NYS PHSAA Executive Committee Meeting Highlights

1. Dr. Robert Zayas – Executive Director
 - a. Diversity, Equity & Inclusion National Book Study
The NFHS will launch a first-ever national book study in the Fall of 2022 in support of its focus on diversity, equity, and inclusion. The NYS PHSAA staff and interested Section Executive Directors will be invited to participate.
 - b. NFHS Football Tackling Course
The NFHS and the National Football League have teamed up to produce a new free “Football Tackling Course” for the NFHS Learning Center, designed to assist interscholastic coaches in teaching, evaluating, and programming proper tackling techniques.
 - c. Girls Lacrosse Headgear
The NFHS Lacrosse Committee is interested in gathering more detailed information. The NYS PHSAA Safety Committee will examine this topic at their Fall 2022 Meeting and the NYS PHSAA Girls Lacrosse Committee will discuss this topic at their next Committee Meeting on December 5, 2022.
 - d. Lacrosse Possession Clock
The NFHS Lacrosse Committee is currently discussing the potential implementation of a possession clock in the sport of Boys and Girls Lacrosse. NYS PHSAA may seek permission from the NFHS to conduct a possession clock experiment for the 2024 season.
 - e. 2024-2025 Calendar
NYS PHSAA continues to abide by the standard calendar of dates. The Membership should be aware of the following notable dates during the 2024-2025 school year:
 - i. Football start date (Saturday, Week #7) – August 24
 - ii. Fall Sports start date (Monday, Week #8) – August 26
 - iii. Thanksgiving (Thursday) - November 28
 - iv. Football Championships – December 6-8
 - v. Winter start date (Monday, Week #20) – November 18
 - vi. Spring start date (Monday, Week #37) – March 17
 - vii. Spring 2025 Championships (Week #49) – Championships conclude on June 14
 - viii. (Outdoor Track, Softball, Basketball, Boys & Girls Lacrosse)Attached is the Standard Calendar of Weeks – 7-Year Calendar – Fall of 2022-2028

They will also discuss and recommend any future post-season competition at the Regional or State level. The NYSPHSAA staff will be asking each participating Section to forward a representative to meet in September/October 2022.

Process for School Enrollment Numbers and Classification Cut-Off Numbers

VARIATION SPORTS:

In accordance with the NYSPHSAA Handbook (Classification Variations): *"All Variation Sports will present changes to the Championship Advisory Committee (CAC) prior to proposing changes to classification cut-off numbers to the Executive Committee at the May meeting. Approved changes will not go into effect the following school year."*

NON-VARIATION SPORTS:

Each October, the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee approves the school enrollment numbers and classification cut-off numbers for non-variation sports (Boys and Girls Soccer, Boys and Girl Basketball, Baseball, Softball).

Note: Because Girls Volleyball will be using a sixth classification starting with the 2023 Fall season, they need their school enrollment numbers and classification cut-off numbers approved in October 2022.

The formula used to establish the classification cut-off numbers for non-variation sports will be 75 on the top (Class AAA) and 100 bottom (Class D) and equally dived the middle.

The following timeline will be used each year:

August:

- Sections will submit a current list of all teams (schools) participating in non-variation sports (*and Girls Volleyball for Fall 2022*).
- The Section submitted list will include all current/planned merged teams (schools) and the current/planned reclassification of any non-public & charter schools.

September:

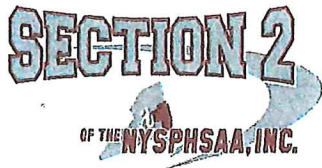
- The NYSPHSAA staff will receive the final BEDS numbers from NYSED.
- A report for the following school enrollment numbers will be created and shared with all Section Executive Directors for review.
- The NYSPHSAA staff will also prepare a report for the classification cut-off numbers for non-variation sports (*and Girls Volleyball for Fall 2022*).
- The approved formula used to determine the classification cut-off will be a minimum of 75 in the highest classification (Class AAA), a minimum of 100 in the lowest classification (Class D) and equally divide the remaining classifications (Girls Volleyball – variation 60/80).
- The classifications will take into account all merged teams and reclassifications of any non-public schools.
- Reclassified non-public & charter schools will be listed at the top of the classification.

