HILL CITY, MINNESOTA

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of Independent School District No. 2, Hill City, Minnesota, was called to order by Chairman Sue Kaslow at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, April 27, 2015.

Roll Call showed the following members present: Sue Kaslow, Joell Miranda, Bambi Lange, Mark Meyer, and Jay Zapzalka. Board Members absent: Brent Welk. Also present was Superintendent/Principal Dean Yocum, Business Manager Ellie Hill, Maintenance Supervisor Eric Hill, Joe Silko, Marc Olig, and other community members.

1. Approved the Agenda with additions.
2. Approved the following:
 - *Minutes of the Closed Negotiation Strategy Meeting of March 12, 2015;
 - *Minutes of the Regular Meeting of March 23, 2015;
 - *Minutes of the Special Board Meeting of April 9, 2015 with the correction of removing some of the items;
 - *March 2015 bills presented for payment;
 - *Current bills through 04/09/15;
 - *Investments and wire transfers;
 - *Reviewed the Activity Fund Statement;
 - *Reviewed Cash Receipts including donations.
3. Mr. Joe Silko presented information about what EIP (Education Innovation Partners) can do for Hill City School. Sue Kaslow stated she would like to see this discussed at the next workshop meeting to see how this can impact us.
4. There was no report from the School Attorney.
5. Transportation Report: The Spang/Hill Road and Smith Road bus transportation request for 2015-2016 school year was presented. Visitors discussed the fact that five students would use this route. The Board will review options and discuss at the budget workshop scheduled for June 18, 2015. There is one new substitute bus driver, Jeff Madsen, and one more being tested. More bus drivers are needed.
6. Swarm Student Leadership: Marc Olig reported on SWARM concessions and that prom will be held at the school on May 2, 2015 with the theme being Candyland.
7. Curriculum Committee: Superintendent/Principal Yocum gave a brief report on the curriculum committee.
8. School and Community Health Committee: Joell Miranda reported that the Health Fair will run along with the School Expo on May 27, 2015. Preparations for the Hill City Area Food Shelf Hustle for Hunger 5k are underway. The 5k is scheduled for Saturday, May 2nd. Bike Rodeo letters were sent out to parents, letting them know about this event. Registrations will begin on May 1st and end on May 15th. The Rodeo will be limited to the first 30 participants who register. Prizes

will include bike safety lights for all participants and food will be provided. The Bike Rodeo is scheduled for June 4th.

9. Safety/Transportation Committee: The next meeting is scheduled for May 6, 2015.
10. Negotiation Committee: AFSCME intent to negotiate was received. The Board is waiting on the State to settle their budget to know what kind of funding we will have for the next two years before we proceed.
11. Community Education Report: No report
12. Maintenance Supervisor report: Maintenance Supervisor Eric Hill reported on the maintenance budget and repairs needed.
13. Approved five repairs.
14. The School welding/auto shop ventilation system needs updating. Maintenance Supervisor Eric Hill contacted the Design Group Inc. to assess the shop and reported on their findings.
15. Approved to proceed with quotes for the shop ventilation system updates through the Design Group, Inc.
16. Superintendent/Principal Yocum reported IASC will need to post for a new technology director. Currently formulating and cleaning up the job description.
17. Joell Miranda and possibly Brent Welk will do Graduation Honors on May 29, 2015.
18. Due to staff changes, further discussion is needed regarding registration/class sizes to decide.
19. Discussion was held on the Dean of Students position. The Board decided that more details were needed before posting for this position. Superintendent/Principal Yocum will work out the details and bring it to the Board at the next meeting.
20. Accepted Lynn Hronoski's resignation as assistant cook.
21. Approved hiring Lynn Hronoski as school secretary from August 1st through June 15th each year with pay as per current AFSCME contract and to post for a four hour clerical position.
22. Approve posting for up to 1 FTE Science teacher.
23. Accept the resignation from Chad Lathrop as Head Football Coach and to post for this position.
24. For informational purposes only, the following teacher will attain tenure at the end of this contract: Brian Burman.
25. No action taken on the Resolution Proposing to Place Instructional Staff on Unrequested Leave of Absence.
26. Adopted the Resolution Relating to the Termination and Nonrenewal of Teaching Contract for Probationary Teacher for Patti Schmidt.
27. Adopted the Resolution Relating to the Termination and Nonrenewal of Teaching Contract for Probationary Teacher for Jodi Perrington.
28. There will be a public hearing on the tax abatement request before the next Regular School Board Meeting. The Hearing will be set for 6:50 p.m. before the May

