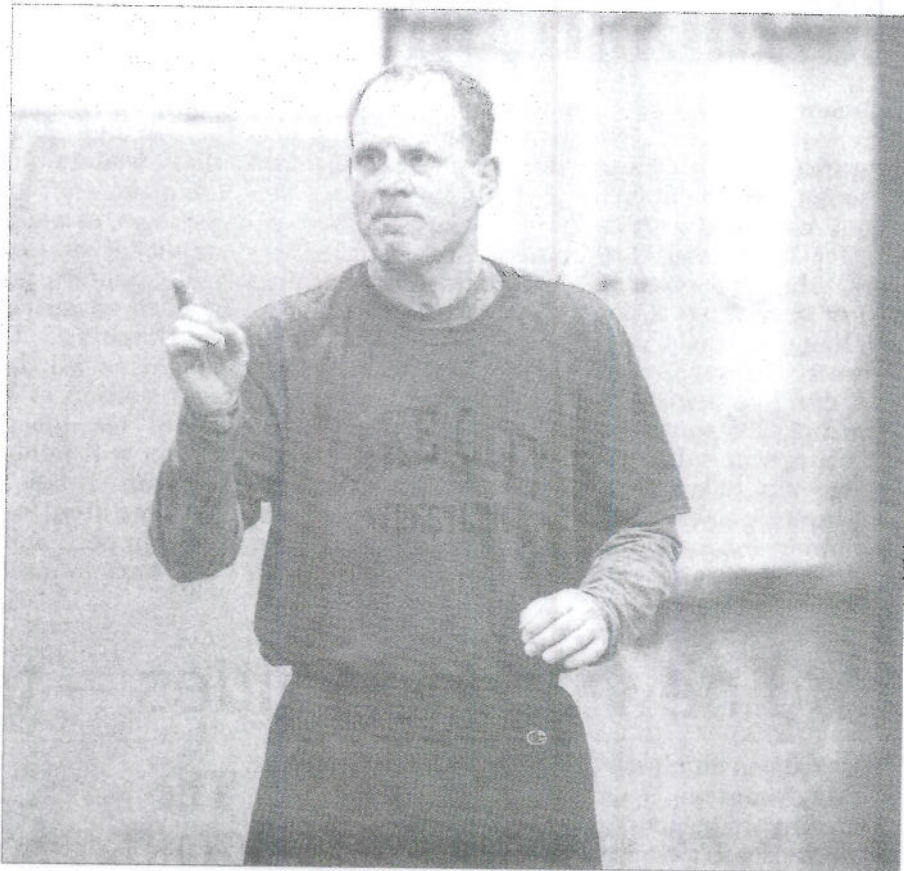

# What's old is new

Vaith returns to  
Lake City wrestling

ting program capped the 2014-15 season on a high note. Three individuals qualified for state, and Shane Siewert took home a title.

Still riding the emotion of the moment, Lonnie West paced the tunnels of the Xcel Energy Center. West had embraced Siewert, but declined an immediate interview. Siewert, smiling and breathless, reviewed his championship bout. Then, the revelation: the Lincoln High School senior was so happy to send his coach off with a win. West, as he would confirm moments later, was stepping down.

Since 1976, Lake City has had three wrestling coaches. John Beal (1976-86), Doug Vaith (1986-2006) and West (2006-15) had combined to build a program that had six individual state qualifiers into one that routinely sends two or three or four per season.

So when West disclosed his decision, the program's future was, for the first time in nearly 40 years, in doubt.

Vaith, the Tigers' athletic director, was hoping for someone with bona fide coaching credentials to step in and take over. That didn't happen.

"We had a couple teaching openings, and we were thinking maybe we would get someone in the wrestling world to come. But that never happened," Vaith said. "In the end, when the opportunity was still there, and I felt like I still had something to offer the program, I still have a passion for wrestling, and I really miss the kids and coaching kids. And my wife said, 'You know, do what makes you happy.' And I missed that.

"The opportunity was there, so why not. I'm an experienced enough AD where, the fall would have been a struggle (to coach), and the spring would have been challenging because there's so many things going on. But the winter, I don't want to say it's not busy, because it is, but it's the one season I could coach."

So coach he will. In his familiar sweatpants, the coach stalked the mats. Vaith's first wrestling practice since 2006 took place on Nov. 16, and afterward he smiled, knowing he was where he was supposed to be.

