

School Board Minutes  
Red Rock Central District No. 2884  
Monday, October 22, 2018

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Education, District No. 2884 was held in the Board Room in Lamberton on Monday, October 22, 2018. Members present were: Clarke, Hansen, Kelsey, Myers, Pankonin, Rogotzke and Stavnes. Others present: Superintendent Olson, Principal Goetstouwers, Kim Friesen, Melissa Bedner and Doreen Kronback.

Chairman Rogotzke called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Melissa Bedner was present to request a cooperative agreement with Windom for students involved in Hockey.

Upon motion of Clarke, seconded by Stavnes and unanimously carried to approve the amended Agenda, the September 19, 2018 minutes and Treasurer's report as presented.

Member Kelsey complimented the District on the receipt of the National Blue Ribbon Award and the award program held at the school.

Principal Goetstouwers presented the following 5-12 Leadership Report: RRC Secondary received the National Blue Ribbon Award, October 7, 2018 a student body and staff assembly was held to acknowledge the award, Congressmen Collin Peterson, Senator Bill Weber and Representative Rod Hamilton were in attendance; the Principal will officially receive the award in Washington D.C. on November 8, 2018, students were impressed that a flag is being flown over the Capital for RRC; Homecoming Week was September 24 -28, hosted Varsity Volleyball match with Wabasso in a booming atmosphere, due to success, looking to host another home afternoon match next Homecoming, already committed to reciprocating opportunity in Wabasso during their Homecoming; Football seeded 4<sup>th</sup> will host on Tuesday, October 23; Volleyball seeded 4<sup>th</sup> will host Friday, October 26; Cross Country boys took 2<sup>nd</sup> as team at conference (Dalton Piotter took 1<sup>st</sup> individually) and girls team took 3<sup>rd</sup> at conference, sections will be Thursday, October 25 in Luverne; FFA Greenhand and Leadership Training for officers was held September 26, Pumpkins for sale at rented 14 acres at Ethanol Plant were planted and sold by chapter, Fruit Sales have begun, Instead of corn drive this year the Chapter is giving back to the farmers and are grilling hot dogs for farmers going to Meadowland on October 23, Soils judging team placed 2<sup>nd</sup> and advance to State with Cade Bittner placing 3<sup>rd</sup> and Kennedy Vold placing 6<sup>th</sup>, Poultry Team placed 6<sup>th</sup> and will advance to State, Horse Judging Team placed 10<sup>th</sup> and will not advance to State; National Convention starts this Wednesday with 4 students attending; Environmental Science Fair for 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grades was on September 26; Career Expo for 10<sup>th</sup> graders was on 9/26, the group took first place in the trivia contest; 9 – 12 Concert was last Thursday, RRC Choir sang the National Anthem again at the St. Cloud University Hockey game on Friday, October 19; Tenth graders took Pre-ACT at Methodist Church last Wednesday; Upcoming events: Musical "Hello Dolly" with cast of 76 perform Friday, November 2 at 7:00p.m. and Saturday, November 3 at 2:00 p.m. and 7:00 pm, in the future may limit play cast to grades 9 -12, parents are preparing and serving meals for cast; Parent-Teacher Conferences to be held on Thursday, November 8, Lamberton Lions Club will sponsor a burger feed from the Roadhouse from 3:30 – 8:30 p.m. cost \$7.00 per meal, which includes burger, chips, beans and water; Veteran's Day service will be held in Auditorium on Monday, November 12 from 10:15 – 10:55 p.m.

Superintendent Olson presented the following Elementary report; Grandparents' Day was moved to October 26 due to a scheduling conflict; Looking at some K-4 and maybe up to grade 6 curriculum changes as a result of the discussion at the Staff meeting, staff has identified some parts that are missing in getting the goals accomplished.

Superintendent's Report: New "Chrome books" seem to be operating well. Appears that we are losing some of the Surfaces and need to explore the next step; How would the Board like the Administration to respond to the letter from Comfrey schools regarding Football, the Board suggested that an invite be sent offering tuition for their students to attend RRC; Will meet with WWG to discuss Track Program and Mr. Bartholomaeus indicated that we may need to look at what we pay workers, currently we pay in the middle of what area schools do.

Upon motion of Kelsey, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried to approve all claims for payment in the amount of \$136,000.53. Receipts were \$870,646.94. Last check #25358.

Upon motion of Clarke, seconded by Myers and unanimously carried to approve the 2018 -2019 Seniority list.

Upon motion of Clarke, seconded by Pankonin to approve the addition of a Trap Shooting Team. Those voting in favor Rogotzke, Clarke, Pankonin, Stavnes, Hansen and Myers. Those against: Kelsey. Motion carried.

Upon motion of Kelsey, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried to pay the travel expenses for Mr. Goetstouwers to travel to Washington D.C. to accept the Blue Ribbon Award for RRC.

Other items discussed: Pairing agreement for Hockey; Discussion with WWG for all sports and Administration discussing with Comfrey a Tuition Agreement Program for grades 7 – 12.

Upon motion of Clarke, seconded by Stavnes the meeting was adjourned at 6:48 p.m.