October:

- The school enrollments numbers and the classification cut-off numbers for non-variation sports (*and Girls Volleyball for Fall 2022*) will be presented to the Executive Committee for approval.
- Once school enrollment numbers and classification cut-off numbers are approved, they will be final and can only be changed due to a clerical error.
- If a non-public or charter school is moved up or down in classification, following the Executive Committee's October approval, the classification cut-off numbers will not be adjusted nor will any other school's placement be impacted (i.e., non-public school's basketball team is moved from Class AA to Class AAA in December; this will result in 76 teams in Class AAA).

- If a merger is approved following the Executive Committee's October approval, the classification cut-off numbers will not be adjusted nor will any other school's placement be impacted (i.e., two Class D schools merge in Boys Basketball in December and become a Class C Boys Basketball school; this will result in 98 schools in Class D Boys Basketball).

The NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Committee is recommending adding the following NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Spectator Regulations to the Handbook.

"Any negative, inappropriate, derogatory comments or actions that brings direct attention to a supervisor or school administrator by a spectator or group of spectators are required to be addressed by the host school, Sectional or NYSPHSAA representative in the following non-sequential order depending on the comments or behavior:

- First warning – Directing the spectator or group of spectators to refrain from any negative comments or actions.
- Second warning – A personal discussion with the spectators or group of spectators on the above NYSPHSAA expectations and reminding the spectators or group of spectators of the next step, removal of the game or event, will be utilized if the behavior continues.
- Removal from the contest – The spectator or group of spectators will be directed to leave the facility for the remainder of the game or event. If spectators or group of spectators refuse to leave the game or event, play will be stopped until they vacate the premise.

Penalty for being removed from a game or event: Any spectator removed from a game or event will have a minimum penalty of completing the NFHS Parent Credential course or a one game suspension before they are allowed to attend any interscholastic event, home or away. Once the course is completed the spectator will provide a certificate of completion to the athletic department office. Schools are required to communicate with the offending spectator on the NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Spectator Expectations.

- Depending on the severity of the behavior/comments or future disqualifications by the offending spectator NYSPHSAA and the Section may get directly involved in the situation.

Note: A school may take any or all these actions during or after an interscholastic contest.

Please let this email serve as Section VI's official request for NYSPHSAA to place our 5 Charter Schools (Health Science, WNY Maritime, Global Concepts, Buffalo Academy of Science, and Tapestry) within one of the 5 leagues. These charter schools have been participating in Section VI since the 2009-10 school year as independents. They have tried to individually get into leagues which has been unsuccessful. SOFTBALL - Request to Extend the Softball State Championships to Two Days

Proposal:

The NYSPHSAA Softball Committee is requesting approval to extend the Softball State Championship to two days starting in Spring 2023.

Effective Start Date:

June 2023

Rationale:

Quality of play and safety are focuses on why this event needs to be extended to two days. Although it is not the same length of a baseball game, high temperatures in June are likely thus creating heat issues for players participating in two games on one day. There have been state tournaments in recent years where the heat and humidity have caused teams with one pitcher to tire much sooner in the second game in addition to position players like catchers risking hydration issues. Additionally, often times games go extra innings in the state tournament due to outstanding pitching, case in point in 2019 when a semifinal game went 19 innings. In 2022, a Class B semifinal went to extra innings and the winning team was scheduled to play immediately after. They were offered a 30-minute break but declined and subsequently were beaten 14-2 in the final.

Although pitch count is not a factor in softball, quality of play is important in the state championship which would be significantly better if teams played one game per day and also enjoyed the experience of a two-day state tournament much like baseball and nearly all other NYSPHSAA team championships.

Transitioning to a 6th classification also prompts softball to explore a two-day event to ease the state tournament schedule. Fields at the current hosting facility are available for more games but the number of games for six classes would go from 15 games to 18 games and its more manageable for a two-day event to play 12 semifinals on day one and 6 finals to be played on day two. Keep in mind, most teams are coming in for a Friday afternoon practice already.

Proposal Originated:

At the June 2020 NYSPHSAA Softball Committee meeting a discussion and straw poll took place.

