1) Parent Pickup- Generally this has run smoothly this year, but there have been a couple of days, typically Friday's that have been a little more worrisome than others.

We understand that people have different thoughts but there are a few things we want to avoid as a school with pickup.

A) Students crossing other cars or buses to get to vehicles without adults

B) Stagnant traffic

C)Cars in the bus lanes

With these goals in mind, we need you as the parent/guardians doing the pickup to think about these things for the betterment of the whole, not the individual. Here are some things to consider, despite the inevitable change in weather.

1)If you park, come to the sidewalk to get your children, do not waive them across to your car.

2)If you need to help buckle a child into a car seat or need to exit your vehicle, pull into a parking spot on the Early Childhood side of the parking lot and pickup your child on the sidewalk to walk to the vehicle. Doing this in the active loop backs everyone else up!

3) If picking up and child is not there yet, keep circling.

4)Pickup only on the Early Childhood side of the lot, this will free up buses and other Daycare Centers to use the other side of the curb without worrying about students running to vehicles on the big side of the parking lot.

As a school we appreciate your help in following these objectives. Safety of all students is our number one priority with student pickup, please help us keep all safe!



Unfortunately we are again, looking for an individual whether be volunteer or we need to pay a stipend, to aid with Morning Cross Walk Duty on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday mornings. As we stated earlier this year when looking for someone to fill this position, this is a position on Knowledge Road and Jefferson that we want to provide for the community when we are able. Unfortunately, with current staff and needs at the beginning of the day, we are unable to cover this spot daily with our current staff. It is an off-campus spot, which is

secondary to meeting the needs of the building coming as a first priority. In the meantime, please slow down on Knowledge Road and observe the 30 MPH speed limit, and stop for anyone who may be in the crosswalks.