"It went really well. For the kids, it's new to get a feel for what I have to offer. But it was excellent. The kids are receptive, I know that they're going to give everything they have every day. They're just a bunch of hardworking kids." Vaith

The noticeable change for the program is at the top. But beyond that, everything else will be as familiar as the orange and black singlets. In fact, the new coach and the old coach are sharing the same humid space.

"That's going to be a nice thing for (the wrestlers), there's not much change," Vaith said. "I haven't been in the room for, honestly, the last six years at all. I'll come in and say hi and ask how it's going, but as for the practice structure and what they show and how they do it, (no). Lonnie was under me for 10 or 12 years, whatever it was, so I'm sure a lot of that carried over. And he shared practice plans with me and what he's done in the past.

"And I kept all my stuff from the past, too, just to reference. Wrestling is wrestling, that's not going to change. If I can just provide an inspiring atmosphere and make it fun for them, we'll progress the way we need to."

With numbers in the 30s, progress will be incremental to start.

"To me, that's where my focus is, to increase the numbers," Vaith said. "If we can get some depth, we will be competitive. That's where we're at right now. My last year, we were at 56 kids, and I'd like to get back to that, to get that depth. The season can be a grind, and to have kids 100 percent the entire time will be a challenge."

This season will be tough, at least during duals. But Vaith isn't focused on that, at least not in the short term.

"To build, you have to look at your elementary program and put energy into that, that's your future," Vaith said. "For your high school program, you have to set your team up for success.

"For us, right now, we'll probably go to more individual tournaments because we're an individually strong team. For us to go to a dual tournament, we would struggle for success. And when you're struggling, you're not drawing kids.

"But if we can get to those individual tournaments and come

out with three or four champions, that's something kids hear about and want to be a part of and we can grow that way."

Seniors Jeremy Keller (27-16 last year) and Ryan Hanson (23-15) join junior Carl Kozlowski (18-18) as the foundation of the current roster. Beyond those three, there will be a lot of question marks. Vaith knew that coming in, and he knows it even better after a week of practice.

"If I were coming into this thinking about winning, there wouldn't be a lot to look at," Vaith said. "But I have some kids who I want to make a difference with and help them reach their goals in this sport and maybe in life as well. As an AD, you have a chance to make an impact and work with a lot of different programs, a lot of different coaches and a lot of different parents, but coaching is where you really get to know the kids, in the day-to-day grind, and you share those tough times and those good times. That's what makes it special."

There might be some doubt as to what kind of program emerges over the next few years. But having a coach that has been through it, that lasted two decades in his first run, that has the ear of numerous assistants and former wrestlers, and still gets butterflies when he puts on his wrestling shoes, don't be surprised when that doubt turns into hype.

"You still get that nervous excitement," Vaith said. "When you coach, kids look at you different. I look forward to building and developing that relationship that I've missed for the last nine years. To have the coaches that I have, to have my son with me, to have past wrestlers, I really think we have an opportunity to move things in the right direction."

# Wrestlers bow in opener

The Lake City Tiger wrestling team started the season last Friday as they dropped a 64-9 dual to third ranked Zumbrotta-Mazeppa. Then on Saturday the Tigers finished seventh in the Ellisworth Invitational as they placed five wrestlers in the top six at their weights. Sophomore Tanner Frank placed the highest of the Tiger squad as he finished second at 106 pounds.

Senior Jeremy Keller placed fifth at 120 pounds as did fellow senior Jake Siewert at 220 pounds. Finishing sixth were juniors Denilzo Baltazar (138) and Edwin Vazquez (170).

"Coming in we had no idea of what to expect," said Lake City Coach Doug Vaith. "Now we have established a starting point, and we'll have more of an idea of what direction we have to go and what we have to work on in practice. Overall, though, we had a good effort."

Friday's loss to Zumbrotta-Mazeppa was not unexpected, given the Tigers' inexperience and the Cougars' high state ranking. Lake City got decisions from Tanner Frank at 106, Jeremy Keller at 120 and Gabe Vargas at 285.

"I thought we could be competitive at five or six weights, and we were, but we made some critical mistakes in a few of the matches," said Coach Vaith. The Tigers forfeited four weights, and the Cougars got five pins and two tech falls to account for the margin of victory.

The Tiger junior varsity (JV) gave the Lake City faithful plenty to cheer about earlier though, as they thrashed Z-M's JV 63-27, which included several exhibition matches.

Tonight (Thursday) Lake City hosts Hiawatha Valley League foe Byron in the high school gym, then Friday night in the auditorium the Tigers entertain ninth-ranked Dover-Eyota.

