REFERRAL **PROCESS**

- 1. School districts should be working closely with the Imprints Coordinator to determine a plan of action.
- 2. Coordinator should observe student, if possible, at the home school.
- 3. Referral needs to be completed and sent to River Bend Imprints Program.
- 4.IEP Team meeting to change placement to Imprints.

Students are engaged in ongoing skills training. Each classroom establishes the rewards that can be purchased with points.



BOY'S TOWN APPROACH

Boy's Town is a comprehensive social skills curriculum and multitiered motivation system to create- and sustain- an orderly, inclusive learning environment.



TRANSPORTATION

Transportation is provided by the student's' home school district.
The River Bend staff work closely with the bus lines to help with transportation issues.



LEVELING UP

Purchasing bonds allows students to earn their way up in the levels. Each step up comes with more personal responsibility and less oversite.



EDUCATION



Instruction

Academic instruction is presented with a curriculum that is based on the student's individual needs. Instruction may be presented in small groups, in 1:1 settings, or independently.

Grade Levels

Students in grades K-12 are eligible for the program. There are 2 elementary classrooms, 2 middle school classrooms, and 2 high school classrooms. The middle and high school students have a six period day and rotate between subject area teachers.
