Subject: Updated Information Regarding Mixed Competition in Athletics

It has come to the attention of the Department that the 2015 Mixed Competition in Athletics Guidelines contained inaccurate representations of requirements for eligibility for Mixed Competition. Therefore, the Department has rescinded the 2015 Guidance and removed it from the website. It is the Department's expectation that all students have the same requirements when trying out for or participating in an interschool athletic team. Public schools may not permit students to be excluded from participating on a sports team on the basis of gender or sex.

The following are the requirements for any student to try out for an interscholastic athletic team:

- Signed parent/guardian consent
- A current health examination (New York State School Health Examination Form)
- A completed and signed Interval Health History Form (nysed.gov) if the health examination was not completed within 30 days of the start of the season; 1 and
- Clearance from the director of school health services (a.k.a. medical director) for the student to participate in athletics.

This information should be available to the school well before athletic tryouts. As such, the review panel required by 8 NYCRR 135.4 (c) (2) must make its determination as noted in the following paragraph, prior to tryouts so that student athletes do not miss practices or games.

For students who wish to participate in baseball, basketball, boxing, field hockey, football, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, softball, speedball, team handball, power volleyball (where the height of the net is set at less than eight feet), and wrestling; in addition to the district medical director, the student's PE teacher and the school principal must confirm the student meets the same school policy prerequisites required for all students' participation in interscholastic sports.

Note: Tanner staging, a medical evaluation of secondary sex characteristics used to assess developmental stage, should no longer be conducted on students wishing to participate in mixed competition. Tanner staging is recommended, but not required, only as part of the Athletic Placement Process for students in grades 7 or 8 desiring to play at the high school level, or for high school students desiring to play at the modified level.

The New York State Education Department (NYSED) provided updated information on December 1, 2022 pertaining to mixed competition participation (see attached NYSED memo).

Following a meeting with NYSED staff, I want to clarify that the update only removes previous "guidance" related to mixed competition participation and does not revise Regulation 135.4 (Physical Education). Therefore, the physical fitness test, the approval chart, and the tanner score/ maturation levels are to no longer be used for mixed competition determinations.

It is important to emphasize, <u>no portion of Regulation 135.4 (Physical Education) has been revised nor amended</u> and continues to include the following:

- "(c) Male and female pupils on interschool athletic teams and inclusive athletic activities."
 - (1) Equal opportunity to participate in interschool competition, and inclusive athletic activities, either on separate teams or in mixed competition on the same team, shall be provided to male and female students, except as hereinafter provided. In schools that do not provide separate competition for male and female students in a specific sport, no student shall be excluded from such competition solely by reason of sex, except in accordance with the provisions of subclauses (2) and (4) of this clause. For the purposes of this clause, baseball and softball shall be considered to constitute a single sport.
 - (2) In the sports of baseball, basketball, boxing, field hockey, football, ice hockey, lacrosse, rugby, soccer, softball, speedball, team handball, power volleyball where the height of the net is set at less than eight feet, and wrestling, the fitness of a given student to participate in mixed competition shall be determined by a review panel consisting of the school physician, a physical education teacher designated by the principal of the school, and if requested by the parents of the pupil, a physician selected by such parents. Such panel shall make its determination by majority vote of the members, and in accordance with standards and criteria issued by the department.
 - (3) Where a school provides separate competition for male and female pupils in interschool athletic competition or inclusive athletic activities in a specific sport, the superintendent of schools, or in the case of a nonpublic school or school system which elects to be governed by this clause, the chief executive officer of the school or school system, may permit a female or females to participate on a team organized for males. However, where separate competition is provided, males may not participate on teams organized for females.



(4) Where a school does not provide separate competition for male and female pupils in interschool athletic competition or inclusive athletic activities in a specific sport, the superintendent of schools, or in the case of a nonpublic school or school system which elects to be governed by this clause, the chief executive officer of the school or school system, or the section may decline to permit a male or males to participate on a team organized for females upon a finding that such participation would have a significant adverse effect upon the opportunity of females to participate successfully in interschool competition or inclusive athletic activities in that sport."

NYSED has indicated a review committee would be created to discuss and explore new guidance for mixed competition participation. NYSPHSAA staff has been invited to participate on committees associated with future discussions. I will certainly update the membership with any additional information pertaining to this topic.

Proposal

The NYSPHSAA Football Committee is seeking approval of an amendment to the Combined Practice guidelines for 11-man football.

Effective Start Date

August 19, 2023

Rationale

In 2019 the NYSPHSAA Football State Committee established guidelines for interschool practices. Five items make up the framework of these guidelines. Items d) and e) are being proposed to be revised.

CURRENT GUIDELINES:

- a) Coaches are to instruct their own players.
- b) "Full Live" contact is permitted but not required.
- c) Athletes/Teams may not participate in a combined practice unless they previously completed five (5) days of practice.
- d) While working on team situational aspects, drills may not exceed seven (7) players from either team. This will allow for teams to conduct a 7 v 7 period for skill positions or it may be designed to focus on an inside run package to emphasize offensive/defensive line play.
- e) Schools using more than seven (7) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule.

PROPOSED CHANGES:

- d) While working on team situational aspects, drills may not exceed a maximum of nine (9) players from either team. This will allow for teams to conduct a 9 v 9 period for skill positions or it may be designed to focus on an inside run package to emphasize offensive/defensive line play.
- ** 8-Man Football teams will only be allowed a maximum of seven (7) players from either team.
- e) 11-Man teams using more than nine (9) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule. 8-Man teams using more than seven (7) players in a team drill will be in violation of this rule.

The rationale for the request centers on allowing teams to work on inside run play with a full line. Currently, with the 7 v7 rule in place, a team that uses a tight end with two running backs can't run full line drills. They would need to use 5 linemen plus the tight end and quarterback and they are already at the maximum of 7 without counting the running backs. As a result, teams are forced to go half line and not incorporate any backside linemen. Most teams utilize pulling lineman from the back side when

executing inside run play. If the rule is modified to read a maximum of 9 players, teams could use 5 linemen, a tight end, and 2 running backs to get a true evaluation and a more productive drill.

When the state committee established these guidelines, the 7 v 7 rule was put in for two reasons:

- 1. There needed to be a clear distinction that these drills were not actually scrimmages with 11 on 11 so the decision was made to max out at 7 v 7 so it would be clear to all, it was not an 11 on 11 full team scrimmage. We believe modifying this rule will still accomplishes that same premise while allowing for a more productive teaching period for athletes. Anyone viewing this period will still note the offense has no wide receivers and the defense has no defensive backs. It will still be evident to all that this is not an 11 on 11 situation.
 - 2. If more than 7 v 7 was permitted, 8-Man teams would have a full line-up thus making it a scrimmage. With that, we would only be asking for this modification be implemented for 11-Man football.

It should also be noted the original decision to max at $7 \, v \, 7$ had nothing to do with safety. As mentioned, it was simply put in so there was a distinction between the combined practice and a scrimmage. This change would still honor that premise.

Rationale: Due to Girls Flag Football meeting the criteria of six sections with four or more programs, a state championship may be established per the NYSPHSAA Championship Philosophy.
Proposal Originated: The NYSPHSAA Girls Flag Football Committee met for the first time on September 14, 2022.
Budget Impact: There will be travel expenses for schools to send a flag football team to a state championship in addition to NYSPHSAA incurring expenses to rent a venue, pay for officials and awards, travel, and also pay for other associated state tournament expenses. Additionally, schools/sections/NYSPHSAA will generate revenue from admissions at local games, Section tournaments and the State Tournament to help offset budgets.
