City of Hill City Special Meeting Council Candidate Interviews March 11, 2019

A Special Meeting was held at the Fire Hall for the purpose of interviewing candidates for the vacant Council position. Mayor Dan Kingsley called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. members present: Mayor Dan Kingsley, Council members Terry Christensen, Nate Rollins and Wayne Lindquist.

Motion made by Rollins to approve the agenda as presented, second by Lindquist. MPU

Mayor Kingsley explained that all candidates would be asked the same interview questions and each interview would be limited to 15 minutes. After the interviews were completed the Council would then have an open discussion to select the candidate for the open Council position. If the candidate selected accepts the position, they would then be given the Oath of Office at the regular Council meeting on March 12, 2019.

Mayor Kingsley also explained that this was an open meeting, and everyone was welcome to stay for the individual interviews but for the privacy of each person being interviewed and in the fairness of the same questions being asked each candidate, it would be nice if the other candidates wait out in the other room.

The first candidate was Bryanna Blodgett. Her interview lasted from 6:05 p.m. to 6:12 p.m.

Motion made by Rollins to recess the meeting at 6:14 p.m. until the next candidate arrived, second by Christensen. MPU

Meeting was reconvened at 6:19 p.m.

The second candidate to interview was Lin Benson. Her interview was from 6:20 p.m. to 6:26 p.m. (The tape recorder's batteries went dead at 6:23 p.m. The batteries were replaced at 6:29).

The third candidate to be interviewed was Steve

Rich. His interview went from 6:30 p.m. to 6:37 p.m.

The fourth candidate was Arlen Jensen. His interview lasted from 6:39 p.m. to 6:45 p.m.

The meeting was again recessed at 6:51 p.m. until the fifth candidate arrived for his interview.

The meeting reconvened at 6:57 p.m.

The fifth candidate to be interviewed was Jeff Hanson. His interview was from 6:58 p.m. until 7:05 p.m.

It was explained by Mayor Kingsley that there was one other applicant for the vacant Council position, Dave Lange. He was unable to make the interview. The Council was informed by Mayor Kingsley, Dave had chosen to fulfill his duty to attend a County meeting at Long Lake Conservation Center. It was decided not to prolong the process of making a selection for the Council position due to the fact that Dave Lange was not being interviewed.

Mayor Kingsley asked each of the Council present to write down their first and second choice for the position and then they discussed the candidates.

Motion made by Christensen to offer the open Council position to Lin Benson, second by Lindquist. MPU

Clerk McManigle called Lin Benson and she accepted the appointment.

Motion made by Rollins to adjourn the meeting at 7:34 p.m., second by Christensen.

ASSET #15: Positive Peer Influence

Youth are more likely to grow up healthy when their best friends model responsible behavior.

60% of youth surveyed by Search Institute have this asset in their lives.

What Are Assets?

Assets are 40 key building blocks to help kids succeed. "Positive peer influence" is one of six boundaries and expectations assets.

Photos of Friends: Snapshots of Responsibility

The best way to encourage children to choose positive, healthy relationships is to model them ourselves. Take out an old yearbook or photo album. Look at pictures of the friends you had as a teenager.

Think about the friends who acted in ways you admired. Most people can remember at least one person who always sensed when things weren't going well and called, sent a note, or showed up to find out what was wrong. Often, these are the people who turned out to be lifelong friends.

How about people who weren't such true friends? Was there someone who spread rumors about you or talked behind your back? Did you ever have a friend who tried to get you to do things you didn't want to do? The pain of these kinds of experiences often teaches young people a lot about how they want to be treated by

Helpful Hints

Tips that encourage your child to choose responsible friendships:

- · Get to know your child's friends and their families. Point out what you like about
- Get to know the parents of your children's friends. Share your values and rules with them and ask them about theirs.
- · Don't jump to conclusions based on what friends look like.
- · Be honest with your child when you're concerned about a relationship.



good to you or feel angry at people who hurt you. You had to make your own choices about who your friends were. In the same way, we can't control who our children choose as friends. They are exploring their world, themselves, and the people around them. Sometimes they're attracted to people we don't approve of (and that, deep inside, they probably don't approve of either). Other times they say the 'good' kids are boring. However, if we model responsible relationships, talk to our children about how others act, and are involved in their lives, gradually they'll see that friends who act, talk, and think in positive ways will bring out the best in them.

Worth a Cheer

Te often think of "peer pressure" only as a negative influence, but we can also think of time spent with friends who model healthy behavior as peer pressure. Of youth surveyed by Search Institute, 60% say they experience positive peer pressure, reporting that their best friends do well in school, don't use alcohol or other drugs, and don't get in
