Monday, December 14, 2020

Chair Ron Pagel called the regular meeting of the Dover-Eyota Board of Education, District #533, to order at 6:30 PM in the Dover-Eyota High School Media Center and via Microsoft Teams. CABINET COMMUNICATIONS

<u>High School Principal</u> – Todd Rowekamp shared the following: He has been in communication and meeting with other principals in the area and around the state and the failure rates and what can be done to help students succeed during COVID-19 is a big discussion topic. 2) He congratulated and thanked Members Nelson and Austinson for their time on the school board.

<u>Activities Director/Assistant Principal</u> – John Ostrowski shared the following: 1) He, along with Superintendent Carolan and Member Duellman met with the students from UW Platteville to go over their final project regarding the Dover-Eyota field renovation. The students did a great job especially since they were unable to do a field study here at Dover-Eyota due to COVID-19. 2) The State High School League has been working with the winter sports schedules to allow spring sports to hold a regular schedule due to missing their season last year. 3) He thanked Members Nelson and Austinson for their years of service and input over the years.

Teaching & Learning Department – Nick Truxal was absent.

<u>Elementary School Principal</u> – Dr. Jeanne Svobodny shared the following: 1) We are continuing to provide support to teachers and students for overall wellbeing and mental health along with building maintenance and

cleanliness. 2) Things seem to be settling into a routine and teachers and parents seem to be finding what will work best for them and their students. 3) Due to the pre-school students missing the opportunity for peer interactions, the decision was made to pause tuition during distance learning time. 4) The elementary started a small group session, which consists of five kindergarten students, who are higher risks, who come to the building from 8-10 am. On Friday's two preschool students join this group. 5) Member Johnson asked about concerns and what isn't going well. Dr. Svobodny shared that the technology glitches are the main issue but teachers state that 90-100% of students show up and turn in their work.

Presentation of the 2019-2020 Audit by Clifton/Larson/Allen

Luke Greden of CliftonLarsonAllen gave a quick summary of the 2019-2020 Audit Report. A summary of the fund balances:

- Fund Balances: General Fund Unassigned Balance was \$1,467,731 (down), Restricted was \$204,441 (up), Operating Capital was \$150,894 (down), Long-term Facilities Maintenance was \$688,381 (up), Food Service was \$252035 (up), Community Services was at \$30,744 (down), and Debt Service was \$328,484 (down).
- The General Fund Revenue consisted of 87.23% from state sources, 7.92% from local property taxes, 3.77% from other sources, and 1.08% from federal sources.

A complete audit report will be available in the Superintendent's Office upon request.

A motion was made by Member Andring, seconded by Member Austinson, and carried unanimously to accept the 2019-2020 Audit.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING COMBINED POLLING PLACES FOR MULTIPLE PRECINCTS AND DESIGNATING HOURS DURING WHICK THE POLLING PLACES WILL REMAIN OPEN FOR VOTING FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTIONS NOT HELD ON THE DAY OF A STATEWIDE ELECTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No.533. State of Minnesota, as follows:

1. Pursuant to Minnasota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the precincte and polling places for school district elections are those precincts or parts of precincts located within the boundaries of the school district which have open established by the cities or towns located in who e or in part within the school district. The board hereby confirms those precincts and polling places so established by those municipalities.

2. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 205A.11, the board may establish a combined polling place for several precincts for school district elections not held on the day of a statewide election. Each combined polling place must be a polling place that has been designated by a county or municipality. The following combined polling places are established to serve the precincts specified for all school district special and general elections not held on the same day as a statewide election:

Combined Polling Place: Dover-Eyota High School 615 South Ave. SW Eyola, MN 55934

"This combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No. 533 located in Dover Township, Elmira Township, Eyota Township, Mar on Township P-1, Orion Township, Quincy Township, Viola Township; the City of Dover, and the City of Eyota; Olmsted County, Minnesota.

3. Pursuant to Minnesola Statutes, Section 205A.09, the polling places will remain open for voting for school district elections not held on the same day as a statewide election between the neuro of 7 00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m.

4. The clerk is directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the county auditors of each of the counties in which the school district is located, in whole on in part, within thirty (30) days after its adoption.

5 As required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 204B 16, Subdivision file the clerk is hereby suthorized and directed to give written notice of new polling place locations to each affected household with at least one registered voter in the school district whose school district polling place location has been changed. The notice must be a conforwardable notice mailed at least twenty-five (25) days before the date of the first election to which it will apply. A notice that is returned as undeliverable must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate county auditor, who shall change the registrant's status to "challenged" in the statswide registration system.
