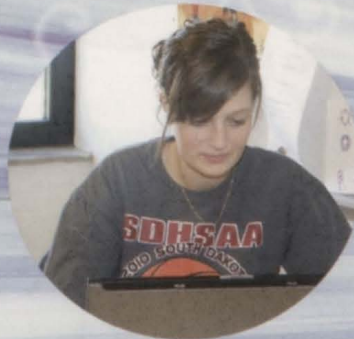

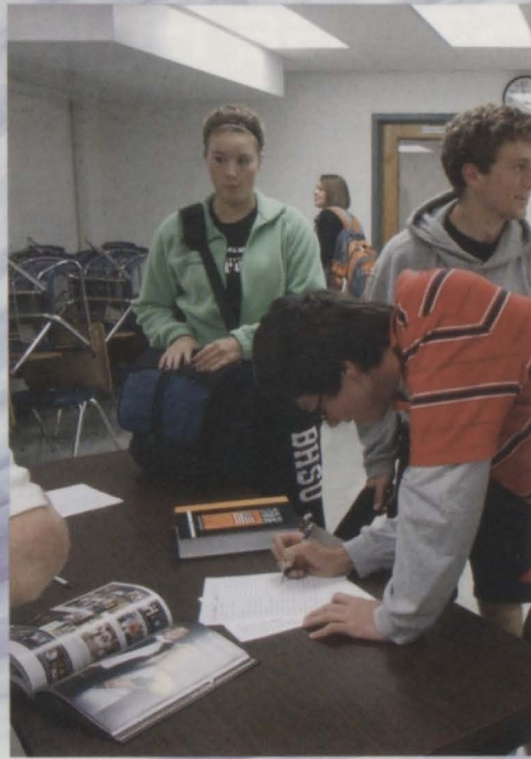

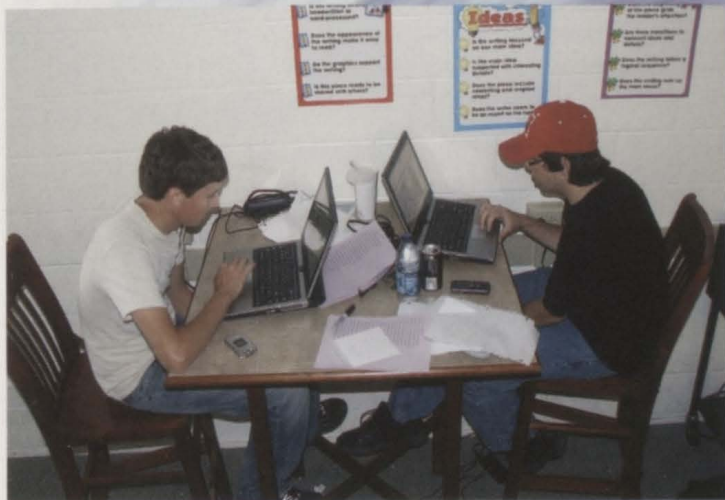

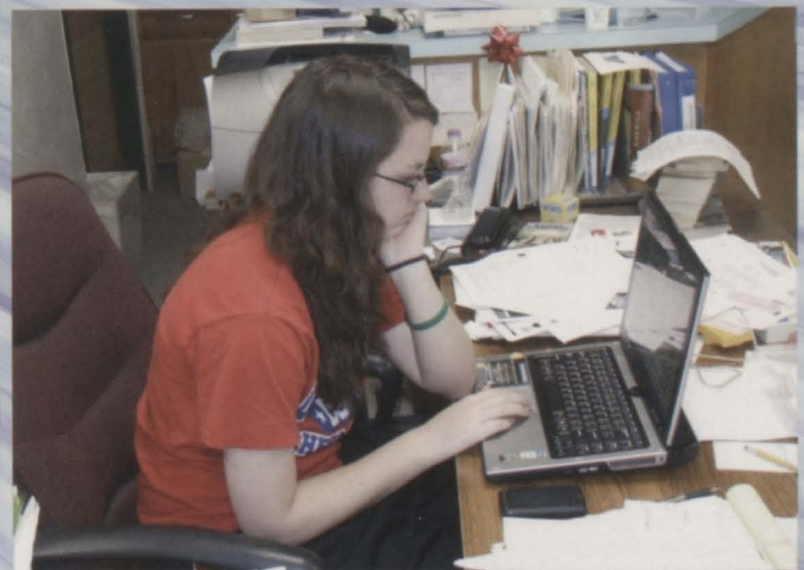

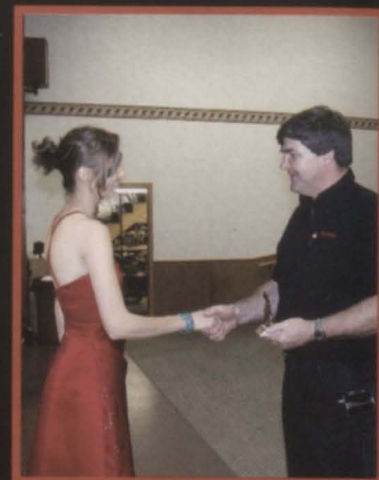

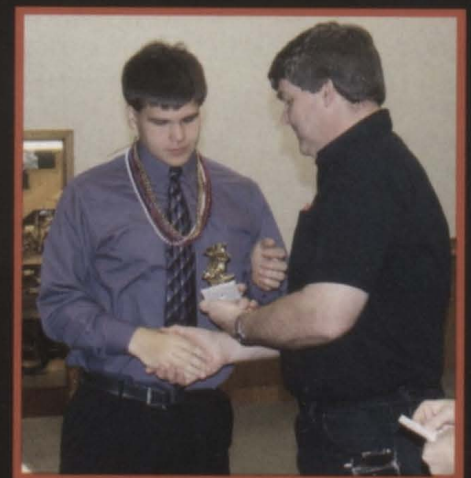

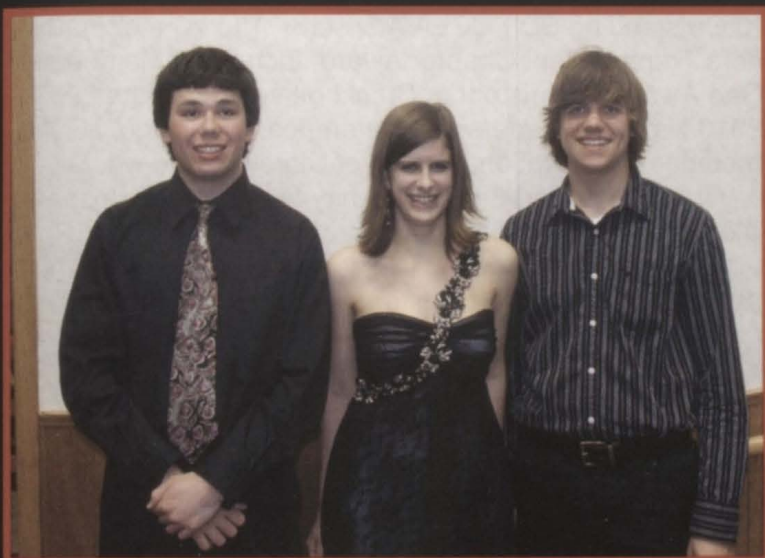

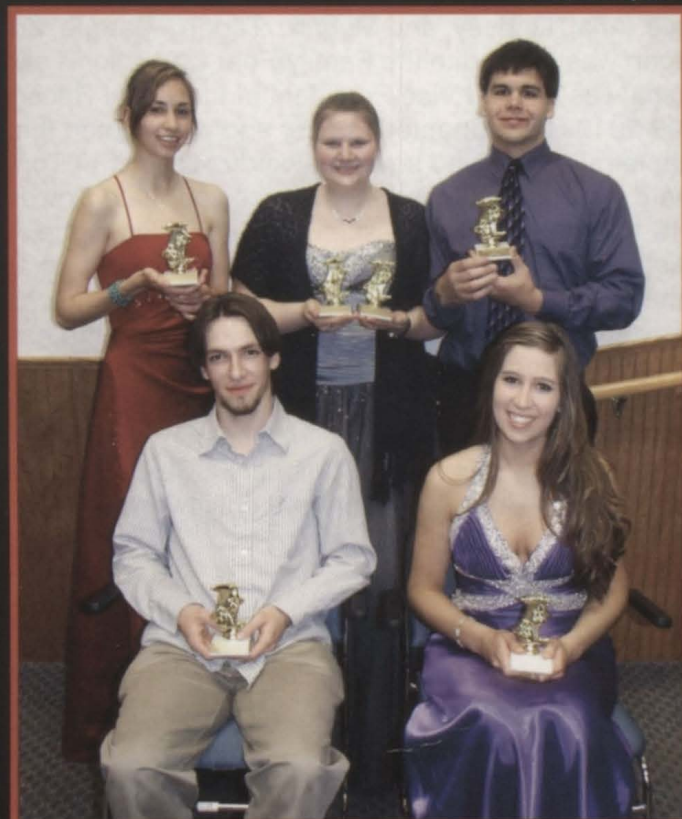

