920 PERSONAL BELONGINGS ON SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPERTY

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidelines for students, staff and other individuals in regard to personal belongings on school district property.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

The school board and administration discourages students, staff and other individuals from having their personal property on school district grounds, including having such items in their vehicles when parked on school district grounds. The school district shall not be held responsible for any personal belongings.

III. GUIDELINES

A. All personal items brought into the classroom by students, staff members and others must be approved by the building principal.

- B. Personal items not approved by the building principal can be removed from the premises by the school district administration at any time without prior notification.
- C. This does not include students' "show and tell" items that have been approved by their classroom teacher, as long as there is no school district policy or procedure that prohibits the item being in a school district building.
- D. Any personal items left in a school building at the end of the school year by students, staff and other individuals becomes the property of the school district, giving the school district the right to dispose of the items in any manner it feels necessary.
