




Kelly Lam, class of 2004, participated in Tennis, Basketball and Track & Field. Kelly appeared in the State Tennis Tournament her senior year and was an All-Conference doubles player and conference Scholar Athlete. In Track & Field, Kelly was the Greater Metro Conference Champion in the Shot Put her junior and senior year and was also All-Conference in the Discus. She appeared in the State Track & Field Meet her junior and senior year in the Shot Put. In Basketball, under Coach Lindy Kemp, Kelly was a four-year varsity starter, scoring 1,130 points during her career and becoming the second Brookfield East female basketball player to score over 1000 points. Kelly was the GMC Player of the Year in both her sophomore and senior seasons and was a four-time All-Conference, All-Area and All-County selection. In addition, she earned First Team All-State and Honorable Mention McDonald's All-American after her senior year. Kelly continued her basketball career attending the University of Oklahoma before transferring to Marquette University. Kelly was the Head Girls Basketball Coach at Brookfield East from 2012-2014.






Guy Lam, class of 1968, participated in Basketball. As a basketball athlete, under the coaching of Lavern Luebstorf, Guy helped lead Brookfield East to their first Braveland Conference Championship Title and they defeated Milwaukee King in the 1968 WIAA Sectional Final to give the Spartans their first basketball State Tournament appearance. At the State Tournament, Brookfield East ended up with the Consolation Championship to cap a 24-2 season. Guy was the leading scorer and rebounder in the conference his senior year in addition to being named All-Conference, First Team WIAA All-Tournament, First Team All-Waukesha County, and First Team All-State. Guy continued his basketball career as a four-year scholarship athlete at Marquette University, playing under Legendary Coach Al McGuire, winning the 1970 NIT and playing on the winningest team in school history in 1971.






Greg Trasser, class of 1980, participated in Cross Country, Basketball, Track & Field and Baseball. Greg earned a total of 9 varsity letters during his high school career. He was All-Conference and Second Team All-Area his Senior year in Cross Country and was voted Captain and Co-MVP in both his Junior and Senior year. During Greg's basketball career, he started all games his Senior year and was voted Captain. Under Coach Lavern Luebstorf, the team made it to the State Tournament in 1979. Earning three letters in track, Greg was part of the winning 4x800 relay team at Conference relays his Senior year and was also voted Captain. He also played one year of Baseball in 1980. After graduation, Greg continued his Cross Country and Track career at UW-LaCrosse.





John Mirasola, class of 1988, participated in Football, Wrestling, and Track & Field. As a three-year letter winner under Coach Doug Henkel, John ran for 218 yards and scored 5 touchdowns against Hartland Arrowhead during his senior season. He was a Captain of the Football team his senior year and First Team All-Braveland Conference as he led the conference in rushing yards. John also earned two letters in wrestling. Earning four letters in Track, John was a State Qualifier in Discus and the 4x100 relay. John continued his football career at UW-LaCrosse and was awarded NAIA Division 2 Honorable Mention All-American in 1990. He was Team MVP in 1991 and is 5th in career tackles at UW-Lacrosse with 277. John also earned All-Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference First Team in 1990 and 1991.





Leslie Biegler (Ciaccio), class of 1985, participated in Swimming. Leslie was the captain of the Swim team her senior year. She earned All-American honors in numerous events and set the Wisconsin state record in the 100 Breaststroke. After her senior year of swimming she was named the Wisconsin High School Girls Swimmer of the Year. Leslie qualified for the Olympic Trials during her high school career and also swam on a YMCA National Championship team. After her high school career, Leslie swam on a University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee collegiate team that won the National Championship with Leslie herself winning All-American in the 100 Breaststroke, 200 Individual Medley, and the 400 Medley Relay. Leslie remains competitive in United States Masters Swimming and she serves as Secretary for the Illinois Masters Swimming Association.
