West Lyon Scholarship Bulletin #1 September 24, 2022

Each year seniors seem to be very interested in the scholarships available to them as they prepare financially for further education. From time to time new scholarships will come across the counselor's desk. To inform students and parents of these scholarship opportunities and deadlines, a scholarship bulletin will be typed up each month in the brief summarized format you see here. This bulletin will be posted on the West Lyon website at www.wlwildcats.org in the Counselor section under the High School tab. Complete information on each scholarship will be kept in 3 ring binders in the counselor's office. Parents and students are welcome to stop in at any time to check this information out. Updated scholarship bulletins should be available each month around the 25th of the month.

Also, over the last couple of years with the ease of electronic communication for schools, businesses, etc., we as counselors have started to receive more and more emails informing us of scholarship opportunities for our students. Managing all of these sources of scholarship information and passing them on to interested students and parents has become a challenging process for us as area counselors. Not all of these emails Miss Mulder receives will be in the monthly scholarship bulletin, therefore if you as senior or senior parent would like to be informed of those email scholarship descriptions, email Miss Mulder and ask to be included in a "senior scholarship group list" that will be used to forward those emails on to you who are interested.

And finally, October 1 is the opening date for this year's high school seniors to be able to start filling out FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) for financial aid to attend college in fall of 2022. In lowa we have the benefit of having an ICAN office that can assist families with completing the FAFSA. Through the FAFSA Ready lowa, ICAN coordinates FAFSA completion events and services across lowa. Events are provided through partnerships with school districts, community-based nonprofit organizations, colleges, businesses, and community foundations. Whether in an ICAN office with an ICAN Student Success Advisor, at a community- or school-based event staffed by ICAN-trained volunteers, or through a virtual event online, FAFSA Ready lowa strives to provide FAFSA completion assistance to any lowan who needs help with paying for post-high school education or training. ICAN also provides training certification for event volunteers, increasing the number of career and college readiness professionals available to assist throughout the state. GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Robert Smiley Scholarship Award – this scholarship is offered by the Iowa Girls' HS Athletic Union and the Smiley Family in honor of the longtime IGHSAU Associate Executive Secretary who passed away suddenly in 2003. It is for senior girls who have a minimum GPA of 2.5 and has lettered in at least one varsity sport. West Lyon is limited to one nomination for this scholarship. E. Wayne Cooley Scholarship Award- this scholarship was established in tribute to the personage who is most responsible for making the "lowa Girl" number one in the nation. The profile of the recipient will reflect discipline, perseverance, character, superior athletic skill, leadership, academic achievement and citizenship traits that have personified the life and expectation of De. E. Wayne Cooley. Five financial awards of \$1000 and one award of \$15,000 will be given. The recipients must be going to an lowa college or university. West Lyon is limited to one nomination for this scholarship. If you are interested in being considered as West Lyon's nomination, contact Miss Mulder by November 30.

<u>Karon Brown Award</u> – this award was established in 2021 as a tribute to Karon Brown who served the IGHSAU in a variety of roles for 43 years. The recipient of this award is recognized for excellence in the classroom, in athletics and must plan on a future in a sports-related field. Her profile should reflect loyalty, perseverance, character and passion for continuing a career serving female athletes. Two recipients will each receive \$2500. Applications are available in Miss Mulder's office. **Deadline is April 3.**

- Requirements: Sign up to receive twice-monthly emails on helping students with academic, career & college planning and enter the drawing after reading the information

<u>lowa Student Technician Scholarship</u> – JJ Nichting Company offers this \$25,000 student technician scholarship program to students wanting to pursue an associate degree in Diesel Technology and ultimately a career in the agriculture service field. This program provides students with training and work experience through classroom study and on -the-job work-study. This is a paid work-study program during scheduled school sessions and fall breaks.

NROTC Scholarship Program – The Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps offers a Marine Option Scholarship with a total value of \$180,000. The scholarship pays full tuition, mandatory fees, books and uniforms for qualifying universities. Recipients must be a naturalized US citizen, age 17-23 with minimum ACT score of 22 or ASVAB score of 74 and must pass USMC Physical Fitness Test.