Budgetary Impact:

There will be a financial impact for schools who would have to travel in one night earlier (Thursday night) however the tournament will start on Friday afternoon of day one so teams would have time to travel in for their games. In 2022, NYSPHSAA began offering optional practices for teams and 19 out of 20 teams opted to use the practice time. NYSPHSAA would also endure only additional expenses (and

revenues) for awards and umpires for a two-day tournament since the Town of Brookhaven (current host) will take on added costs and the section has volunteers to work an extra day. In a two-day format, the finals would be played with two games at a time—10 am, 12 pm, and 2 pm allowing schools to get on the road much sooner than they would in a one-day tournament.

Proposal:

The NYSPHSAA Championship Advisory Committee is seeking approval to change the NYSPHSAA Fees and Policies Document of having 30 officials plus 2 alternates at the same cost of 28 officials and 2 alternates for the NYSPHSAA Wrestling Individual Tournament.

Effective Start Date:

Winter 2022-23 season

Rationale:

During the 2021-22 Individual Wrestling Championship two mats and 70 wrestlers were added to the championship. Those changes resulted in an increase of 136 bouts in the tournament. Both alternate officials were utilized during the tournament for a total of 28 officials. CAC is requesting to add 30 officials and 2 alternates to the NYSPHSAA Fees and Policies Document for the Individual Wrestling tournament. CAC is proposing to have 30 working officials plus 2 alternates at the same cost as 28 working officials and 2 alternates. The current fee for a working official is \$602. The officials have agreed to lower the fee to \$565 per official to have 30 working officials. There would be no increased cost for NYSPHSAA for having 30 working officials as opposed to 28 working officials.

Proposal Originated:

NYSPHSAA Wrestling Committee at the May 2022 meeting

Budgetary Impact:

The proposal will increase the fee by \$565 (due to two ½ fees for alternates).

School Enrollment Numbers and Classification Cut-Off Numbers:

Each October, the NYSPHSAA Executive Committee approves the school enrollment numbers and classification cut-off numbers for non-variation sports (Boys and Girls Soccer, Boys and Girl Basketball, Baseball, Softball). **Note:** Because Girls Volleyball will be using a sixth classification starting with the 2023 Fall season, they need their school enrollment numbers and classification cut-off numbers approved in October 2022.

See attached document for a detailed description of the process used.

*** Dominic Murray Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act:**

The Dominic Murray Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act, Chapter 500 of the Laws of 2021, and Commissioner's regulation §136.9 are effective July 1, 2022. The Act was written to ensure that schools, students, and parents are provided with critical, lifesaving information on sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) risks, signs, and symptoms, to ensure students at risk are evaluated prior to participation in athletics, and that SCA is immediately recognized and treated to prevent death. The Act requires:

- The Commissioner of Health to develop information, in conjunction with the Commissioner of Education, relating to pupils exhibiting signs or symptoms of pending or increased risk of sudden cardiac arrest.
- Directs the Commissioner of Education to post the information on the Department's website.
- All schools must include such information¹ in any permission form, consent form, or similar document that may be required for a student's participation in interscholastic athletics or reference how to obtain such information from the Department and Department of Health's websites, or on the school's website, if one exists.
- The Commissioner of Education to promulgate regulations requiring that any student displaying signs or symptoms of pending or increased risk of sudden cardiac arrest shall be immediately removed from athletic activities, and shall not resume athletic activity until he or she has been evaluated by and received written and signed authorization from a licensed physician; and retain the authorization on file in the student's permanent health record.

EVENTS RISK AND EMERGENCY PLAN

AUGUST 2022

I. Philosophy

Interscholastic athletics is an integral part of the total secondary educational program. Its purpose is to offer educational experiences not otherwise provided in the curriculum which will promote the student athlete's physical, mental, moral, social and emotional well-being.

Interscholastic athletics shall be primarily for the benefit of the students who participate directly or as spectators. The interscholastic athletic program shall exist for the value which it has for students and for the benefit of the sponsoring institutions.

II. Purpose

A. A school's academic program and athletic program need to work together to achieve the overall goals of the education system. The purpose of a school's athletic program is diverse:

1. To subordinate it to the academic program which is the basis and prime reason for establishment of an educational institution;
2. To protect the good name of the school in the community;
3. To promote the principles of good citizenship; and
4. To recognize participation in athletics is a privilege.

III. Objectives

- A. To provide safe athletic events and a meaningful experience for student athletes, coaches and spectators alike.
- B. To prevent a crisis from beginning or escalating.
- C. To focus on risk management and emergency plan for athletic events.

