Dear Parents/Guardians,

Please be in tune to those at home and let's communicate as needed to help all students get through this time that is joyful for the majority of people. **Line of Communication:** Please try to resolve issues with the classroom teacher first. **Teachers On Call:** If looking to get out of the house a bit and help the school, please consider joining Teachers On Call. This is our way of getting substitute teachers and paraprofessionals into the district. We are often short-handed. **Snow Days/E-Learning Days:** You likely received a message from Superintendent Frie regarding snow days. We will get messages out to you based on what he and our transportation director Cheryl Gardner determine will happen on Winter Days.

The other end is our E-Learning Days. The first 3 days will be regular snow days. No homework or expectations. However, the next 5 days will be E-learning days from home. At the elementary we recognize not everyone will have access to electronic devices, so last school year we created "Choice Boards". Each grade level has these available for you to complete on these 5 days if we should need them. We did not use these at all last year, so this is still new to us. The main objective is to give a few things

for the students to complete, but to also take attendance with the Choice Board. We want these returned so we can mark your student as being present or absent. If after 3 school days in person we do not receive the board back, your student will be marked absent for that e-learning day. 7 days of unexcused absences or more in a school year will result in reports to the Department of Education needing to be submitted for Habitual Truancy, per state law. So, in short, these are not "Free Days", the Choice Boards need to be completed. Teachers will be sharing with you shortly the Choice Boards.