Using the theme, "Join the Amazing Race with FCCLA," officers and members planned the program of work and carried out leadership and service projects along with competing in STAR (Students Taking Action for Recognition) Events at the district, state and national level. Members attended summer leadership training, fall leadership training Officer Training and Power Training, cluster meeting in Salt Lake City, district meeting in White River, state meeting in Sioux Falls, and national meeting in Chicago. 19 members competed in STAR Events at Districts in White River and all advanced to state with Gold Medal ratings. Kristina, Amy, Allison and Lindsey presented workshops. Lindsey presided as District VI Co-Chair, and Allison was elected the new, 2010-2011 District VI Chairperson. 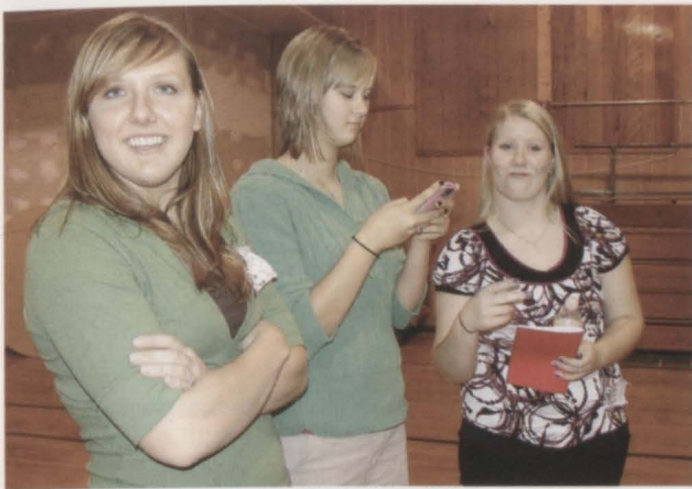

