#### Proposal:

The NYSPHSAA Boys Volleyball Committee is seeking approval to revise the state tournament format to include all sections in the state tournament and increase the length of competition to two days.

#### Effective Start Date:

Action Item

Fall 2025 Season

#### Rationale:

Our aim is to provide a state tournament that showcases the highest quality in the state of New York while also growing the sport and base across the state. Each section would have a representative showcasing their champion on the state tournament stage.

- All 7 sections would participate with a rotating at-large bid that will equally rotate around each section
  until all sections are included. This would include two representatives for the Division 1 and Division 2
  pools that would fall in accordance with the rotating bid. This will also allow us to have two four-team
  pools for round robin tournament play totaling 16 teams in the tournament.
- The at-large representative will be placed in an opposing pool from their section.
- Sections will be spaced out appropriately over a seven-year plan to take into account each rotation of the at-large bid.
- This proposal will also eliminate the need for a regional tournament and save sections on expenses and the need to find facilities. All sections will conduct their sectional contests and as the bid rotates to each section the sectional runner up will become the candidate for the respective at-large bid.
- This proposal will also be in these phases during the bid process and will need to take into account a three-court facility that can house the needs of the new format.
- This proposal will put the two divisions into a morning and afternoon wave for pool play.
- The second day of the tournament will go into semifinal play with a 3 out of 5 standard system of play.
- The final phase of the tournament on the second day will be the final results of the top two pool play winners advancing to a semifinal game and onto the finals.

#### Items to consider:

- Length of season with regional week eliminated.
- More time to complete sectional tournaments to avoid conflicts with officials.
- Three court facility to accommodate state tournament.
- Cost for two-day state tournament.
- All sections incurring expenses to send sectional champion to NYSPHSAA tournament.

#### Proposal Originated:

NYSPHSAA Boys Volleyball Committee on March 22, 2023

#### **Budgetary Impact:**

The change in format will result in more games being played at the State Tournament over the span of two days. This will mean NYSPHSAA will incur additional costs for facility rental, staff and officials. However, attendance will increase and thus offset costs or create a profit.

The elimination of regional games will result in no expenses and revenue for host sections as well as no travel expenses or logistical planning of sending a team to compete in Regionals outside their section. Sections will also eliminate having to secure host facilities and hiring staff to run an event.

#### Notes:

The NYSPHSAA Boys Volleyball Committee voted 4-0 in support of this proposal (Sections 1, 3, 5, 11). Format needs to be completed and scheduled to start 2025-2031.

#### Proposal:

The Boys and Girls Indoor Committees are seeking approval to add a second division for the  $4 \times 200$ ,  $4 \times 400$  and  $4 \times 800$  relays at the State Championships. This proposal does not apply to the Intersectional Relay.

#### **Effective Start Date:**

Winter 2024-25

#### Rationale:

Our committee discussed the difficulty of schools that would be considered Division 2 by enrollment numbers (under 600 students) to have a relay team qualify for the State meet due to the Indoor Track and Field State Championships utilizing only one division. The Committee felt strongly that Track and Field is an individual sport and would like to remain one division for individual events, but felt that relay events requiring more individuals is more difficult with less student athletes to draw from. Our committee brought this idea back to their Sections and the response from the Sections was overwhelmingly in favor.

#### Proposal Originated:

Boys and Girls Indoor Track Committees at their June 14, 2023 meeting

#### **Budgetary Impact:**

Sections will have an increased cost including transportation, lodging and meals for additional athletes (6 additional relay teams-3 Girls, 3 Boys). NYSPHSAA may have additional facility rental costs depending on how much additional time is needed in the venue to conduct Division 2 relays. NYSPHSAA will also incur an additional cost for awards and champion t-shirts for the Division 2 relay winners.

#### Notes:

The Girls and Boys Committee voted in favor of this proposal at its August 29, 2023 meeting. The Girls Committee was in favor by a 7-1 vote and the Boys Committee was in favor by a 6-1 vote. Of note, both "No" votes were based on concerns of limited facilities in their respective Section.

### Boys Lacrosse: Permission to Ask NFHS for a Shot Clock Experiment

Proposal: The Boys Lacrosse Committee is recommending receiving permission to ask the NFHS for an experimen
to use a shot clock in the 2025 and 2026 Lacrosse season. The attached document covers what would be included in the request to the NFHS.
Effective Start Date: 2025 season
Rationale: Increase the pace of play; remove discretion from the stalling rule thereby helping officials to be more consistent; and increase safety during the last two minutes of the game by not requiring the winning team to play within the restricted space of the goal area.
Proposal Originated: Boys Lacrosse Committee
Budgetary Impact: Cost of Shot Clock
Notes:  The Girl's Lacrosse Committee is also interested in asking for an experiment to the NFHS. They will be meeting in December and may request to be part of this experiment. The details of their experiment.

