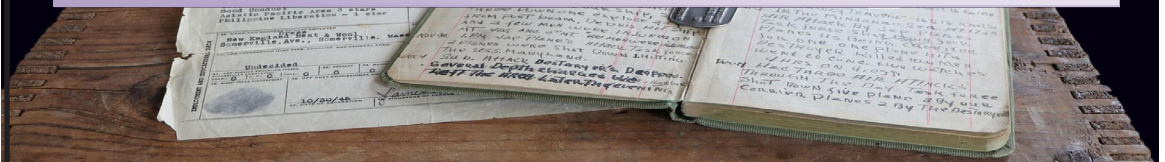

INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 HILL CITY, MINNESOTA

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of Independent School District No. 2, Hill City, Minnesota, was called to order by Chairman Sue Kaslow at 6:01 p.m. on Monday, August 26, 2019.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll Call showed the following members present: Sue Kaslow, Dorie Barnes, Joell Miranda, Bambi Lange, Mark Meyer, and Sarah Kingsley. Board Members absent: None. Also present was Superintendent Pat Rendle, Principal Adam Johnson, Business Manager Ellie Hill, Building & Grounds Director Eric Hill, Administrative Secretary/Payroll Clerk Lynn Major and other staff.

1. Approved the Agenda with as Presented.
2. Approved the following:
 - *Approved the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of July 30, 2019.
 - *July 2019 bills presented for payment;
 - *Current bills through 8/11/19;
 - *Investments and wire transfers;
 - *Reviewed the Activity Fund Statement;
 - *Reviewed Cash Receipts including donations.
3. Comments and request from visitor: Question from guest about bus routes in the Palisade area if there is a bus that will be going to that area. Superintendent Rendle confirmed that the bus will not be going to the Palisade area this year and NorTran will be contacting families about the bus routes.
4. There was no report from the School Attorney.
5. Transportation Report: No report.
6. Technology Report: Coordinated with the Building and Grounds report.
7. Swarm Student Leadership: None to report.
8. Curriculum Committee: None to report.
9. School and Community Health Committee: Joell Miranda went over the meeting minutes which are attached to the Board Agenda. School Open House is August 28th from 4:30-6:30, hoping to see Community Members. Aitkin County Advisory update 2020 Census was discussed and the accuracy of the information is important.

The next meeting will be September 16, 2019 at 8:00 a.m. in room 100A.

10. Safety/Transportation Committee: Building and Grounds Supervisor Eric Hill informed the Board about the Round Table meeting that he had attended in Aitkin. There was discussion of security in other schools and what they were doing. Labeling cameras to follow school maps so it is easier to locate areas and people. Looking at getting a key fob for law enforcement that can be used at all schools in the Aitkin area.
11. Negotiation Committee: No meetings at this time. Superintendent Rendle will meet with each union to set up times to meet.
12. Community Education Report: Minutes were attached to the Agenda. Tami Meyer reported Right Way Driving went well. Looking for an elementary volleyball coach. Pony League football Co-op with Remer. Community Ed. Advisory meeting on September 12, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. Open Gym will start September 15th for basketball and the 18th for Volleyball.
13. Approved the Community Education Annual Report for 2018-2019. A copy of the said report is attached to the Minutes and made a part thereof.
14. Early Childhood Report: Report was attached to the Agenda. Early Childhood Coordinator Brandon Ottway reported on the registration BBQ, which was a huge success. About half the families showed. Enrollment is good for this year, there are possibly 4 Open Enrolled students from Grand Rapids.
15. Building & Grounds Report: Building & Grounds Supervisor Eric Hill reported the building is ready to go for the start of school. Custodial staff has done a great job. Auction items went except for a couple of them. Warranty items to be closed out and have or will be addressed. A local resident came in and commented about the noisy unit on the new building and a call has been made and it will be looked at. All laptops and TV's installed and were given to teachers. Training on new devices will happen during the Teacher's Workshop this week.
16. Principal's Report: Principal Adam Johnson

reported full staff for this year. PBIS meeting August 8th went well and discussed having classes compete against each other in certain subjects. Went to LSI training with new staff and that went well. Working on plans for PLC's with teachers. Teacher Workshop is Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of this week. Wednesday August 28th is the Open House and there will be hot dogs and other good things to eat. There will be a TV Give Away for the students that show up. Very busy month and a half.