29. Approved the tentative Graduating Class of 2015 as presented.

31. Changed the May Regular Board Meeting from May 25, 2015 to May 26, 2015 at 7:00 p.m.
32. First reading of the Wellness Policy: Policy #533.
33. Approved the School Portrait Service Agreement with Lifetouch.
34. A School Board Workshop to discuss the budget will be held on June 18, 2015 at 7:00 p.m.
35. Meeting adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

Practical Suggestions for Building Assets in Your Child

FAST FACTS

ASSET TYPE #4: Constructive Use of Time

The more time your child spends with caring adults who help her or him nurture skills and creativity, the more likely your child will grow up healthy.

65%
*of youth surveyed by Search Institute reported at least two of the four constructive use of time assets.**

What Are Assets?

Assets are 40 key building blocks to help kids succeed.

* Based on Search Institute survey of almost 100,000 6th- to 12th-grade youth throughout the United States.

Your Child's Constructive Use of Time

Sometimes kids get bored. Other times they're so busy we rarely see them. The paces of our children's lives seem to vary according to the activities and programs they're in at the moment.

These fluctuations are normal—even healthy. As long as our kids aren't stuck in having too much to do or not enough to do, they're on track.

It never hurts, however, to periodically take an 'activity' inventory. Ask your child questions such as these:

- Overall, are you happy with how many different things you do with your time? Why or why not?
- Are the activities you're in stimulating and



challenging?

- Are you making friends with caring, thoughtful adults in your activities?
- Are you learning new skills, talents, or knowledge?
- Do your activities teach you more about yourself?
- Are you excited each day to do these activities?

- Do these activities bring out the best in you?

The more your child answers yes, the better. If your child seems to have too few constructive, challenging things to do, consider helping her or him find other constructive activities using the criteria in the questions above.

More to come on the four constructive use of time assets!

4 Key Areas of Involvement

Search Institute researchers identified four assets in the area of constructive use of time that are crucial for helping young people grow up healthy. Check your child's areas of strength:

- Creative activities—Your child spends three or more hours per week in lessons or practice in music, theater, or other arts
- Youth programs—Your child spends three

or more hours per week in sports, clubs, or organizations at school and/or in community organizations

- Religious community—Your child spends one or more hours per week in activities in a religious institution
- Time at home—Your child is out with friends 'with nothing special to do' two or fewer nights per week.

Support Through the Years

Age Ways to Structure Your Child's Time Use

- 0-1
 - Have your baby spend most of the time with you or one or two consistent caregivers.
 - Be flexible regarding the schedule your child would like and gradually introduce predictable routines.
- 2-3
 - Have consistent times for sleeping, feeding, playing and relaxing.
 - Balance stimulating, structured time with free playtime.
- 4-5
 - Find simple household chores that you and your child can do together.
 - Begin to introduce your child to museums and community activities that welcome young children.
- 6-10
 - Allow your child to have two outside-the-home activities that are led by caring, maturing adults.
 - Help your child not to overbook or underbook activities.
- 11-15
 - Help your young adolescent set boundaries on structured activities. Look for ones that are positive, stimulating, have caring adults and don't require excessive time commitments.
 - Evaluate with your young adolescent the amount of "hanging out" time he or she has if it is balanced with home time, time in activities, and school time.
- 16-18
 - Help your teenager think about how time spent on different activities helps or hinders in reaching goals.
 - Encourage your teenager to be involved in at least one activity that may continue into her or his adult years.

What About Work?

"Teenagers do learn from their work experience, but not necessarily lessons that adults would endorse. In fact, employment can cause adolescents more harm than good, especially if the teenager works more than 10 or 15 hours a week," say Laurence Steinberg, Ph.D., and Ann Levine, authors of *You and Your Adolescent*.

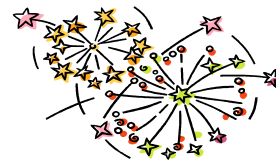