#### NFHS Shot Clock Experiment:

Once the ball has been advanced into the offensive goal "box "area with possession, a 60 second shot clock will be started. Rules that will apply to advancing the ball into the attack box within 10 seconds will include:

- a. After crossing the center with possession.
- b. After initially gaining possession in the offensive half of the field.
- c. After regaining possession in the offensive half of the field following a defensive possession

Note: The 10 second count will be conducted as currently managed by the officials.

The over and back rule will apply once the offensive team has gained possession in the attack area box and the shot clock has started.

#### Shot Clock Reset

- a. After regaining possession in the offensive half of the field following a defensive possession.
- b. After a valid shot is taken and possession is regained by the offensive team. **Note:** a valid shot is a shot that is taken above the GLE, hits the goalie or goal pipes. Reset and hold till possession has been declared and official signals (twirls)
- c. After a loose ball play-on situation and the offensive team regains possession. Reset and hold till possession is gained and official signals (twirls)
- d. After adjudication of a defensive foul.

**Note:** Officials will signal the shot clock start or reset with one hand raised in a twirling motion. Reset clock operator should not reset the clock if a player does not have clear possession or if the officials have not reset the shot clock.

Team Time outs: If either team calls a time out, the shot clock will continue from the point of the time out.

#### Shot Clock Stop and Hold:

- a. A ball goes out of bounds.
- b. An injury or equipment problem.

#### Proposal:

The NYSPHSAA Boys and Girls Outdoor Track Committees are seeking approval to establish a third class starting in 2025.

#### Effective Start Date:

Spring 2025

#### Rationale:

Currently, the number of athletes participating in the State Championship is approximately 3.8% of the total outdoor track athletes in New York State. The addition of a third division would bring the participating number of athletes to 5-6% (approximately 500 more athletes), which falls within the numbers the Championship Philosophy has established.

#### Proposal Originated:

NYSPHSAA Boys/Girls Outdoor Track Committee meeting in the Fall of 2022

#### **Budgetary Impact:**

The change in format will result in more athletes at the NYSPHSAA State Championship which will mean an increase in cost of awards, rental of venue, lodging, officials, staff and other areas related to increasing the size of the event. Gate receipts with added athletes at Sectional and State Tournaments will result in offsetting the costs or generating a profit.

#### Notes:

Both the Boys and Girls Outdoor Track Committees voted unanimously in favor of this proposal at its June 8, 2023 meeting.

Proposal was not discussed or voted on at the Sept 27<sup>th</sup> CAC meeting. Following the meeting, some CAC members provided feedback on this proposal which included support of the proposal, concern of the added costs, and concern of having a large enough venue for states.

The following increase of NYSPHSAA membership dues will be included within the NYSPHSAA Budget to be voted on at the May Executive Committee meeting.

\$1050 + \$1/student over 300 This represents a \$50 increase of the base fee

Additionally, the base fee of NYSPHSAA membership dues will increase \$50 annually beginning in the 2024-2025 school year. The Executive Committee expressed interest in incorporating structural growth of membership dues within the association's budget structure. Schools can now budget a \$50 annual increase. The \$50 annual increase will be included within the NYSPHSAA Budget, which will be voted on at the May Executive Committee meetings. A sample schedule increase is below. The increase will continue until the Budget/Audit Committee proposes a revision based upon membership feedback and input.

### **Spectator Policy at Athletic Contests:**

- 1. Expectation Statement: Officials, just like student athletes and coaches, are critical to interscholastic sports programs. Without officials, NYSPHSAA and its member schools would not be able to provide interscholastic sports in the manner that is desired and expected by student athletes, coaches, and parents. Spectators are expected to "Be Loud, Be Proud, and Be Positive." Negative comments and inappropriate behaviors by spectators are required to be addressed by all and any school supervisors and administrators, as a member of NYSPHSAA. Spectators may be prohibited from attending current and future interscholastic contests based on their behavior. (Oct. 2022)
- **2. Spectator Regulation:** Any negative, inappropriate, derogatory comments or actions that draw the direct attention of a supervisor or school administrator by a spectator or group of spectators are required to be addressed by the host school, Sectional or NYSPHSAA representative in the following non-sequential order depending on the comments or behavior:
  - First warning Directing the spectator or group of spectators to refrain from any negative comments or actions.
  - Second warning A personal discussion with the spectators or group of spectators on the above NYSPHSAA expectations and reminding the spectators or group of spectators of the next step, removal of the game or event, will be utilized if the behavior continues.
  - Removal from the contest The spectator or group of spectators will be directed to leave the facility for the remainder of the game or event. If spectators or group of spectators refuse to leave the game or event, play will be stopped until they vacate the premise.

### Penalty for being removed from a game or event:

Any spectator removed from a game or event will have a minimum penalty of completing the NFHS Parent Credential course or a one game suspension before they are allowed to attend any interscholastic event. Once the course is completed the spectator will provide a certificate of completion to the athletic department office. Schools are required to communicate with the offending spectator on the NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Spectator Expectations.

• Depending on the severity of the behavior/comments or future disqualifications by the offending spectator NYSPHSAA and the Section may get directly involved in the situation. (May 2023)