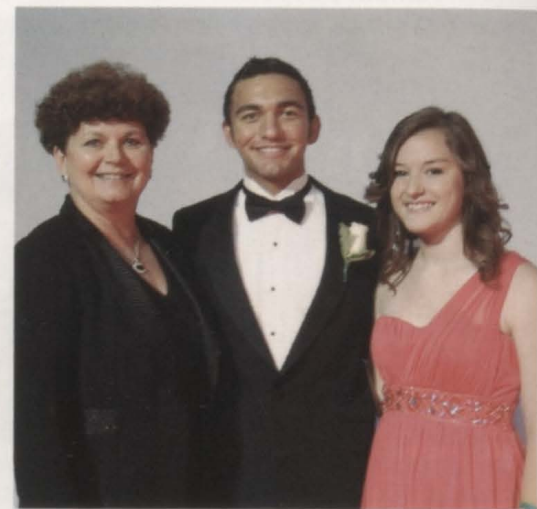

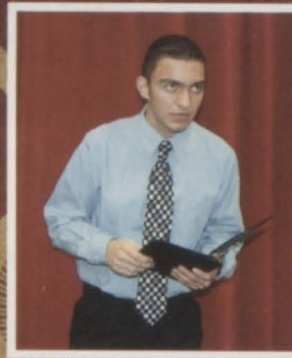

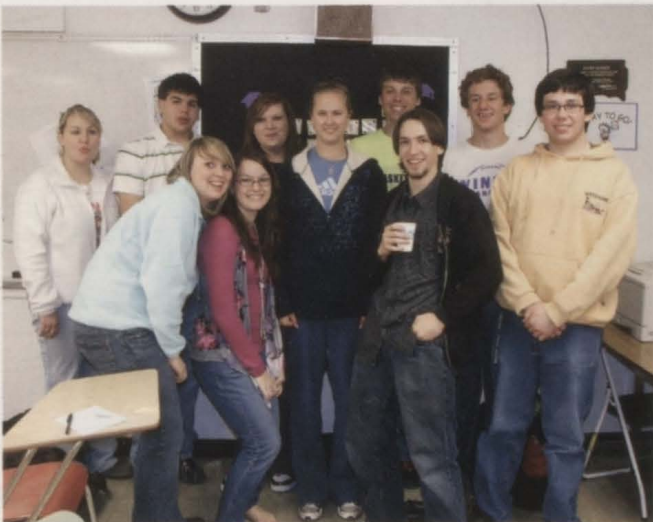

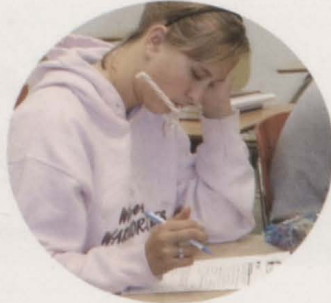

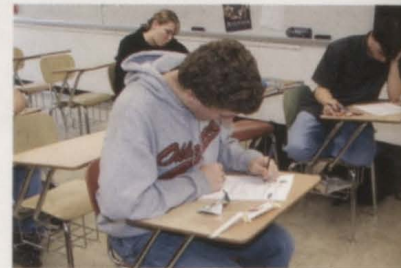

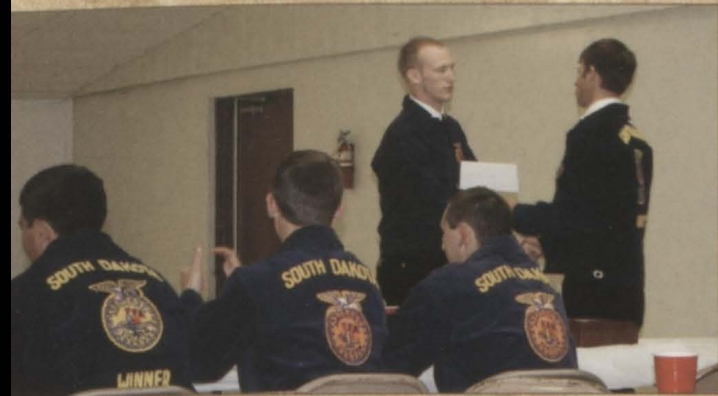

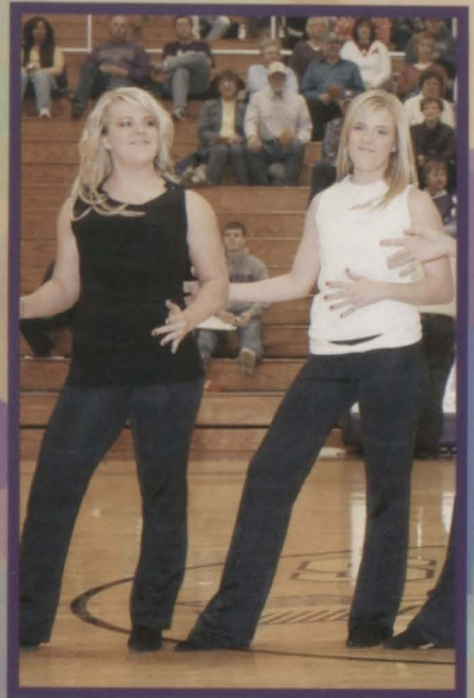