IV. Code of Ethics

A. It is the duty of all concerned with high school athletics:

1. TO EMPHASIZE the proper ideals of sportsmanship, ethical conduct and fair play.
2. TO ELIMINATE all possibilities which tend to destroy the best values of the game.
3. TO STRESS the values derived from playing the game fairly.
4. TO SHOW cordial courtesy to visiting teams and officials.
5. TO ESTABLISH a happy relationship between visitors and hosts.
6. TO RESPECT the integrity and judgment of the sport officials.
7. TO ACHIEVE a thorough understanding and acceptance of the rules of the game and standards of eligibility.
8. TO ENCOURAGE leadership, use of incentive, and good judgment by the players on the team.
9. TO RECOGNIZE that the purpose of athletics is to promote the physical, mental, moral, social, and emotional well-being of the individual players.
10. TO REMEMBER that an athletic contest is only a game...not a matter of life or death for player, coach, school, official, fan, community, state or nation.

V. Strategies

As a course of action, the Safety Committee has developed the following steps:

- A. Clarify chaperones' duties and expectations with regard to crowd control.
- B. Clarify police involvement at event OCIAA Championships.
- C. Construct an event checklist so as to identify potential risks and to note coverage areas.
- D. Share this developed plan and review it annually during the scheduled September Athletic Directors Workshop.

- E. Share information and review procedures annually for NYSPHSAA Thunder and Lightning Policy during the first Athletic Directors Workshop held each school year. (attached).
- F. Share the Public Access Defibrillator (PAD) program and review it annually during the scheduled September Athletic Directors Workshop.
- G. Pursuant to the Commissioner of Education and Education Law (section 136.4) regarding the requirement for AED's in Public Schools it is required that:
 - 1. Whenever an instructional school facility is used for a school sponsored or school approved curricular or extracurricular event or activity, the public school officials and administrators responsible for such facility ensure the presence of at least one staff person who is trained, pursuant to Public Health Law section 3000-b (3)(a), in the operation and use of automated external defibrillator.
 - 2. During any school-sponsored athletic contest or school-sponsored competitive athletic event held at any location, the host school shall ensure that automated external defibrillator equipment is provided on-site and that at least one staff person who is trained, pursuant to Public Health Law section 3000-b (3)(a), in its use is present during such contest or event. If an event is sponsored by the OCIAA (League Championships, multi-school events held at a neutral site, etc.), the ROIA will ensure that an automated external defibrillator is provided on-site.

VI. Guidelines

The OCIAA provides the following general guidelines for crowd control at hosted events.

A. Precrisis Indicators

- 1. Unusual movement is noted as:
 - a. Athletic teams or groups not moving together;
 - b. Groups of students not in their territory;
 - c. Absence of groups not in their territory; and
 - d. Sudden clustering of students.
- 2. Student attendance can point to a potential problem:
 - a. By those students who most likely would not attend; and
 - b. By those students who have been suspended.
- 3. Warning signs are suggested when:
 - a. Graffiti is increased;
 - b. Students carry items into events;
 - c. Nonprofessional staff mention hearsay; and
 - d. Rumors are not dealt with as if they are true.

B. Chaperone and/or Crowd Control Duties

- 1. To maintain a high level of conduct by:

- a. Being courteous;
 - b. Not running to the scene of action;
 - c. Dealing with a threat as an act of violence; and
 - d. Following the chain of command.
2. To remain highly visible by:
 - a. Wearing arm bands or other identifiers;
 - b. Assisting in finding rest rooms, seats or concessions;
 - c. Enforcing event rules about spectator behavior;
 - d. Removing unruly students or spectators; and
 - e. Being able to identify associated event personnel.
 3. To keep moving by:
 - a. Not viewing or taking an active role in the athletic event;
 - b. Asking spectators to move into assigned seating areas; and
 - c. Asking spectators to not to loiter in exit or fire lanes.

C. Police

1. Police are essential in championship events, because they:
 - a. Add to the decorum of the contest;
 - b. Help with spectator ejection or removal;
 - c. Aid in traffic control; and
 - d. Provide a safe atmosphere.
2. Techniques that police bring to events are:
 - a. The diffusion of large crowds;
 - b. The diffusion of a possible situation;
 - c. When to call for help; and
 - d. Hands on to help.

