Winter weather is just around the corner and I want to remind you of a few key details about delays, school closings, and eLearning information.



School Closings, delays, and eLearning days are announced through our School Messenger system, sent out on our social media sites, and posted on our school district website. The information is also relayed to television stations WCCO, KSTP, Fox 9, and KARE 11 as well as radio stations KDUZ/KARP and KNUJ.

Development of Poor Habits: Regular tardiness can contribute to the development of poor habits and a lack of discipline, which may affect a student's overall work ethic and success in the future.


