

### 8TH GRADERS




- You do not have to use 8th graders
  - This is a school choice, not a requirement
- Think through the pros and cons
  - Prepare your community
  - Prepare for the kid(s) who gets displaced

#### WHEN CAN I USE 8TH GRADERS?

For use by 1B,2B,1A Athletic Directors

18 schools can utilize 8th graders in any sport at any time



### **EJECTIONS**



- Numbers continue to be high
- 2024-25 all ejections will be a one game suspension; however, schools can be more restrictive and institute additional games as warranted.
- Data is still being collected based on the camera trial, but thus far, games where a camera was in use, ejections reduced significantly.
- Please remind your coaches, players, and parents of the appropriate means to cheer and that ONLY a head coach has the authority to speak to an official.

THE COMMITTEE WAS FORMED THROUGH COLLABORATION **AMONG ATHLETIC DIRECTORS** REPRESENTING DIFFERENT WIAA DISTRICTS.

AS OF 2024, IT'S OFFICIALLY CHARTERED IN THE WIAA CONSTITUTION, SERVING AS AN **ADVISOR TO THE** EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR,

THE COMMITTEE PROVIDES A BIPOC PERSPECTIVE AND POLICY RECOMMENDATIONS, WITH A **FOCUS ON BIPOC REPRESENTATION** IN LEADERSHIP AT THE STATE AND DISTRICT LEVELS.
