

 NCBVA is a group of volunteers dedicated to sanctioning Boys Volleyball in NC and until we get there, providing structure for schools while we grow the game.




BRIEF HISTORY OF BOYS' VOLLEYBALL IN NC

- 9 years ago, there were no boys playing volleyball in NC.
- Today, nearly 2500 boys are playing at 135+ Public/Private Schools
- Rapid growth with NCHSAA schools (2000% in 3 years)
- In Spring 2025, 3 State Championships (1-3A & 4A NCHSAA/Private), All-State Awards
- Exciting things to come for our 2026 season / All-Conference, All-Region, All-Star Game





1-3A BRACKET






4A BRACKET

Turnkey Abbreviated Season Explained

Season Planning

 NCBVA handles uniforms, referees, scheduling, and post season details.

Fully Funded

• Entirely funded by grants. No cost to schools.

Season Format

- 1–2 practices per week; schools set their own schedule.
- Season includes 4 round-robin Saturdays: March 22, March 29, April 5, April 12 (top team earns state playoff spot)
- All games hosted at a local school. School keeps the gate as incentive to host.

Athlete Registration

 Players register via Dragonfly or their preferred registration platform.










MOMENTUM




