







Using the theme, "Join the Amazing Race with FCCLA," officers and members planned the program of work and carried out leadership and service projects along with competing in STAR (Students Taking Action for Recognition) Events at the district, state and national level. Members attended summer leadership training, fall leadership training Officer Training and Power Training, cluster meeting in Salt Lake City, district meeting in White River, state meeting in Sioux Falls, and national meeting in Chicago. 19 members competed in STAR Events at Districts in White River and all advanced to state with Gold Medal ratings. Megan was elected to the Family Peer Education Team and Sara was elected to the Career Peer Education Team. Allison was elected Vice President of Individual Recognition. Kris Brockhoft, Winner FCCLA Adviser, served as the 2009-2010 State Chapter Adviser and was named the 2010 Outstanding SD FCCLA Adviser. The Winner FCCLA Chapter also received several awards: District VI Top Honors Trophy, Merit Chapter Award, Increased Membership Award, and numerous members received State Power of One Awards. Christopher Brockhoft served as the 2009-2010 National FCCLA President and presided at the July 2010 National Leadership Conference in Chicago, III. As national president, Christopher serves a 2 year term as a member of the National Board of Directors and was a member of numerous committees, two of which he chaired. 






















