SPECIAL SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES Monday, April 6, 2009

The Board of Education of Independent School District #299, Caledonia, Minnesota, met in a special school board meeting in the Caledonia Area Elementary Media Center.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Naomi Fruechte at 7:00 p.m. Members present were Naomi Fruechte, Matt Hendel, John Klug, Jean Meyer, Michelle Werner, Charlie Wray arriving at 7:45 p.m., and Spencer Yohe. Also present were Superintendent Michael Moriarty, Nancy Runningen arriving at 7:35 p.m., and Connie Hesse. Others present were Karen Schiltz, Barb Meyer, Chuck Schulte, Dave Klinski, and Kim Kranz.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Moved by Jean Meyer, seconded by Spencer Yohe to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried by a unanimous vote.

TOPICS TO BE ADDRESSED

The board had a working session to discuss options for the replacement of the middle school/high school principal position and the pro's and con's of each of the options presented.

Option #1:

Replace the current MSHS Principal, who is retiring, and keep the Elementary Principal/Testing Coordinator/title Program Director position as it currently is operating. Keep the superintendent position as is until the board has the opportunity after next year to hire someone to fill a newly created combined position if that is what is deemed appropriate at that time.

Pro's:

- A principal in both buildings
- Job responsibilities defined
- Status quo
- Adequately managing student issues and problems arising
- Do not have to renegotiate a contract
- Strong principal if we want to move to a multi-district superintendent

Con's:

- Declining enrollment/declining needs
- Decrease staff size
- Resources are fewer
- Put dollars in the classroom

Option 1A: After one year, hire a superintendent on a part-time basis

Option #2:

Assign the current elementary principal to the MSHS principal position. Hire a Dean of Students to work with student in both buildings. Add a part-time position to take over the role of Testing Coordinator/Title Program Director, and keep the Superintendent position as is until the Board has the opportunity, after next year, to hire someone to fill a newly created combination position if that is what is

deemed appropriate at that time.

Pro's:

- Duties more clearly spelled out
- More flexibility

Con's:

- March 1st deadline to reassign duties
- Moving a successful principal to questionable ground
- Most expensive option
- More dramatic change in operations
- Too many unknowns

Option #3:

Assign the current elementary principal to the MSHS position. Hire a Dean of Students who will also be the Testing Coordinator/Title Program Director. Assign the elementary principal duties to the superintendent until the district has the opportunity to post the new combined position and hire someone.

Pro's:

- Save approximately \$17,800 over Option #1
- Dean of Students help with student management

<u>Con's:</u>

- Renegotiate contract
- Dean of Students cannot evaluate teachers
- Dean of Students cannot suspend students without proper licensure
- Dean of Students not as effective to go to court
- Pay extra money for hours outside school day
- Superintendent out of district so Dean of Students would have to be available for a need that may arise
- Moving a successful principal to questionable ground
- Several new administrators in the district at the same time

Option #4:

Move as many grade levels as possible to the new MSHS building and keep the current elementary building as a

pre-school to first or second grade learning center and the district offices.

Pro's:

- More students under the principal more of the time
- Save \$17,800 over Option #1 and possibly save some on benefits

Con's:

- Lack of public support for elementary students in one building
- Not saving a lot of money for the uncertainty of the change
- Having younger and older students together in one building
- Playground equipment/facility modifications

Option #5:

Negotiate contracts to reduce costs

Option #6:

Reduce elementary principal contract to 0.50
