

Kacey Bellamy

Leading with Purpose: Building Culture, Character, and Champions

Kacey Bellamy represented the United States at three Olympic Winter Games, earning one gold medal in 2018 and two silver medals (2010 and 2014). Throughout her career, she also competed in nine World Championships, capturing eight gold medals, and made 13 appearances in the Four Nations Cup. Her professional success is equally impressive, having won the Clarkson Cup with the Boston Blades in 2013 and the Isobel Cup with the Boston Pride during the inaugural season of the National Women's Hockey League (NWHL) in 2016. She later claimed another Clarkson Cup with the Calgary Inferno in the 2018-2019 season.

Bellamy played college hockey at the University of New Hampshire, where she helped her team win four consecutive Hockey East championships and made it to the NCAA frozen four twice. In 2009, she was named both Hockey East and UNH's Most Valuable Player and earned All-American honors. She capped off her collegiate career by being named UNH's Student-Athlete of the Year during her senior season. Before

that, she attended Berkshire School from 2001 to 2005, where she further developed her skills.

Bellamy spent two years coaching Division 1 hockey at Merrimack College while still playing professionally. In 2017, she played a key role in advocating for equality by participating in the boycott of the World Championships, a movement that led to improved conditions for female hockey players. Bellamy also became a member of the Professional Women's Hockey Players Association (PWHPA) from 2019 to 2021, continuing her fight for gender equality in the sport.

Outside hockey, Bellamy is a motivational speaker, mentor, and published author. Her book of poetry, *Unbroken Heart of Gold*, which showcases her creativity and passion beyond the rink, was released in 2018. She is set to release a mindfulness journal in November, and she is currently the Director of Athletic Development at Maples Crossing, an athletic facility in Amesbury, Massachusetts.

Distinguished Service Award

MARK CONROY

Indian Mountain School Williston Northampton School

Mark Conroy is a seasoned educator and accomplished athletic administrator with a distinguished 39-year career in boarding school education. He has held leadership positions at Indian Mountain School, Webb Schools, and Williston Northampton School.

Throughout his career, Conroy has demonstrated a deep commitment to fostering a strong athletic culture and developing well-rounded student-athletes. His tenure as head football coach at Williston from 2000 to 2016 was particularly successful, resulting in a remarkable 84-47 record and three New England Prep Bowl appearances. His contributions to the sport were recognized in 2019 with his induction into the NEPSAC football coaches hall of fame.

Beyond his coaching accomplishments, Conroy played a pivotal role in shaping the landscape of NEPSAC athletics.

He served as president of NEPSAC and was instrumental in implementing critical changes, including the classification model for basketball and hockey. He also spearheaded the development of the individual All-NEPSAC recognition program and contributed to the NEPSAC policies handbook. His leadership and expertise have left a lasting impact on the organization.

Conroy's dedication to athletics is matched only by his commitment to family. He and his wife, Monique, have been married for 39 years. Together, they raised two successful children who attended Williston and Middlebury College: Dr. Kristina Conroy '10 (clinical psychologist) and Kevin Conroy '12 (physics teacher at Taft).



Martin William Souders Memorial Award

ALYSSA NAEHER

Christian Heritage School '06

Alyssa Naeher is a professional soccer player and three-time Olympian, representing the United States in 2016, 2020 and 2024.

Naeher was a standout athlete in both basketball and soccer while at Christian Heritage School. She scored over 2000 points during her high school basketball career, but earned many recognitions in soccer. She was a three-time All-State and three-time FAA All-Conference selection, a Parade All-American, two-time NSCAA Youth All-American, and completed stints with the U.S. National Team at the Under-16 and Under-17 levels.

Naeher attended Penn State from 2006 to 2009, starting 74 games and earning First Team All-American (2007 and 2008) honors. She was named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year in 2007.

Naeher was drafted by Tony DiCicco in 2010 with the Boston Breakers, the 11th overall pick and first goalkeeper. She recorded her first shutout in August 2010, against the Atlanta Beat. She then played two seasons with Turbine Potsdam in the German Bundesliga, winning the 2011–2012 Frauen-Bundesliga title. She returned to the Breakers from 2013 to 2015 where she won NWSL Goalkeeper of the Year honors in 2014 before eventually joining the Chicago Red Stars in 2016.

On the international stage, Naeher won the 2008 U-20 FIFA Women's World Cup with the U.S. U-20 Women's National Team, earning the Golden Glove as the tournament's best goalkeeper.

She became the starting goalkeeper for the USA in 2017 with her leadership, confidence, consistent and sometimes spectacular play along with her excellent distribution skills. She now ranks third all-time in caps, wins and shutouts for a goalkeeper in U.S. history.

A three-time Olympian (2016, 2021, 2024), Naeher had a match for the ages against the Netherlands in the quarterfinal of the delayed Tokyo Olympics. She saved one penalty kick at the end of regulation and two in the shootout

while making several crucial saves during regulation and overtime to lead the USA to victory.

