STRENGTHENING SIBLEY FUTURE

This program brings residents of our county together to build skills and deepen their understanding of county and regional assets. Each class is comprised of a maximum of 24 participants who either live or work in Sibley County. Participants gather the third Tuesday of each month from September through May. Four sessions will be held with our county partners to build a regional network and understanding. The leadership sessions will be taught by University of Minnesota Extension leadership and civic engagement educators. Each session will use interactive activities and discussion to allow for skill development that will help them lead at work and in their communities. Preschool Screening – What is that?

Early childhood screening is a screening that is required through the state of MN to enter Kindergarten. Sibley East School staff and other agencies coordinate to developmentally screen your children as well as perform hearing, vision, height, weight assessments and review immunizations. This screener will assure that your child is ready for kindergarten and that they are developmentally growing as they should be.

PRESCHOOL – Discovery (3 years) & PALS (4-5 years)

Sibley East offers two preschool programs, Discovery and PALS (kindergarten readiness). Discovery students attend two or three half-days a week throughout the school year while PALS students attend 5 half-days per week!

All classes are taught by MN state licensed early childhood teachers. Tuition for preschool is paid monthly and is a flat fee.

**The program is affordable for anyone regardless of their income level.
Scholarships are available for the preschool programs.**

To qualify for PALS a child must be 4 years old by September 1, 2026. To qualify for Discovery, a child must be 3 by September 1, 2026.

We would strongly advise that all children be potty trained before the start of class. Optional busing is available through Sibley-East transportation for an additional cost.