17. Superintendent's Report: Superintendent Pat Rendle reported that Saturdays football scrimmage went well. He praised Adam Johnson on the great job he is doing in his new position. He discussed the opioid addiction in the county and community and wondered what we can do to help out our residence and students. They're going to review ideas for activities to do with students to get to know them. For instance, 23 and ME is being introduced in the classrooms with other activities to help students learn different and less harmful ways to deal with stress and anger.
18. Accepted the Quotation from Northern Star Cooperative for the Propane usage for the 2019-2020 School Year in the amount of \$1.09 per gallon. A copy of the Quotations received are attached to the Minutes and made a part thereof.
19. Accepted the Quotation from Waste Management for garbage hauling for the 2019-2020 School year in the amount of \$ 465.17 per month. A copy of the Quotations received are attached to the Minutes and made a part thereof.
20. Accepted the Quotation from Lange's Nursery and Landscaping for snowplowing services for the 2019-2020 School Year at the rate of \$127.00 per hour for each piece of equipment. A copy of the Quotations received are attached to the Minutes and made a part thereof.
21. Approved the motion to close Activity Checking and Savings accounts and transfer funds to district account as of August 30, 2019. All Activity accounts are under Board control, this is why it is going into one account.
22. Approved the Motion to increase the hours for 3 year old Paraprofessional from 935 to 1118 for the 2019-2020 School Year. (This is 172 days at 6.5 hours a day = 1.0 FTE).

23. Approved the motion increase hours for 4 year old Paraprofessional from 935 to 1118 for the 2019-2020 School year. (This is 172 days at 6.5 hours a day = 1.0 FTE).
24. Approved the motion to increase hours for ECSE Paraprofessional from 961 to 1118 for the 2019-2020 School year. (This is 172 days at 6.5 hours = 1.0 FTE).
25. Approving to hire Dorie Barnes as Early Childhood Paraprofessionaol for the 2019-2020 School Year was tabled until the next Board Meeting.
26. Approved hiring Jessica Brenholt for SWARM Advisor for the 2019-2020 School Year per the HCUE contract.
27. Approved the Maternity Leave for Lindsay Skrbec for dates approximately October 7, 2019 to December 16, 2019 and to hire for a Long Term Sub.
28. Meeting adjourned at 6:49 p.m.

Practical Suggestions for Building Assets in Your Child

What Are Assets?

Assets are 40 key building blocks to help kids succeed. "Family boundaries" is one of six boundaries and expectations assets.

Clear, Concise Boundaries

Author Stephen Covey knows about the importance of setting and talking about boundaries and expectations. At a family meeting to discuss who would do which chores, Covey's seven-year-old son volunteered to care for the lawn.

Dad gave the boy a tour of the yard and pointed out which neighbor's yard he wanted the lawn to most look like. He and his son then agreed on two concise, clear expectations: clean and green.

After two weeks, Dad asked his son about the lawn. "It's fine," the boy replied, even though his dad knew he had done nothing to take care of it.

"Let's walk around the yard together and you can show me how it's going," Dad replied.

So they walked around the yard. It was obviously in bad shape, and the boy became upset. "It's so hard, Dad," he said. Dad didn't respond but wondered, "How hard is it not to do something?"

Dad then reminded his son that he—not Dad—was in charge of the yard, but he had a



few minutes to help out if the boy wanted it. The two then cleaned up the yard. When they were done, the yard was clean and green.

Over the summer, the son only asked his dad to help him a few more times and did the rest himself. The boundaries were clear. The expectations were clear, and the seven-year-old succeeded at keeping the yard clean and green.

time together

Three ways to set boundaries together with your child:

1. Observe the boundaries of other families (neighbors, television families, etc.). Discuss what's appropriate and what's not for your family and why.
2. Post your family boundaries on the refrigerator. Have only five or six. Make sure they are concise and clear, and apply to everyone—not just kids.
3. Meet monthly to discuss boundaries. Are they fair? Do they still fit? Do they reflect the values and principles you have? Adjust them if you need to.

Helpful Hints

Tips that make setting boundaries easier:

- **Make them positive. Say what you expect along with what you don't want.**
- **Strive for concise standards. Have each boundary be five words or less.**
- **Adjust boundaries as your child becomes older, but know that even 18-year-olds need guidelines.**
- **Set and follow boundaries for yourself. Be a role model. Admit when you fail.**

Dos and Don'ts of Discipline

Do

- Notice and comment when your child does something well. Be specific.
- Give your child your full attention, be affectionate, and calmly state how your child violated a boundary.
- Respond as quickly as you notice a violation.
- Respond consistently.
- Be firm about discipline and suggest better behavior.
- Be consistent by setting the same standards for boys as for girls.

Don't

- Only notice your child when he or she violates a standard.
- Use threats.
- Use physical punishment.
- Attack or ridicule your child.
- Manipulate your child with shame, humiliation, or guilt.
- Use labels, such as 'You're lazy' or 'You're such a slob.'
- Notice the violated rule sometimes and not others.

Quick Tip:
Tell your children why you chose the boundaries you have.

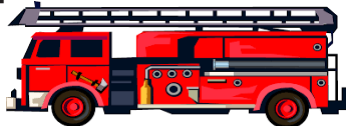

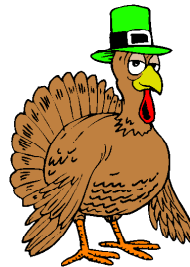


-There are a lot of great things happening here and this is just a small sample. We hope you can come check out some of the great things happening in our school!
