Absences: Fillmore Central requests that parents call the school NO LATER THAN 8:30 AM if your child is going to be absent. No phone call or note will result in an unexcused absence/tardy. If an absence is known in advance call the school office or send a note with your child stating the date and reason for the upcoming absence. We have a 24-hour voice messaging system that allows you to leave messages in case of an emergency absence.

Elementary Parents: Just a reminder for students getting dropped off in the morning. If parents are walking their child to the building-please park in the lot. The drive through is for busses, emergency lane and those parents just dropping off and not getting out of the vehicle. Pull up beyond the crosswalk to drop off to avoid congestion. Remind your child to use crosswalks and look for incoming traffic. Thank you for your attention to this and for ensuring our students safety!

School year 2025-26, we are joining Minnesota's Free School Meals Program. All students can receive one breakfast and one lunch free of charge each day at school. Although no application is required to receive this free meal benefit, filling out the Application for Educational Benefits is still important! Your application will help the school qualify for education funds, discounts, and other meal programs. Applications are available for pick up at the school office or on the website.

Your student must take the required components of the meal for it to be free of charge. Student lunch accounts will be charged if they do not take a full meal and for any extra items they take (extra milk or ala carte). Please be aware of these additional charges and that your student may still need money on their lunch account. Balances are always available to you through the JMC Parent Access on the website. Payments can be made with a debit/credit card via the school website or by check sent to the school office. In addition, if you set up automatic payments in prior years, you may want to review the amount for the upcoming school year. Please be aware, however, that debit/ credit card payments are not applied to lunch accounts immediately. Please allow 24 hours. Weekly reminders of negative balances are sent home with elementary school students in their Friday Folders. When high school lunch accounts reach a negative balance, weekly e-mails are sent out to parents.

Elementary School Milk Prices:

This year's milk prices will be as follows:

Kindergarten Milk Break:

\$20.00 per semester/\$40.00 per

Grades 1-6 Milk Break:

\$43.75 per semester/\$87.50 per year

These milk prices must be paid by any student who participates in the Milk Break Program, regardless of whether they qualify for free or reduced meals.

This fee is not subject to pro-rating due to absences, snow days, vacations, etc. It is a flat fee with no exceptions or variations.

DISTRICT CENSUS

Healthy Snack Program: This program will again be offered to K-6 students and will information regarding available student begin Monday, September 15, 2025. A healthy snack is provided at milk break time to students who participate. Prices will be as follows: \$40.00/semester or \$80.00/year. This fee is not subject to pro-rating due to absences, snow days, vacations, etc. It is a flat fee with no exceptions or variations.

Student Insurance: A brochure with insurance will be distributed via email with the Eligibility Meeting info and also on the first day of school. The school district neither encourages nor discourages parents from purchasing this coverage but simply takes this means of making the policy available to those who may be interested.

The school does not have a policy which will protect students while on the school premises or while being transported other than liability coverage which applies in those instances where negligence is established.

Elementary Back-To-School Conferences

Fillmore Central Elementary will again begin the school year with parent-student-teacher conferences the first two days of the school year. Each conference will be scheduled for 30 minutes. Conference times will be available September 2nd from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm and on September 3rd from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm.

During these conferences parents will have an opportunity to meet and discuss expectations and/or concerns privately, teachers will have an opportunity to evaluate the reading level of each child and begin the year with individualized instruction, students will be able to set up their desk and put supplies away, school forms can be completed, school pictures for PreK-grade 6, and vision and hearing checks will be conducted for K-grade 5.

Staff will also be available to guide families through the conference process.

Parents will use the JMC online scheduling program to schedule their 30 minute conference time. Look for an email for instructions to log into the JMC parent portal to schedule your conference with your child(ren)'s teacher.

Please call the elementary office if you need assistance with this process or if you do not have internet access.

School Supplies

Fillmore Central parents and students in grades 7-12 are invited to pick up FREE school supplies. Supplies may be picked up during the high school open house on August 27th.

At the elementary, each student will have a \$25.00 supply fee. Additional supplies may be needed by grade level.

Athletics Information, Chris Mensink, Activities Director

Welcome to the 2025-26 school year. We look forward to a great year filled with many activities for our students to participate and excel in. A few reminders as our school year is approaching quickly.

Forms/Fees: All students must have on file yearly: Insurance waiver, Health Questionnaire, Eligibility Forms, participation fees and Free & Reduced Lunch application. (Families that qualify for free or reduced meals for the current school year also qualify for free or reduced (1/2 price) extra-curricular activities. A current application or direct certification from MDE must be on file. All students must also have a valid sports physical on file every 3 years. Typically incoming 7th graders and 10th graders will be in need of an updated physical.

All forms must be completed and turned in before the first day of practice. Forms are available online on the school website under the Activities Tab, Extra Curricular Forms & Applications.

A late bus will be provided beginning September 2nd (first day of school) which will run between Harmony and Preston only. There will also be a bus offered to Cross Country beginning on September 2nd after school and back to Harmony and Preston.

Operating Referendum:

Fillmore Central School District will be holding a special election this fall asking the community to approve an operating referendum to generate additional funds for the general operation of the district. Vote beginning September 19th at the Fillmore Central District Office located at the elementary building in Preston. Early Childhood Screening is a free, comprehensive development screening for any child 3 1/2 to 5 years of age. The friendly staff at screening will check your child's:



Free Admission Tickets for Senior Citizens: Fillmore Central Schools will issue free lifetime passes for senior citizens age 65 or older who are residents of Independent School District #2198. These passes are good for all home athletic events with the exception of tournament events. If you would like one of these passes, please contact either the Preston or Harmony offices during regular office hours.

Sporting Events Admission Tickets: Cost of admission to all home sporting events is \$7 per adult and \$5 per student. Sports passes will be available again this vear at the cost of \$65 for adults, \$40 for K-12 students/senior citizens 60+, and \$170 for family passes. These passes are good for all home sporting events except tournament events. Passes may be purchased online or at either the Preston or Harmony office during regular office

hours.

Emergency School Closings: In the event of the need to cancel, delay, or dismiss school days or events, the following media will be contacted: KTTC-TV. In addition, parents will be notified via JMC through an automated phone system.

Immunizations: Minnesota youth are required to have immunizations at specific ages. A listing of the required immunizations can be found at https:// www.health.state.mn.us/people/immunize/ basics/readykidswhento.pdf Families must show their children have had these immunizations or file an exemption. If your family is uninsured, underinsured, or enrolled in a Minnesota Health Care Program, contact Fillmore County Public Health at 507-765-3898 to make an appointment to receive immunizations at a reduced rate.

Public Access to School Buildings & Grounds: All visitors must check in at the main office in each building for permission to access school buildings or school grounds during the school day. As additional security measures, all building doors will be locked during the school day. Doorbells are located at the elementary east main entrance, and supply lists, annual notifications on indoor the east and west main entrances at the high school. In addition, district office visitors may enter via the canopied entrance on the east side of the K-6 building.

Notification on Student Records:

Fillmore Central Schools collects and maintains records on each student in order to facilitate instruction, guidance, and educational progress of the student. Parents of students under 18 years of age and students over 18 may exercise the opportunity to review educational records of the student, to obtain copies, and to write a response to materials in the record, to challenge the content of the record on grounds of inappropriateness, inaccuracy, or an invasion of privacy, and to have records explained.
