

## 2025 Fall Season Review

### Girls Golf

The **Bay Port** Girls continued their dominance of the FRCC Girls Golf scene, winning their 7th consecutive FRCC Championship. The Pirates have held on to the top spot since 2018. (A Conference Champion was not officially recognized in 2020 because of Covid). That dominance carried over to the WIAA tournament series as **Bay Port** also claimed their 9th consecutive WIAA Sectional Title which again qualified them for the State Tournament as a team. Bay Port finished 6th at

the State Meet and were led by **Madelyn Gicius** who tied for 11th. **Payton Dudra, Myah Johnson, Isabel Johnsen** and **Eva Kentop** rounded out Coach **Mitch Meyers's** Pirate team.

**Emma Cunningham, Green Bay Southwest**, had another strong campaign in 2025. The junior was the Golfer of the Year in the FRCC for the third time and had her best finish of her career at the State Meet finishing as the Runner-up, notching a pair of 71's for a two day score of 142. **Emma Hudson** of **De Pere** and **Reece Osowski** of **West De Pere** were the other FRCC individuals who qualified for the WIAA State Meet.

New records were also set this year as **Bay Port** tied the record for 9-hole low score with a score of 150 at Thornberry Creek. The Pirates now share the 9-hole low score with **Notre Dame** who recorded their mark in 2013. Individually, **Cunningham** has the new low FRCC season average finishing with a 36.25 average 9-hole score. **Cunningham** supplants **Grace Durkin, Notre Dame**, who had the previous mark of 36.75 set in 2022.

Hankel's best finish at the State meet came in 2023 when she was runner-up to **Bay Port's Karlie Schock.** **Ana and Maria Cristescu, De Pere,** took home the 3rd place medal in doubles at the State Meet. The Cristescu's improved on their 4th place finish from the previous year. **Ana Cristescu** also took home the Bronze medal in doubles in 2022 (**Sophia Fergus**) and 2023 (**Lillianna Graf**).

## Cross Country



De Pere Redbirds - FRCC Champs

The FRCC also saw success locally and statewide in Cross Country this fall, especially on the boys side. **De Pere** won their first ever FRCC Championship in boys Cross Country. The Redbirds snatched the title from **Green Bay Preble** who had won the previous two titles. **De Pere** was led by **Grady Lenn** who won his 3rd consecutive Individual title after finishing 2nd as a Freshman. **Jacob Nuthals**, **Green Bay Preble** was the runner-up. **De Pere**, led by **Lenn**, then went on to win the WIAA Sectional meet at the

UWGB Shorewood course and qualified for the State Meet as a team as did **Green Bay Preble** who finished as the runner-up at the Sectional meet. **Lenn** went on to claim the D1 State Title posting the third fastest time (15:03.2) in the history of the WIAA State meet and leading the Redbird contingent to a 4th place finish. This is also **Lenn's** 3rd State Title as he was the D1 Champion in the 1600 and 3200 meter runs at the WIAA State Track and Field Meet in 2025.

**Notre Dame**, after competing in Division 1 in 2024, moved back to Division 2 for this year's Cross Country Tournament Series. The Triton Boys captured the Division 2 Sectional Title at Waupaca, thus qualifying their team for Division 2 State Meet. The Tritons finished 4th led by **Leo Muller** who finished 38th.

On the Girls side, **Green Bay Preble** repeated as FRCC Champions. The Hornets bested runner-up **Bay Port**. **Camille Haller**, **Green Bay Preble**, was the conference Champion followed by **Maggie Gerth**, **Pulaski**. **Natalie Portmann**, **Manitowoc**, was the top FRCC finisher at the State Meet placing 17th.

Just like the boys, the **Notre Dame** girls parlayed their move back to Division 2 by also capturing a Sectional title at Waupaca and qualifying as a team for the State Meet. The

Notre Dame girls runners were led by **Anna Miller** who also competes in tennis and made it to the 3rd round of the State Tennis meet in D1 singles. **Miller** led the Tritons to a 5th place finish, placing 16th.