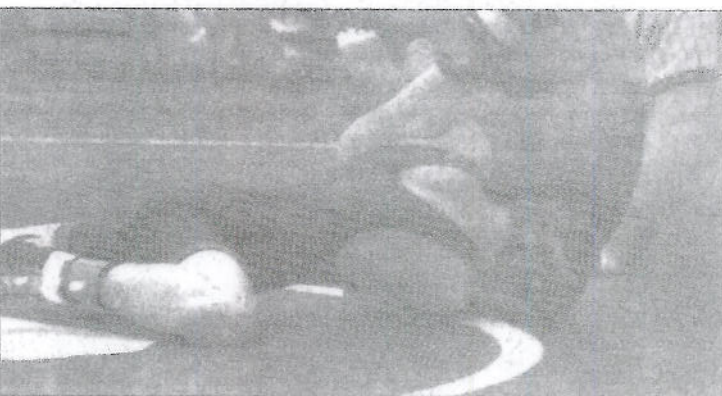

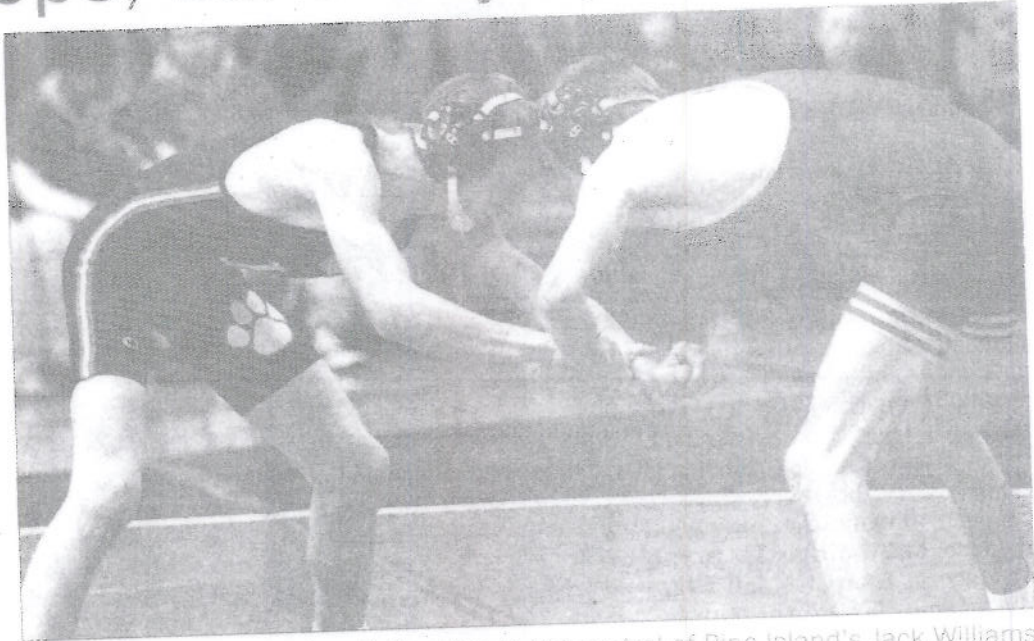

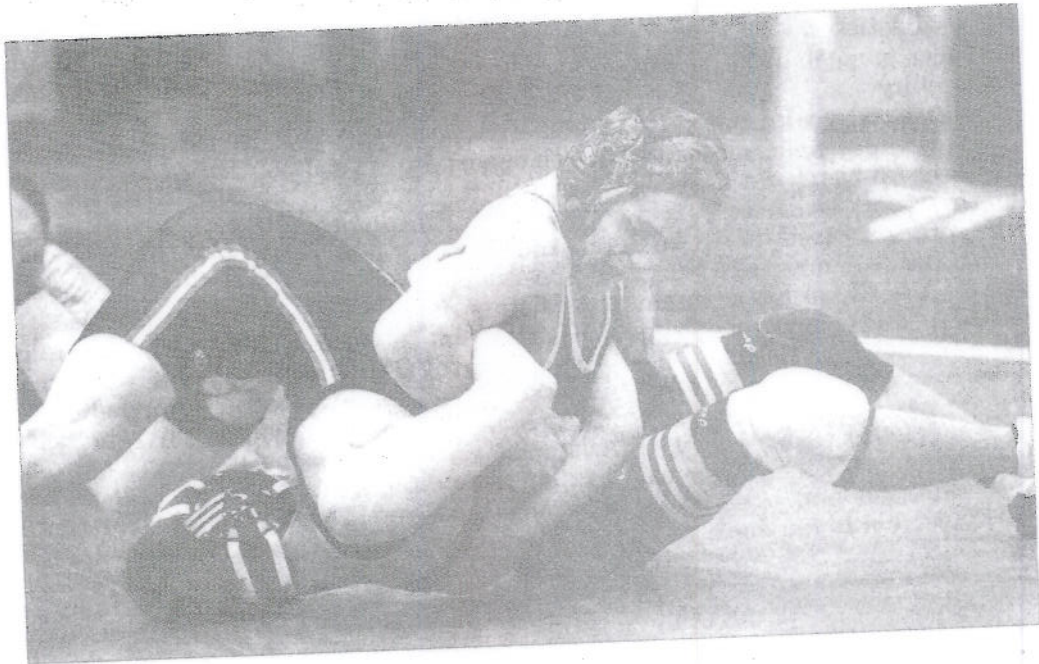


# K-W sweeps, Lake City splits HVL tri

LAKE CITY - Kenyon-Wanamingo came into Thursday's Hiawatha Valley League triangular on a roll. The Knights have lost just once this season, and Class 1A's second-ranked team was coming off a dominating performance over Frazee, the team right behind K-W in the polls.

Nothing much changed against Lake City or Pine Island, as the Knights picked up two dominant victories, 64-5 over the Tigers and 62-15 over the Panthers. Lake City closed the evening with a 37-33 win over Pine Island.

Opening the evening, the Knights handled the Tigers, losing just the opening match by technical fall.

"We wanted to come into tonight and keep rolling," said K-W head coach Matt Ryan. "We've had a couple of intense weekends with the Clash, and then the Bemidji tournament last weekend. We just tried to keep the momentum going tonight."

The gap between the Tigers and the Knights is vast, but head coach Doug Vaith has put together a full lineup, a goal of his at the beginning of the season. And maybe more indicative of Vaith's process, Lake City competed from 106 pounds through heavyweight against K-W, even though wins were far from expected.

(K-W) is a good team, but we're going to go up, we're going to compete to earn some respect, and I think we accomplished that."

With less than a month to go before the section tournaments begin, Vaith

has the Tigers in shape to make a little bit of noise.

