CONGRATULATIONS 3RD GRADERS



Read to the Final Four is a literacy challenge aimed at creating a lifelong love and interest in reading for students across Minnesota. The NCAA, Women's Final Four and the Minnesota Local Organizing Committee have teamed up to inspire and incentivize third graders across the state to develop their abilities and entice participation in this nine-week program. Schools and students can win fun prizes and compete for an overall grand prize of \$5,000 of books for the school library.

This year, students will be able to read both physical and online books and record their minutes in their own Read to the Final Four Reading Log. The challenge begins on January 10 and concludes on March 14 and no school will ever be eliminated. The top four schools will be awarded an all-expense-paid field trip to the 2022 Women's Final Four Tourney Town presented by Capital One to crown the winning school in a special award ceremony on April 1 at the Minneapolis Convention Center.

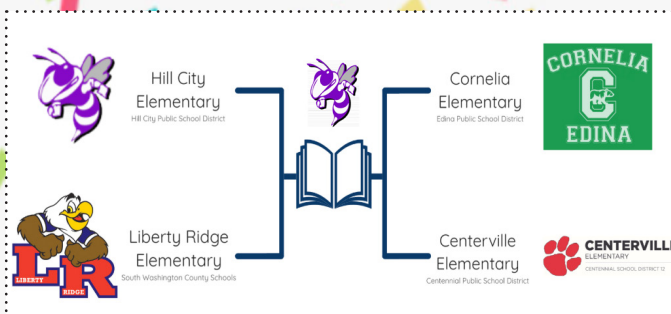

ASSET #16: High Expectations

What Are Assets?

Assets are 40 key building blocks to help kids succeed. "High expectations" is one of six boundaries and expectations assets.

Expecting the Best

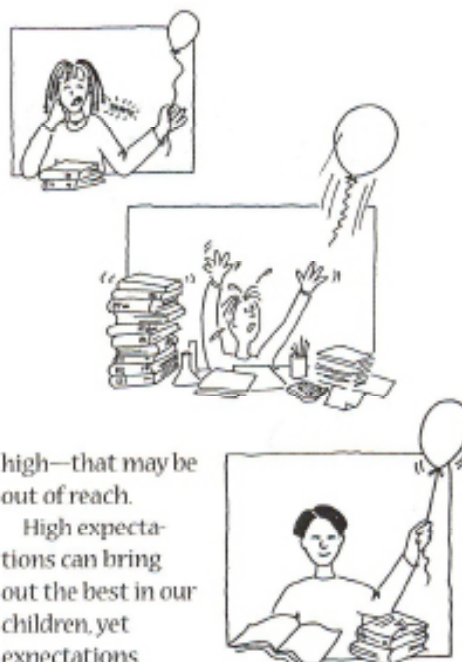
When you give a child a helium-filled balloon, it brings great joy. But if the balloon is

losing air and gradually deflates, the child becomes frustrated. If the balloon is difficult to hang on to and floats away, the child cries.

A balloon is like expectations. If they're too low or too high, they're not helpful. But if the expectations are high—yet still within reach—the child holds the taut string of the balloon with an arm extended up.

Expectations should make our children stretch but also still be able to see what they're stretching toward.

Expectations should differ based on each child's temperament, abilities, gifts, and talents. A natural-born athlete who is bored in physical education, goofs around most of the time, and still gets an "A," doesn't have high enough expectations set on her. The dyslexic child who struggles to keep up with the state standards of reading for his age has expectations placed upon him that are too



high—that may be out of reach.

High expectations can bring out the best in our children, yet expectations constantly need to be evaluated and revamped so that they encourage our children without discouraging them, and so that they challenge our children without frustrating them. What do you expect of your child?

Helpful Hints

Tips that make setting high expectations with your child easier:

- **Educate yourself on child development so you know what's realistic.**
- **Continue to look for creative and new ways to stimulate your child.**
- **Periodically check out your expectations with your child.**
- **Allow your child to make mistakes and learn from them.**

Three ways to set high but reasonable expectations with your child:

1. **Talk about inspirational stories of people who overcame the odds or did surprising things.**
2. **Encourage your child to tackle subjects and hobbies that are difficult. Work together.**
3. **Model how you're currently stretching yourself.**

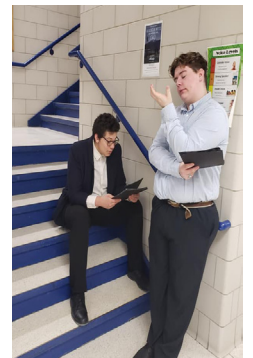

The Hill City Speech season went underway with 5 students completing the season! In competitive speech, there are 13 different categories students can choose from. Students can write their own speech, or use a script from a book, play, or other source. Some categories are dramatic, while others are fact-based. Last year was the team's first year and the students participated in virtual events due to the pandemic. This year Hill City students had their first experiences with in-person meets. The season started with three students in Discussion. Their topic was "The State of the US Democracy in 2022." Two more students were competing as a pair in Dramatic Duo. After learning more about speech, students switched to try different categories. The Hill City Speech Team concluded its 2nd year at the 7A Section Tournament at Duluth Marshall on April 8. Allison Kimball advanced from the subsection tournament in Onamia on April 2 in the category of Storytelling and placed 7th at the Section Tournament. The five team members competed in the categories of Discussion, Dramatic Duo, and Storytelling. Although the team was hit hard with illness this season, they worked hard to stay competitive. Speech is a Minnesota State High School League activity and is open to students in grades 7-12. Students can choose to compete in one of 13 different categories. Forbes magazine writer Robert Sher suggests that businesses should look to those who competed in speech and debate in high school as their future leaders. 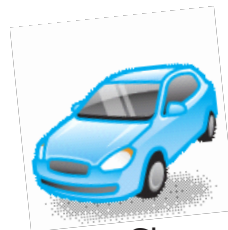