In 2019, she played every minute of all seven matches in France – the only U.S. player to do so – and gave up only three goals while earning four shutouts, becoming the fifth goalkeeper in history to earn a shutout in a Women's World Cup Final.

She came up huge when called upon during the World Cup, making several crucial saves in the knockout rounds, but the most memorable was her dramatic penalty kick stop in the Semifinal against England in the 84th minute to preserve the 2-1 victory.

Naeher was the starter in three of the USA's biggest games of the year in 2022, the title game of the 2022 Concacaf W Championship, in which she earned a shutout to qualify the USA for both the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup and 2024 Summer Olympics, the match against England at Wembley Stadium in front of more than 70,000 fans on Oct. 7, and the final game of the year, a 2-1 win over Germany on Nov. 13 in Harrison, New Jersey.

In 2024 Naeher led the USWNT to their first Olympic Gold Medal in 12 years playing every minute of the tournament and making crucial late game saves to preserve the team victory.

The Naeher family has been a part of the Christian Heritage School for four decades. Alyssa is the daughter of John and Donna Lynn Naeher. Her twin sister, Amanda, was a standout forward, leading Messiah College to two NCAA Division III National Championships and is one of the all-time leading scorers in NCAA Division III history, scoring well over 100 goals. Their younger sister, Abby, along with her husband Matt, welcomed their first child (Judah) on the night of the 2015 Women's World Cup Final.

Naeher enjoys doing the crossword puzzle every morning with her coffee as well as biking and being outside during the Chicago summers.



December 7, 1941, was a quiet Sunday. For New England independent schools the date fell in that relaxed time between athletic seasons with only examinations and Christmas holidays in the offing. The dramatic and shocking report of the bombing of Pearl Harbor, as carried on the radio, shattered the mood of the day and the season so drastically that it would be years before a comparable atmosphere would be recaptured. The news fell with special poignancy upon boys' schools. As faculty met their students for dinner that night or in their classes the next morning, they were profoundly aware that the news they had so recently heard had altered irrevocably the lives and futures of their students and of their younger colleagues.

School administrations turned at once to the great question as to how they best could prepare their students for the ordeals which these young men were likely to face and at the same time provide the conventional education which would permit them to take their place in society after the war. Confidence in the principles of a liberal education held. Except for a general policy of speeding up the educational process, few radical changes were made. However, since training programs in the armed services put great emphasis on physical fitness, directors of athletics and coaches had special responsibilities. They too, felt that team competition provided the best incentive to physical fitness; hence interscholastic competition should continue and indeed, be augmented if possible.

The dream of business as usual did not last long. In early April of 1942 Herbert G. Stokinger, Director of Athletics at Milton Academy, saw in a Boston newspaper a summary of governmental regulations applying to bus companies. To his consternation he learned that transportation companies could no longer charter buses for athletic trips without surrendering any right to replacement tires for buses so chartered. Since this regulation was a direct and obvious threat to all interscholastic athletic competition, Stoky acted promptly. He telephoned his opposite numbers, Martin W. Souders of Exeter, Eliot T. Putnam of Noble and Greenough, and J. Leo Foley of Roxbury Latin; they all agreed to meet at Stoky's house for a consultation. The four men at that meeting were of one mind: there was an urgent need for an immediate gathering of representatives of as many schools as possible to determine whether interscholastic athletics could indeed continue, how athletic programs could be modified under the circumstances, and how best to meet the inevitable shortages of equipment which loomed in the future. At the urging of this ad hoc committee, Stoky consulted the invaluable Porter

Sargent handbook and sent out an invitation to all schools within a reasonable distance of Boston to attend a meeting at the Harvard Club on Saturday, April 11, 1942.

Twenty-three schools sent representatives to the meeting, and five other schools expressed their interest by submitting written reports on how they proposed to adapt their programs to the stringent governmental regulations necessitated by the war effort. As the moving spirit behind the gathering, Herbert Stokinger presided with Eliot Putnam acting as secretary for the meeting. After a brief statement from a representative of each school present as to how it proposed to deal with interscholastic competition, Eliot Putnam reported these general conclusions:

- A. In any change of policy, first consideration should obviously be given to the spirit in which restrictions have been imposed.
- B. Attempt to go ahead with regular schedules, canceling such long trips as demand too great an expense (train, taxis, etc.) or which seem to call on an inadvisable and unwarranted demand on private cars.
- C. Bear in mind at all times the great value of interscholastic games, both from the competitive point of view, and as a pacesetter for school morale.
- D. Proceed cautiously as regards transportation by private cars, if not covered by proper insurance.
- E. Make every effort to strengthen the intramural program in the lower classes, canceling all interscholastic competition when there is any doubt as to its advisability.

Martin Souders then remarked on what he considered to be a longfelt need for a permanent organization among the independent schools, an organization which would meet periodically for discussion, legislation, and friendly interchange of ideas. He cited the advantages enjoyed by existing college and public school organizations. His suggestion was unanimously approved, and the following officers were elected:
