The Regular Board Meeting of the Board of Education of Independent School District No. 2, Hill City, Minnesota, was called to order at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, October 24, 2022

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll Call by Clerk showed the following members present: Bambi Lange, Joell Miranda, Rich Kingsley, Ron Saxton, Mark Meyer and Jay Zapzalka. Board Members absent: None.

- 1. Approved the Agenda as presented.
- 2. Approved the following:
 - *Correction and Approval for Minutes of the Regular Meeting of August 5th and September 24, 2022
 - *Current bills through September 2022
 - *Investments and wire transfers;
 - *Reviewed Cash Receipts including donations.
- 3. Recognitions: None
- 4. Retirement bells and thank you's were mailed out.
- Transportation Report: Busses have been going smoothly. Down 1 driver who is recovering and doing well. Bus Safety went well.
- 6. Curriculum Committee: Teachers are getting samples of curriculums that they like. Looking at textbooks with online access. Gathering samples to see what is out there. Hope to be making a decision in Feb./March. Discussion about internet access using hotspots. Looking at a good hybrid option.
- 7. Policy Committee: Meeting on Thursday October 27, 2022.
- 8. School and Community Health Report:

- 13.Building & Grounds Director Report: Report attached to Official Minutes and made a part thereof.
- 14.Principal's Report: Ms. Huusko gave a report. Wrapped up Book Blast. Fundraiser went really well. Suicide presentation, kids behaved great and seemed to enjoy it and had good feedback from kids. School forest with Mr. Alleva's science class and saw the improvements there. The evacuation went well, need to figure out a better system for the reunification process with parents. Feedback from Aitkin County was good. PD day was busy with positive feedback. 3 year process of getting reading scores up and discussed plan to help the process. Started teacher observations.
- 15. Superintendent's Report: The Audit seemed to go well. ARCC has been extremely helpful. Substitute shortages has hit us hard. We had to fill rate of 39% in September and 42% in October. Looking into possibly hiring a full-time sub to have in the building every day. Elections are coming up. Hill City has 3 open spots and 3 candidates. Veterans Day is coming up. Mrs. Holm is planning a program with the help of SWARM. Researching new website programs for the school website. The evacuation went well. Conferences are scheduled for November 15 & 16. Discussed compensatory funding and the increase from previous years. Having the parents fill out the free and reduced lunch forms is important for more than just free and reduced lunch, as those numbers are used for other reports and grants the school can qualify for. ESSER funds expire in Sepember 2024. Discussed other grants

- that are in the process to help with funding student field trips and other things to help and inspire students.
- 16. Approved the final seniority list for the 2022-23 school year with corrections.
- 17.Approved hiring Mark J Meyer as full time custodian with a starting date of October 25, 2022. This will be at a janitor rate of pay, per the current AFSCME contract until a Special Engineering Boilers License is obtained.
- 18. Approved hiring Amanda Rutanen as Math Credit Recovery Teacher.
- 19.Approved hiring Jonathan Gowell as Assistant Boys Basketball coach for the 2022-23 school year as per the HCUE contract. JH boys basketball coach has also been posted and hope to have it filled by the next Board Meeting.
- 20.Approved FY22 Committed for Severance.
- 21.Meetings to Attended and Meetings Attended: Next Regular Board Meeting, November 18, 2022; Policy Committee Meeting October 27, 11 am; Special Meeting to canvas votes on November 14, 2022 at 6 pm; Phase I training virtual training in December 2022; The 2023 MSBA Leadership Conference is currently scheduled to be an in-person event on January 12 & 13, 2023, at the Minneapolis Convention Center.
