







State A Boys Basketball

There was a lot of exciting games this year at State A's. The Warriors were part of two overtime games. In the consolation semifinals, they faced Tri-Valley who lost in a previous double overtime game to St. Thomas More. The Warriors went in to double overtime with the Mustangs but couldn't finish it out and they lost by a bucket. In the 7th place game, the Warriors faced their conference foes from Chamberlain. Although earlier this year the Warriors were able to beat the Cubs, they just couldn't do it twice and they lost in overtime. Senior Kyle Mathis was named to the All Tournament team. This year's team broke nine team records-offensive and defensive rebounds, total putbacks, steals, deflections, and recoveries, 3 pt. field goals, and most points in a whole season.