**Bay Port** repeated as FRCC Girls Volleyball Champions and the Pirates currently hold a 20 game FRCC win streak. After qualifying for the WIAA State meet in 2024 the Pirates fell to FRCC newcomer **West De Pere** in the WIAA Sectional Semifinal. The Phantoms avenged a 5-set loss to the Pirates earlier in the year beating **Bay Port** in five sets to claim a spot in the Sectional Final against Kimberly.

Kimberly put an end to the Phantoms season in the Sectional Final in a three set sweep. **West De Pere** finished 3rd in its first season as a member of the FRCC with Phantoms only two losses being to FRCC Champion **Bay Port** and runner-up **Manitowoc**.

The FRCC had another solid season in boys soccer competition this year. Last year, **Green Bay Preble** battled its way to the Division 1 state final after finishing runner-up to **Sheboygan North** in the conference. **Notre Dame** duplicated that feat this year bringing home the silver soccer ball in Division 3. The Tritons lost to Catholic Memorial 2-1 in the state final. **Notre Dame** tied for 3rd with **Bay Port** this year in the FRCC behind Co-Champions **Sheboygan North** and **De Pere**. It was the 2nd straight title for **North** and their 3rd overall in the Conference. Conference Co-Champion **De Pere** also claimed its 3rd FRCC title and its first since the 2011 season.



## **Football**

The FRCC had another season to remember in 2025 after bringing home two State Championships in 2024 (**Bay Port** in Division 1 and **Notre Dame** in Division 2). After sending 3 teams to the semi-finals in 2024 the FRCC again matched that feat in 2025, but this time all three teams moved on to the Championship round after winning their semi-final games. **Bay Port** would get a chance to defend their Division 1 State title against Arrowhead and **Notre Dame**, who won the D3 title in 2024 would move up to Division 2 (WIAA success formula) and would face **West De Pere** (knocked out in the semi-finals in 2024) for the Division 2 final.

The Division 1 title game was a great way to end the 2025 football campaign and an outstanding game to watch from a fan perspective. **Bay Port** was one play away from repeating as D1 State Champions as the Pirates elected to go for the win from the Arrowhead 11 yard line with 1 second remaining rather than attempt the field goal and a chance to take the game into overtime. The Pirates fell to Arrowhead 18-15.

In the Division 2 game it started out looking like it might be one of the highest scoring games in WIAA State finals history with **West De Pere** holding a 21-14 with just a little more than a quarter having been played. The defenses then dug in and FRCC North Champion **West De Pere** defeated FRCC South Champion **Notre Dame** 28-14. **Notre Dame** proved they belonged at the Division 2 level defeating the 2024 D2 finalists Slinger and Rice Lake along the way. The Tritons had also brought a 27 game win streak into the final game. **West De Pere** would finish the season 14-0.

**West De Pere** won the FRCC North for the second consecutive year over runner-up **Bay Port** and will carry a 14 game FRCC win streak into the 2026 campaign. Meanwhile, **Notre Dame's** 27 game overall win streak was snapped by **West De Pere** in the D2 State Title game, but the Tritons, who have won the previous three FRCC South titles, will carry a 23 game FRCC win streak into the 2026 season.

FRCC South Offensive Player of the Year **Kingston Allen - Notre Dame** - set the State record for most rushing yards in a season with 3436 yards. The previous record (3422) was set in 2001 by Adrian Davis of Kenosha St. Josephs. Only three players have rushed for more than 3000 yards in a season. The third, **Christian Collins** (3084) also of **Notre Dame** who accomplished the feat in 2024. Allen, who is only a junior, also had 57 rushing TD's (58 total) on the season breaking the old record of 47 set in 2015.

FRCC North Offensive Player of the Year **Patrick Greisen - West De Pere** - set a State record of 102 career passing touchdowns. He is the only quarterback in state history who has cracked the century mark for career touchdown passes. Greisen is also the only player in state history to have two seasons of

passing for more than 3500 yards and 40 TD's. Greisen's career passing yards of 7990 rank him 6th all-time in the state. Greisen was the 1st D1 or D2 quarterback to pass for more than 300 yards (304) in a State Title game.

Fittingly, **Greisen** and **Allen** were selected as the co-offensive Players of the Year for large schools by the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association. The WFCA also named **Richie Flanigan** as the state large school Lineman of the Year.
