The Minnesota Association of Townships (MAT) is proud to announce its 2025 Scholarship Program, which awards up to five \$2,000 scholarships to high school juniors. All students currently enrolled in the 11th grade and attending a sandy.hooker@mntownships.org Minnesota public, private, or parochial high school, or a home-study program, are eligible for this program. Participants will submit a written essay on the topic of the role of townships in local government.

> Applications for the scholarships must be submitted by June 1, 2025. Winners will be chosen and notified in **September** and invited to attend the Awards portion of our Annual Conference in St. Cloud, Minnesota in early December 2025.

MAT is a nonprofit corporation representing Minnesota townships and its 9,000 plus officers. Townships embody the values of "grassroots government." MAT's specific purposes are educational and charitable: educating the public about the heritage and future of township government and its role in state government, and providing townships and their officers with a single, unified voice, as well as access to educational programs and research-based materials to help foster the delivery of efficient, effective, and economical township government.

MINNESOTA ASSOCIATION OF TOWNSHIPS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



The Minnesota Association of Townships (MAT) is awarding \$2,000 scholarships to up to five juniors currently attending a Minnesota public, private, or parochial high school, or a home study program, that plan to further their education at a college, university, or vocational school.

Applicants must complete an application form and submit it along with a written essay using critical thinking discussing this year's topic on Promoting Township Government. The question is:

Fire protection is an important part of public safety that is provided by townships all across Minnesota. There are different ways that fire protection can be provided. What are the different ways fire protection is provided by townships? How is the cost of fire protection funded by a township and at what meeting is the extent of that cost approved? What challenges are faced by rural fire departments in providing fire protection?

Essays must be between 450 and 500 words, typed and double spaced.

- Applicants should not name themselves, their school, their town or city, or their local officials in or on the essay.
- Each essay will be judged by an independent panel based upon originality, knowledge of subject matter, and supporting statements, as well as correct spelling and punctuation.
- Applicants must be a high school junior to apply.

Along with the completed application and written essay, students must submit:

- A current high school transcript
- A letter of recommendation from a high school teacher or counselor
- All items must be submitted in one envelope postmarked by June 1, 2025, and mailed to:

Incomplete applications or applications postmarked after June 1st, will not be accepted.

Winners will be notified in writing in September 2025 and will be invited to attend the MAT annual conference in December 2025 in St. Cloud, MN. Scholarship awards will be paid to the appropriate financial aid office upon receipt of verification of enrollment at a college, university, or technical school.