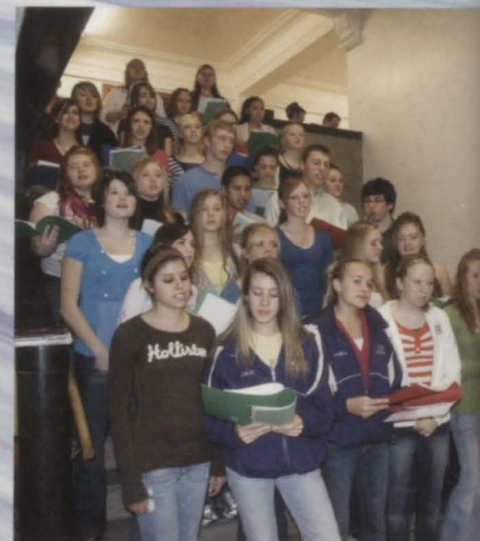

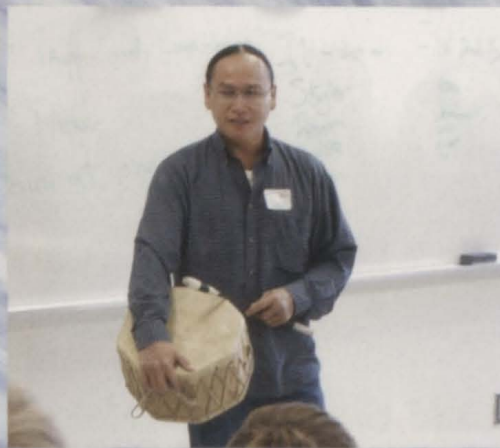

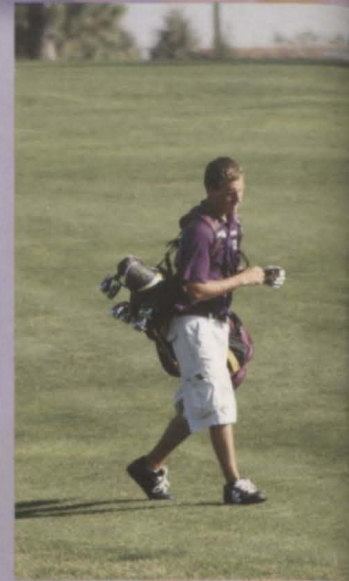

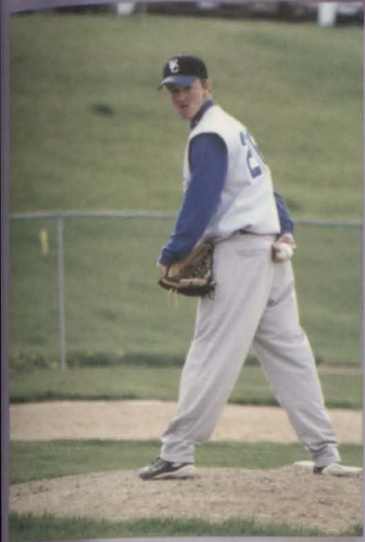

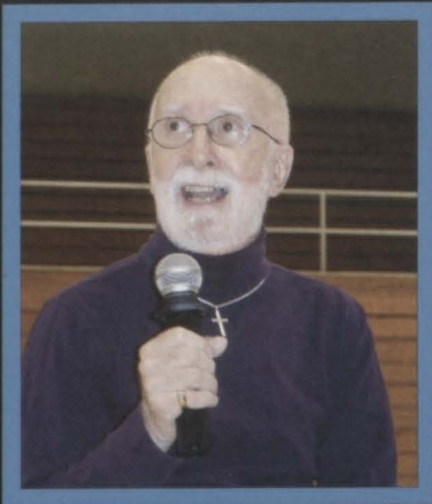

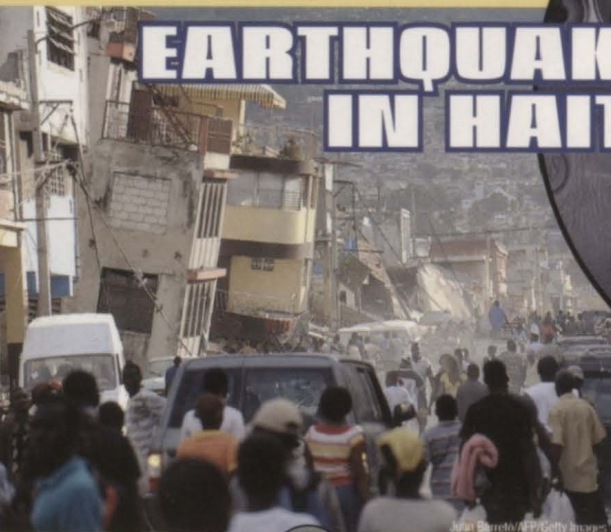

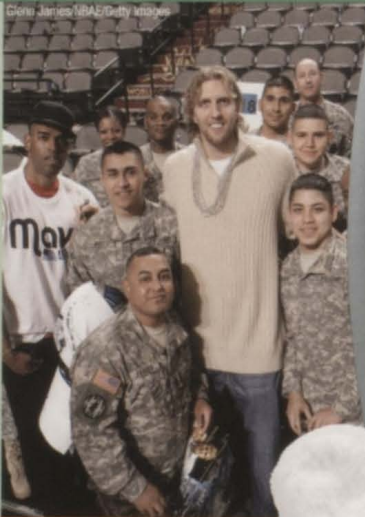
