2. Approved the following:

3. Technology Coordinator Lisa Cannella talked about the State of School Pilot Program. Three tv screens have been set up in three classrooms that have the ability to use electronic devices to put the information on the tv monitor for the class to follow without the use the WIFI. Working to be on track to be a leader in technology in the school setting.
4. There was no report from the School Attorney.

6. Swarm Student Leadership: No Report.
7. Curriculum Committee: None.
8. School and Community Health Committee: Joell Miranda reported that they met and discussed the Health Fair results, which was a great turnout. 11. Community Education Report: Mark Meyer reported to discuss the 3D and Bullseye Tournament brought 1600 people into our school and how the community commented on the new building and how nice it was. Last year they had to take a detour to get through construction, but it sure was worth it. Firearms Safety Training is starting April 8, 2019 for anyone from the age of 11 and up. AARP April 18, 2019 from 5-9 pm, Hustle for Hunger 5K is May 4, 2019 and the Bike Rodeo is June 17, 2019. Still looking for Summer Baseball coaches, so please come and volunteer.
12. Early Childhood Report: Early Childhood Coordinator Kathy Carroll reported we have received both the Blandin Early Start Grant and the CEM Grant. Letters and registration will go out to our Preschool parents regarding school and ECFE participation for next year. We are also working on schedules for programming and staff for the 2019-2020 school year.
13. Building & Grounds Director Report: None
14. Superintendent/Principal's Report: Superintendent/Principal Pat Rendle reported that the Strategic Plan Meeting was very informative and had a good turnout. He's looking at rescheduling the April 9th meeting to a different day due to the City Council Meeting also being held that night. The MASA trip to the capital was very informative and a great experience. He would suggest if anyone can go and experience it, they should. Snow days are still being discussed in the government to narrow down how schools are going to manage them. We will have a different schedule for our students for the last week of school but this is still in progress.

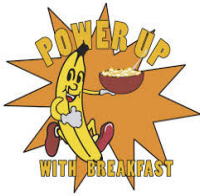

Encouraging teens to take charge of their health

Aitkin County Public Health's Child & Teen Checkups program is encouraging teens to take charge of their health and make an appointment or ask their parents to make an appointment for their yearly checkup. That's right! It is now recommended that children get yearly checkups, starting at age 3. It only makes sense: adults need yearly checkups, why shouldn't kids? After all, kids are growing and developing and don't always know if what they are experiencing is normal or not. A child who has never seen or heard correctly doesn't know the world looks or sounds any different. A teenager who is experiencing depression might not know that there is help for him. A girl who has questions about her menstruation or sexuality might not have any one else she is comfortable asking. Making sure teens get to the doctor every year is one way to help them stay healthy and happy. Additionally, health plans are required to cover preventative services. That means you should be able to get your child's exam with no cost to you. Talk to your insurance company if you are unsure of their policy.

Posters like this have been hung in all three school districts and about Aitkin County.