"I like where we're at," Vaith said. "If we can stay healthy, we're going to be in shape, we're going to fill out our lineup, and we'll see where we're at in the end. In (Section 1A), this was a big section match (against Pine Island). The kids have been just a joy. I can't believe it's the stretch run. But the kids come in with an incredible attitude, and they give me their best effort every day."

The Knights are also preparing for the post-season, but the grind in Rochester is a thing of the past as K-W was moved to Section 2A this year.

That makes the Clash, and seeing Frazee, good litmus tests before what should be an easier go of it come tournament time. Ryan admitted to having "the highest" expectations for his team. And that could mean a pivotal rematch down the road.

"The chance to wrestle a great team like Frazee was one of the reasons we decided to go back to (Bemidji) this year," Ryan said. "We just wrestled real well. We beat some ranked kids, and everybody stepped up there. We did what we've been doing all year. I didn't expect the score to be what it turned out to be. I thought it would be

closer. But if we wrestle them again, maybe down the road at the state tournament if we both end up there, there could be five or six matches that could be different, so it could be a totally different dual the next time. But I'd rather be on our side of it at this point, make them adjust and figure out how to shave a bunch of points."

Today, K-W will head to Minnehaha Academy for an invitational while Lake City will head to Woodbury for the East Ridge Invitational. Pine Island is also in action today, at an invitational at Lake Crystal-Wellcome Memorial.

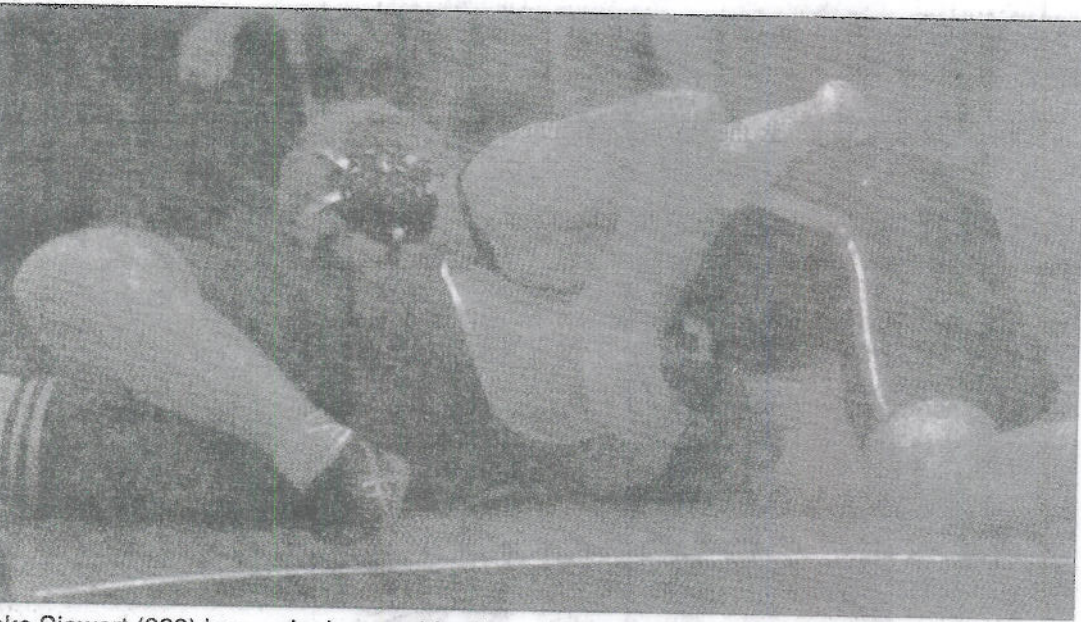

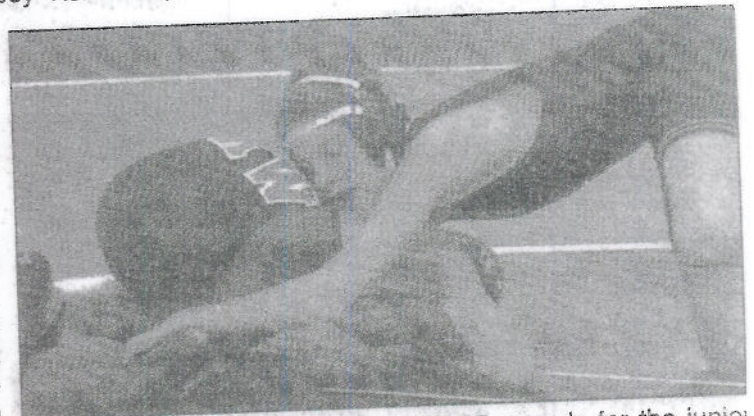
final opponent 6-0 to take fifth place.

