

The Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) Commissioner, Dr. Brenda Cassellius, issues a "Positive Review and Comment" for the Hill City School District's referendum plan. A positive review and comment means the proposed school construction project is educationally and economically advisable by MDE. The project description is hereby published below as per MN State Statute:

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

Hill City Independent School District #2 is proposing a single question bond referendum on May 2, 2017 that would authorize the issuance of bonds to finance the construction of a fitness room / community education space addition and other facility upgrades. The estimated cost of all projects, including bond issuance, is \$4,000,000.

The largest project component is a 3,700 square foot addition to be constructed on the east side of the existing school. It would house a fitness room with locker facilities and space for community education. Other upgrades to the existing structure include: a secure entrance, updated gym floors and lockers deferred maintenance, site upgrades and interior renovations.

The school board believes the proposed projects are in the best long-term interest of the district. The projects would be scheduled for completion in calendar year 2018. Cost estimates by project type are as follows:

Bond Issuance Costs	\$ 165,000

If the bond referendum is successful and bonds are sold, the debt service on the bonds will be eligible for debt service equalization under Minn. Stat. § 123B.53, Subd. 3, if the bond schedule is approved. The amount of debt service equalization aid, if any, the district receives is determined annually and is dependent upon property wealth, student population, and other statutory requirements.

REVIEW AND COMMENT STATEMENT

Based upon the department's analysis of the school district's required documentation and other pertinent information from sources of the Minnesota Department of Education, the Commissioner of Education provides a positive review and comment.



INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 HILL CITY, MINNESOTA

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of Independent School District No. 2, Hill City, Minnesota, was called to order by Chairman Sue Kaslow at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, March 27,2017.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll Call showed the following members present: Joell Miranda, Dorie Barnes, Sue Kaslow, Bambi Lange, and Mark Meyer. Board Members absent: Jay Zapzalka. Also present was Superintendent Pat Rendle, Business Manager Ellie Hill, Building & Grounds Director Eric Hill and other staff and visitors.

- 1. Approved the Agenda with additions.
- 2. Approved the following:

*Minutes of the Board Workshop of February 27, 2017.

*February 2017 bills presented for payment; *Current bills through 03/09/2017;

*Investments and wire transfers;

*Reviewed the Activity Fund Statement; *Reviewed Cash Receipts including donations.

- 3. Mark Curtiss and Ashley Carlson from IASC gave a presentation.
- 4. There was no report from the School Attorney.
- 5. Transportation Report: None.
- 6. Swarm Student Leadership: None.
- 7. Curriculum Committee: None.
- 8. School and Community Health Committee: Joell Miranda reported the meeting was held on March 25, 2017. They discussed the wellness policy updates. They formed a subcommittee to make changes and update the policy. The subcommittee had their first meeting on March 20th. Hill City School received a grant to purchase two new ovens. Hustle for Hunger will be held on May 6, 2017. Boy Camp: Camp name will be BRO (Brothers Respecting Others) and the camp date was set for May 20, 2017 at Long Lake Conservation Center. The Bike Rodeo has been set for June 8, 2017. The Health Fair is to be held in April. The Lions Club will come do vision screening with new equipment. The next meeting was set for April 18, 2017 at 7:30 a.m.
- 9. Safety/Transportation Committee: The last meeting had to be rescheduled due to no one showing for

the meeting.

- 10. Negotiation Committee: Business Manager requested to negotiate for third year.
- 11. Community Education Report: Community Education Programmer Tami Meyer reported open gym, homework help was going good, archery tournament went well on March 18th and the State Tournament is coming up in Duluth on March 31 and April 1, JO Volleyball is still going on, Leapin Leprechaun was a success with 22 kids and 13 adults. Upcoming: looking for coaches for Tee Ball and Little League, firearm safety in April, baton is to start April 12, and BRO Camp will be on May 20, 2017.
- 12. Early Childhood Report: We received our Blandin Grant in full! They strongly support our plan to increase to all day classes. They like how we are showing with 3rd grade MCA scores, that children in programming do better than others in 3rd grade still. Northland Grant reports are done and submitted (\$1,000 to support team going to cities for PreK-3 Leadership and \$1,000 to support PreK-3 Team and 2 family events (Literacy and Math). Kindergarten Round-Up will be April 28, 2017. Next year we have 15-18 Honey Bees signed up and eleven (11) Little Bees signed up. Great numbers.
- 13. Technology Report: None
- 14. Building & Grounds Director Report: Building & Grounds Director Eric Hill stated that in June they will begin repair on the small gym. The gym will be closed most of June. Some sidewalk repair to be done and also some parking issues resolved. The baseball/softball fields will soon be ready to work on.
- 15. Superintendent/Principal's Report: IASC update: Superintendent Rendle likes working with IASC. Good feedback from teachers working with other districts in IASC.
- 16. Superintendent Rendle stated that they are starting to remove some of the taxidermy animals that went to the DNR.
- 17. Working on getting the School Newsletter out this month using students for this issue and community members for future newsletters.
- Tabled hiring a Junior High Softball Coach for the 2016-2017 school
- 19. No action was taken on the Resolution Proposing to Place Instructional Staff on Unrequested leave of Absence.

