Engineer Update - Tami

Clerk Meyer and George Casper met with Andrew Beadell and Morgan Salo, Bolton & Menk via zoom to discuss the Water Treatment Plant Project and financing. We discussed the PFA and WIF money and when that would be available. The design cost and the preliminary engineering costs are approximately \$525,000.00. The city can get a bridge loan through Rural Water for the \$525,000.00 and once we get the money from PFA and WIF we can pay that off.

There is a grant available through MN DOT Aeronautics that we can apply to get a tractor mower for the airport. This is on the CIP as something to get in a few years. This grant is not an annual one and only becomes available when they have the money. The grant is a 90% grant 10% local match.

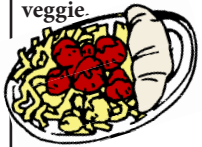