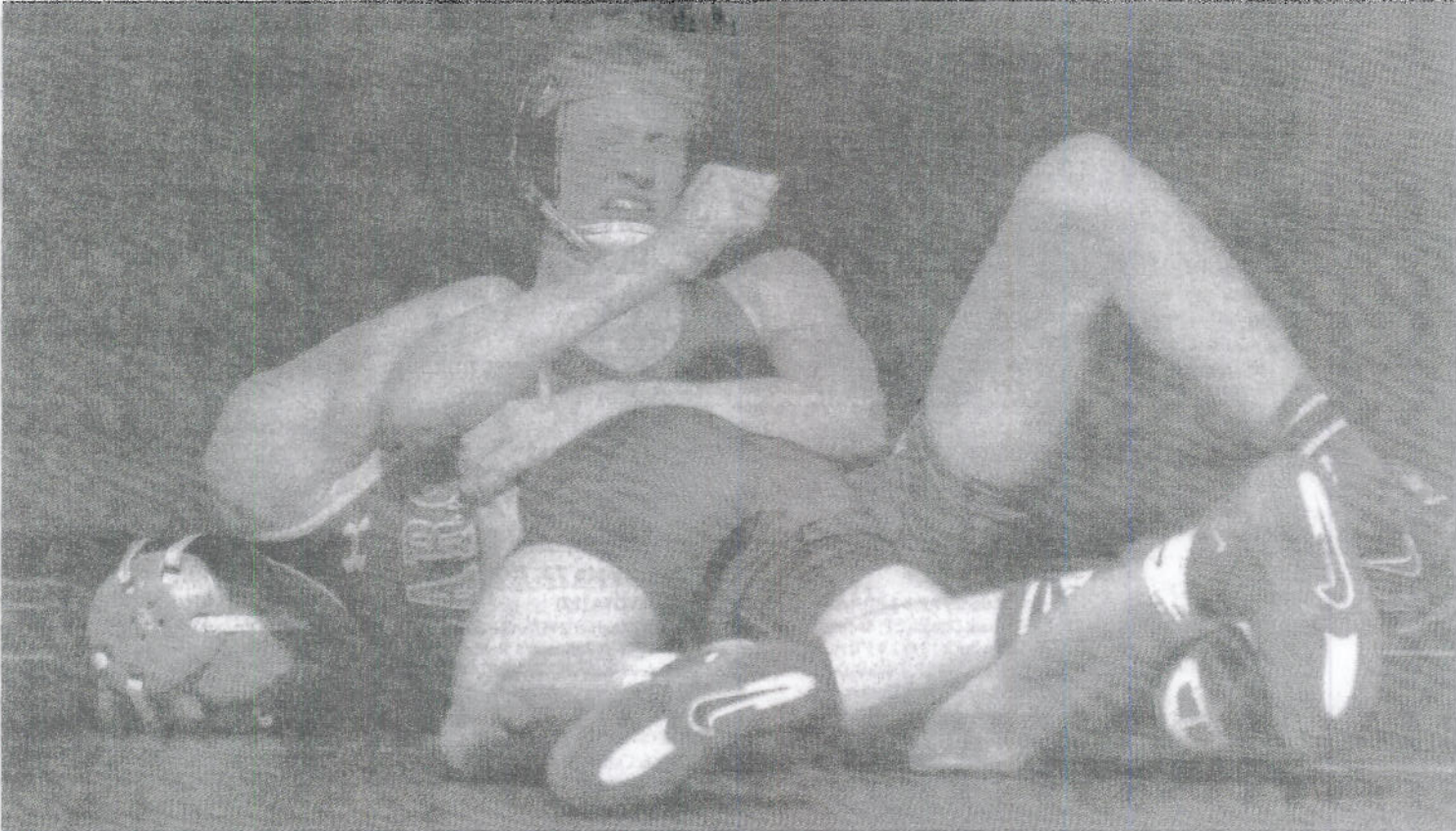

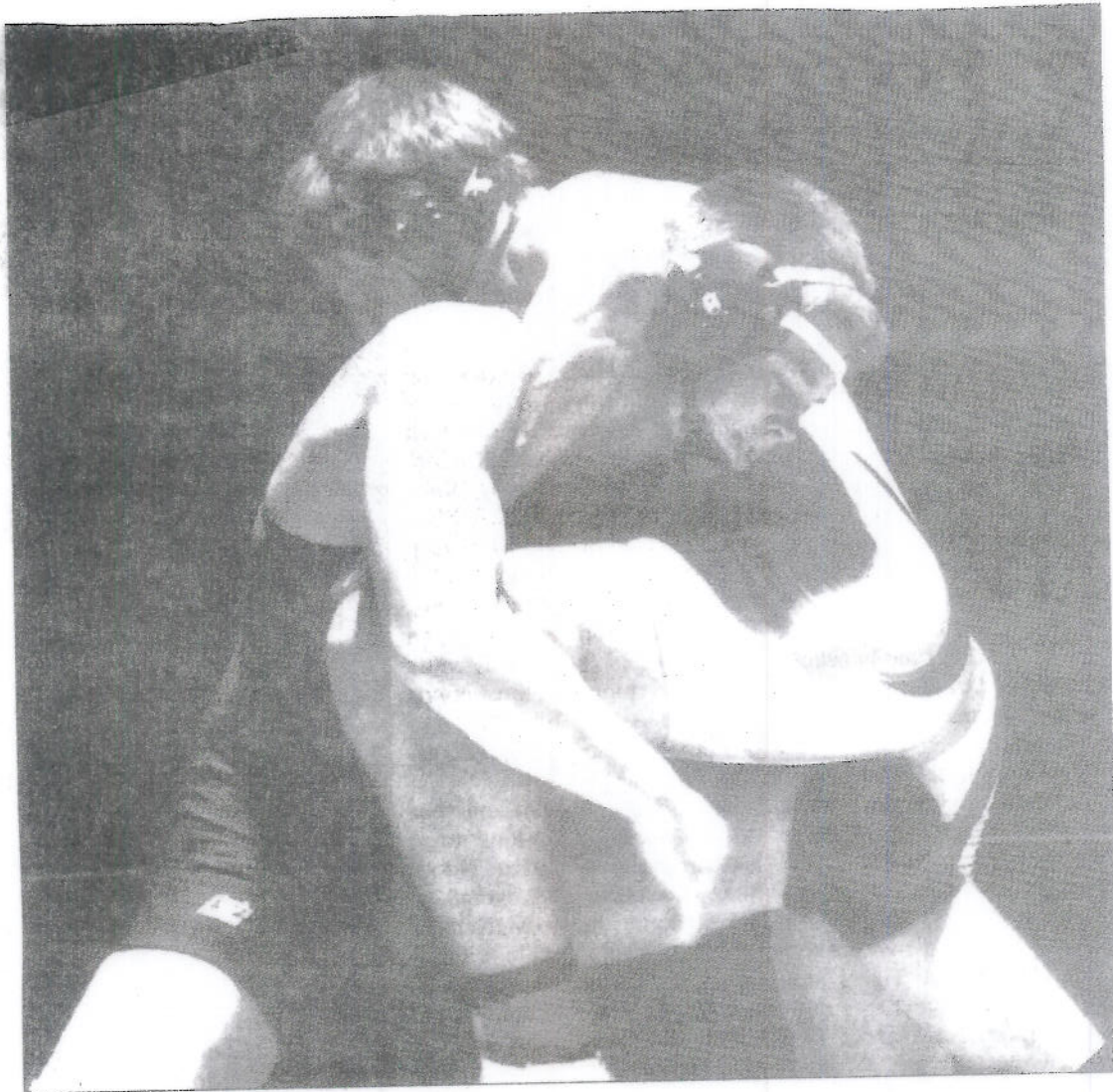

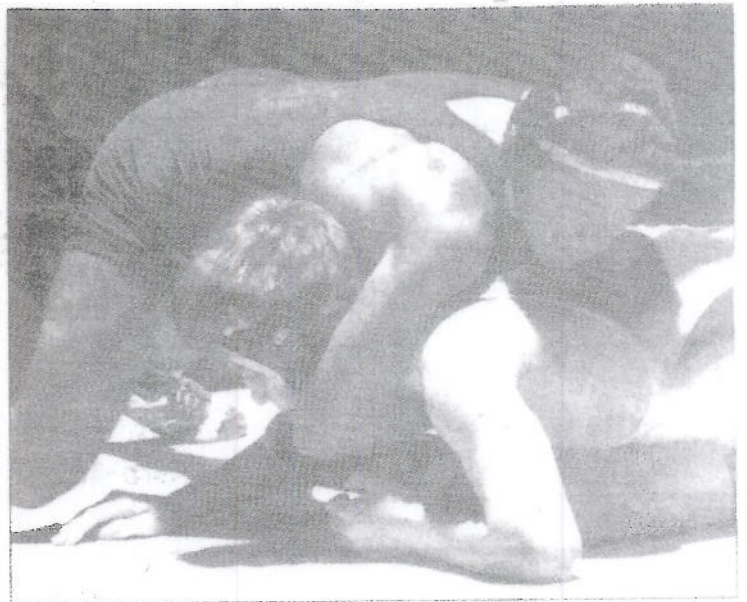
In the Section 1A wrestling tournament round 2 action, Ryan Hanson battles Caledonia's Sam Stemper for position in their 182 pound

match which Ryan won 10-4.

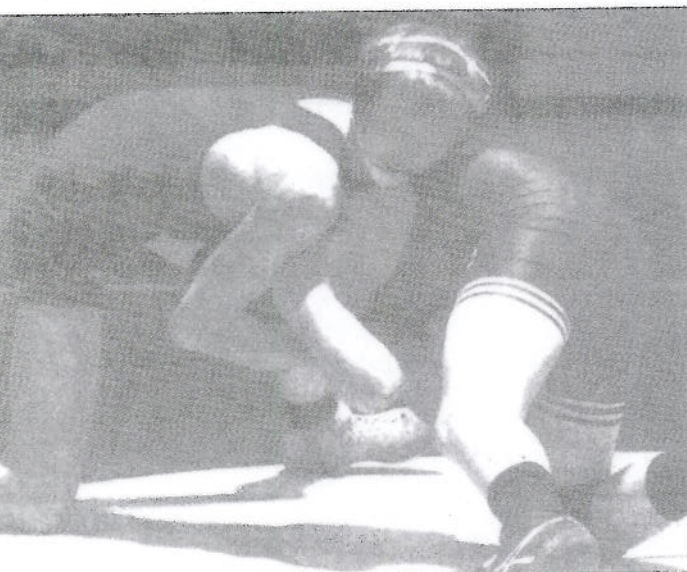

# Wrestlers bow in quarterfinals

The Lake City Tiger wrestling team added one more win to their season total before bowing out in the quarterfinals of the Section 1A team tournament last Thursday. The Tigers beat Chatfield 56-21 in the first round, then they were defeated by eventual section champion Caledonia 55-9.