- 20. No action was taken on the Termination and Nonrenewal of Teaching Contract for Probationary Teacher.
- 21. Approved hiring Patrick Rendle as full time Superintendent from March 1 through June 30, 2017, with salary as discussed.
- 22. Approved the Superintendent Professional Services Agreement with ISD #118 Northland Community School for .40 FTE from March 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017.
- 23. Approved hiring Andy Dokken as full time principal from March 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017, with salary as discussed.
- 24. Approved to adopt the Resolution Appointing Election Judges for the May 2, 2017 School District Special Election: Nancy Fixmer as head judge and Kathy Barker and Dan Kingsley as election judges with as hourly wage of \$13.65 per hour.
- 25. First reading of the following policies: #402.1 Grievance Procedure for Complaints of Discrimination Policies, #513.1 Counseling and Pre-Career and Technical Programs Policy, and the addition to #1054 Emergency Plan Policy.
- 26. Chairman Nancy Hannah brought the meeting to order in the basement of Hill City United Methodist Church with the following also in attendance: manager Grace Quaas Hazel Hess, Jeanette Huff, Karen Valley, Diane Hetletvedt, Cindy Rollins, Nancy Hannah, Roger Lynn and Bonnie Harcey.

Minutes from the February meeting were read by Bonnie followed by a motion from Roger, seconded by Jeanette to approve the minutes as read. Motion carried.

Financial report included the following: Donations to the following organization were sent:

- \$25 to the Hill City School
- \$30 to the Hill City Chamber of Commerce
- \$50 to Hill City Area Food Shelf

A motion was made by Diane and seconded by Hazel to approve the financial report. Motion carried.

Old business: Mark Holm was unable to contact owner John McManigle to obtain permission for permanent attachment of a lock box. Roger will contact John in order to proceed with the project.

New business:

• Grace reported that a work-day on March 28th resulted in replacing winter items with summer stock and that volunteers are now repairing the storage building which was damaged in the July, 2016 storm.

• Gift certificates for Thrift Shop merchandise with a total value of \$60 have been purchased for distribution at the senior Bingo games to be held at Hill Lake Manor on April 19th. Discussion resulted in a decision for a basket of items with a value of \$15-\$20 from the Thrift Shop to also be donated as a prize at the games. Diane and Cindy will gather items for the basket. Karen will deliver it to people in charge of the event.

• Grace reported that she donated bedding and a coffee maker from the Thrift Shop to be raffled at the Johnson benefit, which has been scheduled on April 15th at the Moose Club in Grand Rapids.

• A representative of Aitkin County contacted Grace to let her know that road construction to improve water run-off of the section of County Road 74 to the south of the Thrift Shop will be done in the next few months. A curb will be installed on the north edge, and a lower structure which will allow for passage to Bear Park area will edge the south of the new road section.

• A "bag sale" will be held before July 4th to reduce inventory of donated items.

• The credit card machine has been returned to working order.

• Because of the change in tax exemption status of the Thrift Shop, receipts may now be issued to donors.

• Since Lutheran Island Camp collects unwanted shoes for recycle, those that cannot be sold at the Thrift Shop are being donated to that organization.

• Several suggestions were made for increasing sales at the Thrift Shop:

o With permission from school authorities, a table at public events there could display items and information to encourage shoppers to visit the Thrift Shop.

o Thrift Shop Dollars could be printed and then dispensed in various ways as incentive for shoppers to spend money there.

o Bonnie will publish new posters and place them in local establishments.

Practical Suggestions for Building Assets in Your Child

FAST FACTS ASSET #16: High Expectations

Youth are more likely to grow up healthy when both parents and teachers encourage young people to do well.

What Are Assets?

Assets are 40 key building blocks to help kids succeed. "High expectations" is one of six boundaries and expectations assets.

Expecting the Best

Then you give a child a helium-filled balloon, it brings great joy. But if the balloon is losing air and gradually deflates, the child becomes frustrated. If the balloon is difficult to hang on to and floats away, the child cries.

A balloon is like expectations. If they're too low or too high, they're not helpful. But if the expectations are high-yet still within reach-the child holds the taut string of the balloon with an arm extended up. Expectations should make our children stretch but also still be able to see what they're stretching toward.

Expectations should differ based on each child's temperament, abilities, gifts, and talents. A natural-born athlete who is bored in physical education, goofs around most of the time, and still gets an 'A,' doesn't have high enough expectations set on her. The dyslexic child who struggles to keep up with the state standards of reading for his age has expectations placed upon him that are too

high-that may be out of reach. High expectations can bring out the best in our children, yet expectations constantly need to

be evaluated and revamped so that they encourage our children without discouraging them, and so that they challenge our children without frustrating them. What do you expect of your child?

Helpful Hints

Tips that make setting high expectations with your child easier:

- Educate yourself on child development so you know what's realistic.
- Continue to look for creative and new ways to stimulate your child.
- Periodically check out your expectations with your child.
- Allow your child to make mistakes and learn from them.
