



Congratulations to the Monticello Middle School's Raised Bed Garden Project Recipient of the 2012 MASMS Sustainable \$1,000 Grant

MASMS is honored to present to the Monticello Schools the 2012 MASMS Sustainable \$1,000 Grant for their Raised Bed Garden Project.

Submission received by MASMS for their project:

Dear MASMS Executive Board:

We are very excited about a Farm to School program we started at the Monticello Middle School two years ago. With the growing obesity epidemic in our nation we thought it is important to teach kids how to eat healthier. We did this by building two indoor gardens in the Family and Consumer Sciences classroom. The eighth grade students planted lettuce, herbs, kale and other vegetables to be used in cooking labs. The students love the

project and are so excited about how wonderful the fresh produce tastes that they grew. Food that could not be grown in small indoor gardens was purchased at the local farmers' market in Monticello. The project became an interdisciplinary project the second year with all of the core classes



participating in some way making the learning come to life even more for our students. We even had a culminating Farm to School Day with the entire eighth grade listening to a panel of local farmers, a dietician, a bee keeper, and an apple grower. They also tasted samples of healthy food from the guests.

Our students have identified how they want to expand the Farm to School program. They have chosen to start outdoor raised bed gardens to grow even more produce to be used at the MMS. The seventh grade students would grow the plants as part of their Science curriculum and harvest them in the eighth grade for use in the FACS class. Our plan is to make the beds sustainable so that the garden will be here for years to come to help students learn the value of growing their own food for health and economics. Many life lessons can be taught with the gardening project.

Thank you for your time and consideration regarding our grant application. The students are engaged already and excited about the possibility of expanding our gardening project.

- Monticello Schools, Raised Bed Garden Project



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
Thank you again to those schools that took the time to submit a proposal. MASMS plans to give out this grant each year – so keep any projects you have in mind for next year!
