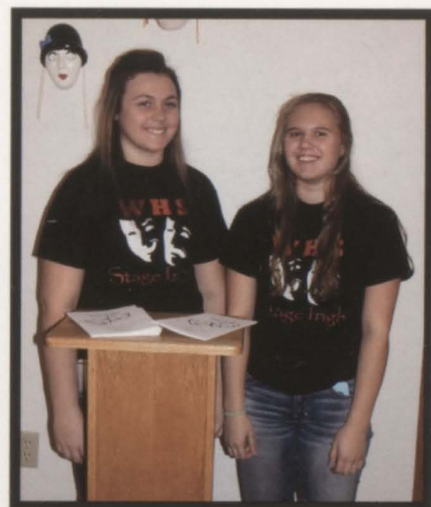

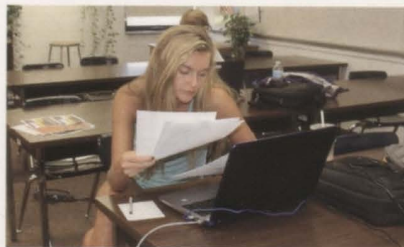

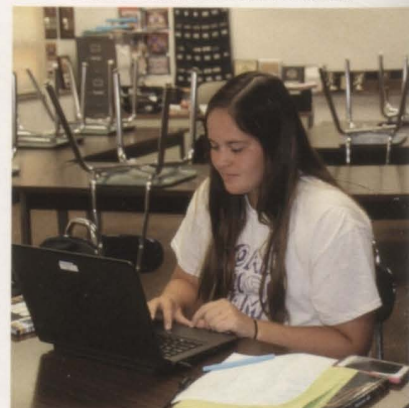

ACADEMIC HONORS

The 32nd Annual Academic Banquet was held at St. Mary's Hall on Thursday, May 4th, 2017. In 1986, when Mrs. Cyndy DeMers organized the first banquet, less than 15% of the school was eligible for recognition for academics. This year, over three times that percentage—103 out of 194 students or 53% of the high school—qualified for an award. With academic awards alone, 91 individual students qualified. The student earns a certificate, an academic letter and Honor's pin for the first year in attendance, and a certificate and year pin for each year thereafter. Outstanding Students are nominated by a teacher who feels that the student has the best aptitude, attitude and willingness to work in the class. This is not just the students with the best grade, but this is the student who has given everything they have to meet the expectations of that class. This is really a special honor awarded to students by the individual teachers, and students receive a certificate

signed by that teacher. There were 55 Outstanding Students recognized as well.

To be recognized with a 4-year plaque, a student has had to maintain a 3.5 GPA or above for each of their 4 years of high school. There were 19 (35%) students who qualified from the senior class.

The other recipients included 25 (46%) freshmen, 22 (51%) sophomores, 21 (49%) juniors, and 33 (61%) seniors. The program includes the National Honor Society and its induction ceremony for the students who have qualified this year. Mrs. Kelly Assman, NHS Advisor, presented this portion of the program. The Winner School Board sponsors the student and guardian's meals, medals, certificates and letters.

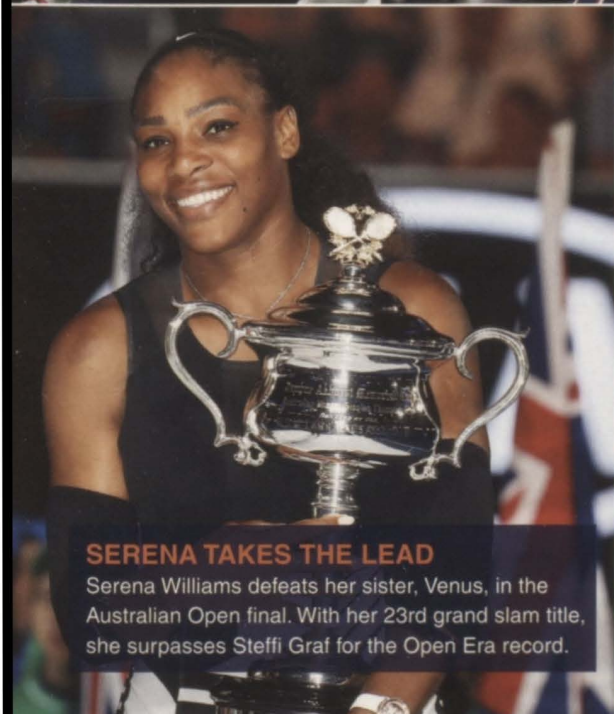
