



Burt Wethe, Boy's Tennis Head Coach for 46 years and served for several years as the Girl's Tennis Head Coach. Both his boy's and girl's teams won many conference championships, earned several appearances at state, and produced several individual and doubles state titles. On the boys side, Coach Wethe's teams won three straight WIAA state titles from 1979-81, the last two led by state singles champion Mike Krebs. His teams also finished runner-up at state six times. State titles claimed under Wethe include his son Troy and Bob Pschirrer with a doubles title (1987) and singles titles by Krebs (1980, 1981) and Adam Go (1997). Coach Wethe's girls teams finished 2nd in the state in 1980 and 1991 and he coached Jane Rosecky and Jenny Ferguson to the 1994 state doubles title. Mr. Wethe also served for many years at Brookfield East as a Social Studies Teacher and Guidance Counselor.






Bill Meyer, class of 1967, participated in Track and Field, Football, and Wrestling. As a senior track and field athlete in 1967, he was co-captain, MVP, leading point scorer, and set and broke his school record in the shot put. Also in 1967, he set the conference record in the shot put, finished second in the discus, and won both events at the sectional meet earning a trip to the WIAA State Meet where he finished 5th in the discus. At the National Jaycee Track Championships at Drake University following his senior year, he finished 6th in the discus and 12th in the shot put. In Football, he was co-captain as a senior and earned All-Braveland Conference and All-Waukesha County Honorable Mention as a center. Bill continued his Track and Field career at UW-Milwaukee where he went on to earn All-American honors and was later inducted in the UWM Athletic Hall of Fame in 1988. At Brookfield East, in addition to athletics, he participated in Student Council, Photo Club, Yearbook, the school paper, and won several local photography awards. BIll went on to serve as a long-time photojournalist with the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel where he, among several other honors, was twice nominated for a Pulitzer Prize.





Amy Byrne (Feathers), class of 1986, participated in Basketball, Cross Country, Soccer, Track & Field, and Volleyball. In Cross Country, she was an All Conference and All County runner throughout her high school career and ran in the WIAA State Cross Country Meet as her team qualified for the meet multiple times, finishing as high as 4th place in the state. In Basketball, Amy was an All Conference and All County player multiple times and helped the Spartans to a Braveland Conference Championship in both her sophomore and junior years. In 1984 the Spartans were Sectional Champions and earned a trip to the WIAA State Tournament where they finished as State Runner-up in Division 1. In her senior season Amy was the 1986 Braveland Conference Player of the Year, she was voted fourth-team All State, and she participated in the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association All Star game where she earned game MVP honors. Amy continued her basketball career as a four-year scholarship athlete at Virginia Tech where she is a member of the 1000 point club, was voted Outstanding Female Athlete of the Year (1990), and holds the single-season scoring record with 20.0 points per game. Amy was inducted into the Virginia Tech Athletic Hall of Fame in 1991.





Sean Foley, class of 1999, participated in Swimming during all four years of his high school career. His teams won the WIAA State Championship in both 1996 and 1999. In addition, at the WIAA state meet in 1997, 1998, and 1999, he finished first in both the 100m and 200m freestyle, making him a six-time individual state champion. After his senior season he was named the 1999 Wisconsin State Swimmer of the Year. Sean continued his swimming career at the University of Texas where he was an All-American, a four-time Big 12 Conference Champion, and his teams won three consecutive NCAA National Championships (2000-02). During his collegiate season in 2000 he was a United States Olympic trials participant.



1968 Brookfield East High School Men's Basketball Team:

The 1968 Brookfield East High School Men's Basketball Team finished the year with a record of 24-2. The Spartans earned the school's first basketball conference championship by finishing first in the Braveland Conference with a 17-1 regular season record. Led by coaches LaVern Luebstorf and Norman Klein, the '68 team defeated Milwaukee King in the Sectional Final, earning a trip to the WIAA State Tournament in Madison. After an opening round loss, the Spartans defeated Eau Claire Memorial and South Milwaukee to earn the WIAA Consolation Championship.