D. Activating Event Safety Plan

1. Designate a site administrator or event manager. Persons authorized to take actions are chaperones, coaches and school administrators. Person in charge shall notify or direct notification as needed:
 - a. Emergency providers – police, ambulance, fire, poison ctr.
 - b. Superintendent of Schools
 - c. Building Administrator, Athletic Administrator
 - d. Site chaperones
2. Response to medical emergency will follow a sequence of steps:
 - a. Assess the injury. If life threatening to player, cancel the game;
 - b. Send contact person to activate emergency medical response personnel. If injured party is a minor, call parents;
 - c. Administer first aid. Prepare to transport to medial facility; and
 - d. Complete an injury report.
3. Response to a crowd control incident will use a four layer approach that is:
 - a. Prevent any incident from escalating;

- b. Keep crowd back;
 - c. Witness and document incident; and
 - d. Remain in the area until all is clear
4. Sequential responses will include:
- a. Monitoring of weather stations and/or scanners.
 - b. Event evacuation or cancellation instructions told during prevent announcement. Potential causes are: severe weather, fire, bomb threat, and sustained power outage.
 - c. Event rules that serve notice to no alcohol, no smoking and improper spectator behaviors and consequences told also during prevent announcement.
5. Individuals designated as site administrator, event manager, chaperone, coach or other trained individual whom has been trained in the use of AED units should:
- a. Immediately check the scene for safety, then verify sudden cardiac arrest;
 - b. Perform proper steps according to training;
 - c. Allow AED unit to analyze and determine if shock is advised;
 - d. If shock needed perform as instructed and trained;
 - e. If NO shock is advised begin CPR training skills and procedures;
 - f. Follow Post – Use Procedures.

E. Chain of Command

1. The chain of command at athletic events is defined as:
- a. OCIAA Sport Chairs or their designees;
 - b. OCIAA Athletic Coordinator;
 - c. Host site Athletic Directors or their designees;
 - g. Sponsoring Coach;
 - h. Security Personnel.

VII. Checklist of Event Risks

A. This checklist of event risks is used to pragmatically prepare for interscholastic athletic events and/or championships:

- _____ 1. Proper supervision in all areas is used
- _____ 2. Plan for the occurrence of bad weather
- _____ 3. Prevent inspection of playing and spectator access areas
- _____ 4. Facility maintenance
- _____ 5. Event announcement which covers rules and evacuation routes
- _____ 6. Injury reporting forms on hand

- _____ 7. Medical personnel and supplies arranged
- _____ 8. Officials, scorekeepers, timers and announcer in place
- _____ 9. Forms completed: insurance, pay vouchers, etc.
- _____ 10. Public address system and/or megaphones available to warn
- _____ 11. Telephone and/or cell phone available
- _____ 12. Ancillary help duties are defined for: ticket takers, custodial, etc.

VIII. The following is the recommended OCIAA Medical Emergency Action Plan for OCIAA contests and schools in which a certified approved athletic trainer is assigned. In addition, guidelines for responsibilities of an emergency care team are recommended in situations when a doctor or ambulance is not present.

Responsibilities of Emergency Care Team:

❖ Athletic Trainer:

- 1. Coordinates care
- 2. Assist injury/illness
- 3. Provide initial first aid care if necessary
- 4. Activate EMS *911* when necessary
- 5. Release student athlete to EMS if necessary for transport
- 6. Complete necessary accident reports

❖ Head Coach/Assistant Coach:

- 1. Send team members to assigned benches
- 2. Provide emergency medical/contact card to athletic trainer
- 3. Contact parent/guardian
- 4. Complete necessary accident report forms
- 5. Contact athletic director

❖ Security Staff:

- 1. Scene control (limit injury scene to first aid providers and move bystanders away from area)
- 2. Go to designated location to flag down emergency vehicle
- 3. Have keys to gate/doors for emergency vehicle access
- 4. Direct EMS/vehicle to injury site
- 5. Complete necessary accident report forms

A. Emergency Personnel:

Certified athletic trainer and student athletic trainers on site for practice and competitive events.

B. First Aid Equipment:

1. All interscholastic sports teams are provided with first aid kits, ice packs and CPR masks.
2. Athletic trainer has medical kit, AED, oxygen, vacuum splints, backboard, and cervical collars.

