# Hibernation

In winter, it is too cold and snowy for many animals to find food. Instead, they must hibernate. For some animals, to hibernate means going into a deep sleep. For other animals, it means to not move or eat a lot. Both ways, the animal is saving their energy until spring.

Bears are not the only animals that hibernate. Squirrels, turtles, bats, and many more hibernate as well. Animals must get their food ready for hibernation.

Some animals eat a lot during the fall months to make extra fat and keep them warm in winter. Other animals store food away. Then they can eat whenever they need to during winter.

Next, they must find shelter. This is where animals stay during the winter months. Some animals find shelter in a hole underground, a cave, or inside a tree. They stay there and save energy until spring when they come out, play and find food again!






