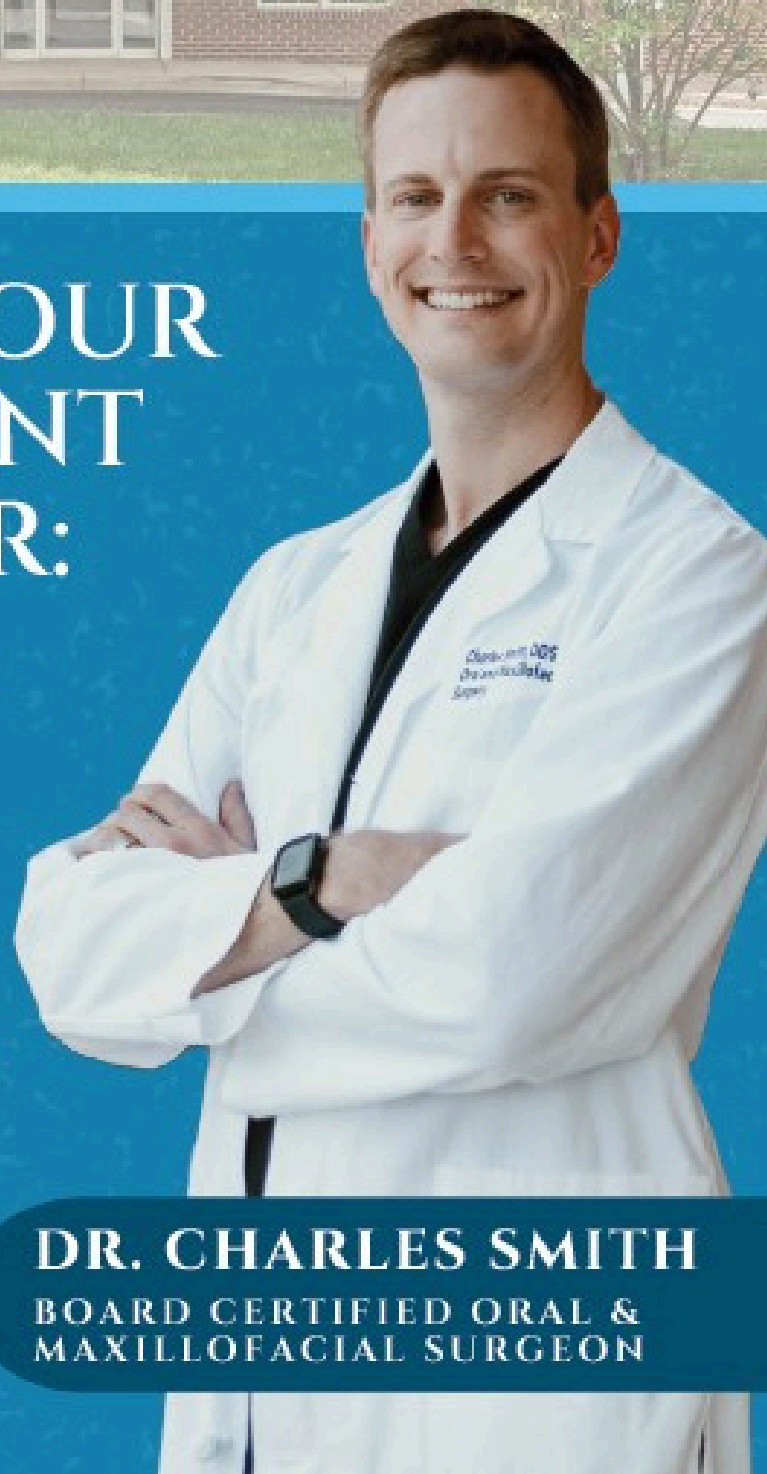

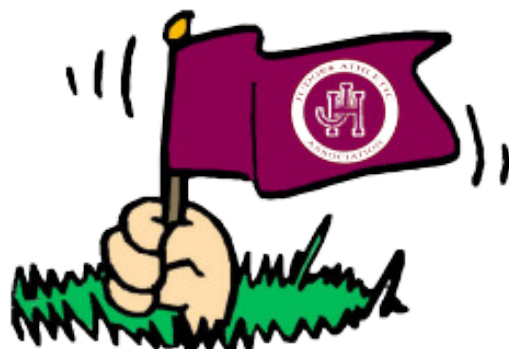