C. Communication:

1. All interscholastic sports teams have a two-way radio to communicate with athletic trainer.
2. All interscholastic sports teams have the athletic trainer's cell phone number.

D. Appropriate Medical Forms:

1. Accident reports to be completed after incident occurs.
2. Emergency Medical/Contact Information to be completed for every student athlete and given to athletic trainer.

OCIAA Sport Chairperson Responsibilities

1. Keep current on any rule changes for all levels of the sport, or any issues that coaches may be facing. Communicate with Athletic Coordinator and Athletic Directors any rules changes that you encounter. Communicate with the Section IX Chairpeople and let them know you are the OCIAA chair and to please send any pertinent information to you.
2. **MUST** Attend Rules Interpretation meetings
3. Facilitate Rules Meeting – Introduce official’s rules interpreter and Section Chairperson if available.
4. Break off Modified coaches and go over any new rules or talk about challenges or issues that modified coaches may face.
5. Be prepared to go over sectional tournament information if Sectional chair is not present.
6. Work with Section chair people as the OCIAA Liaison and assist at seeding meetings if needed.
7. In sports where we run an OCIAA Championship, Chairperson is expected to be present at the event, coordinate the event including running the coaches meeting prior to the event, and communicate with the Regional Office regarding number of medals and/or plaques or any other assistance that is needed.





HEAT INDEX PROCEDURES

Administration of Heat Index Procedures:

- Feels Like Temperature (Heat index) or THI using a Wet Bulb indicator on the field will be checked 1 hour before the contest/practice by a certified athletic trainer, athletic director, or school designee when the air temperature is 80 degrees (Fahrenheit) or higher.
- Download WeatherBug app to your phone or log into www.weatherbug.com. Schools may also use a Wet Bulb indicator on the field that will be used.
- Enter zip code or city and state in the location section of the app or on-line or determine the THI by using a Wet Bulb indicator.
- If the Feels Like temperature (heat index) or the Wet Bulb Indicator is 90 degrees or above, the athletic trainer, athletic director, or school designee must re-check the Feels Like temperature (heat index) or Wet Bulb indicator at halftime or midway point of the contest. If the Feels Like temperature (heat index) or Wet Bulb indicator is 96 degrees (Fahrenheit) or more, the contest will be suspended.

Please refer to the following chart to take the appropriate actions:

NYSPHSAA
THUNDER & LIGHTNING POLICY

(Effective 10/25/04)
(Revised October 20, 2008)

Applies to regular season through NYSPHSAA Finals:

1) Thunder and lightning necessitates that contests be suspended. The occurrence of thunder and/or lightning is not subject to interpretation or discussion - thunder is thunder, lightning is lightning.

a) With your site administrator, set up a plan for shelter prior to the start of any contest.

2) When thunder is heard and/or when lightning is seen, the following procedures should be adhered to:

a) Suspend play and direct participants to go to shelter, a building normally occupied by the public or if a building is unavailable, participants should go inside a vehicle with a solid metal top (e.g. bus, van, car).

b) Do not permit people to stand under or near a tree; and have all stay away from poles, antennas, towers and underground watering systems.

c) After thunder and/or lightning have left the area, wait 30 minutes after the last boom is heard or strike is seen before resuming play or competition.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR THE MODIFIED PROGRAM

Situations not covered by the following specified modified rules shall be governed by the Eligibility Standards of the New York State Public High School Athletic Association, Inc.

6. EXTENDED PLAYING TIME: Eligibility for play in an extended playing time should be determined on the basis of the following participation standards:

a) Players with no participation in the regular game/contest should be eligible for play in an extended playing time.

b) Players whose participation in the regular contest is limited, i.e., their total participation was no more than one-half of the regular playing periods/quarters shall also be eligible for play in an extended playing time.

c) Limited participation shall be further defined to mean that entry into a playing period rather than actual playing time shall constitute "participation" in the regulation contest.

Optional Plan for use at the league or Section level: If a team has fewer than the minimum number of players to play the five (5) period concept the following game rules will apply:

A four (4) quarter game will be played with the number of minutes being increased for each quarter (see chart below); however, no player may play more than three (3) quarters (*see exceptions below). This will apply provided the team has a sufficient number of players so as not to exceed the NYSPHSAA regulated playing time allocation for each sport (see chart below).