Lake City ended their dual season with a 9-9 record.

The Tigers took charge of the Chatfield dual right from the start as Tanner Frank won a major at 106, and Jeremy Keller followed with another major at 113. After that it was a matter of racking up forfeits as Chatfield has run into a numbers problem as this season has progressed. The Gophers were open at seven weights, which made the outcome inevitable.

Ryan Hanson had a pin at 195 to round out Lake City's action on the mat.

"Chatfield has had a tough year for various reasons," said Coach Doug Vaith. "It was a case of whether or not we could get a solid effort, and we did."

Caledonia moved from Class AA to A this year as they are no longer paired with Spring Grove, and they were an instant power to be reckoned with in Section One. Thus, Lake City's task was a tall order against the second seeded Warriors.

But the Tigers were competitive against Caledonia's lower weights as they won two of the first three matches and trailed only 9-6 going into the 138 pound match.

"Tanner had a good third period (106), and Luke Meincke wrestled a smart match (120)," said Vaith. "He got a takedown early and didn't give up anything after that (for a 2-0 win). He did his job."

"Denilzo Baltazar wrestled well at 145, and Ryan Hanson won at 182, but otherwise we couldn't compete with their upper weights," said Vaith. "It wasn't all bad. The kids wrestled hard."

Caledonia used their strength in the upper weights to defeat third seed Dover-Eyota 33-30 in Saturday's semifinals, and they did the same in the championship match against top seeded Zumbrota-Mazeppa, winning 35-22.

On Friday Lake City's wrestlers will begin fighting their way through tough fields for possible berths in next week's state tournament.

"We hope we have a handful of guys who can do well," said Coach Vaith. "There are a few who will have to wrestle their best to get through. They know they can do it. Tanner (Frank) is capable if he is able to focus. Jeremy (Keller) has a decent chance, and Ryan (Hanson) is wrestling his best right now."

Class A preliminary and quarterfinal rounds begin tomorrow (Friday) at 2:30 p.m. with consolation quarterfinals lasting until 8:30 p.m.

On Saturday at 11 a.m. championship semis begin, with consolation semis scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Fifth place matches will follow immediately.

Sophomore Tanner Frank (106) upset the number four seed in his first round match Friday, then lost his semifinal Saturday on a last second escape. Frank won the third place match easily, and it looked like he might get a true second match, but his semifinal opponent lost the championship match in overtime.

Seniors Jeremy Keller (113) and Ryan Hanson (182) finished fourth and fifth, respectively, after winning their first round matches. Keller's semifinal match went into overtime on a questionable stalling call, then he was taken down in overtime, ending his championship hopes.

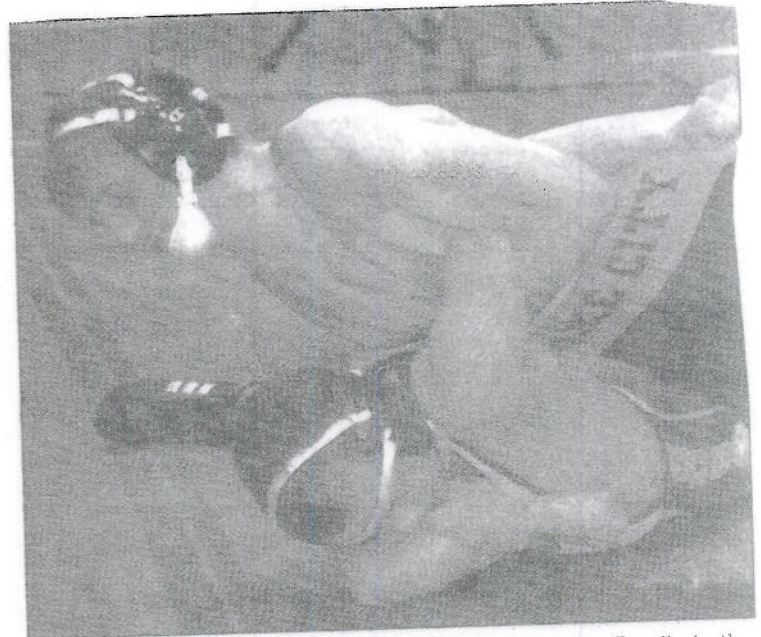

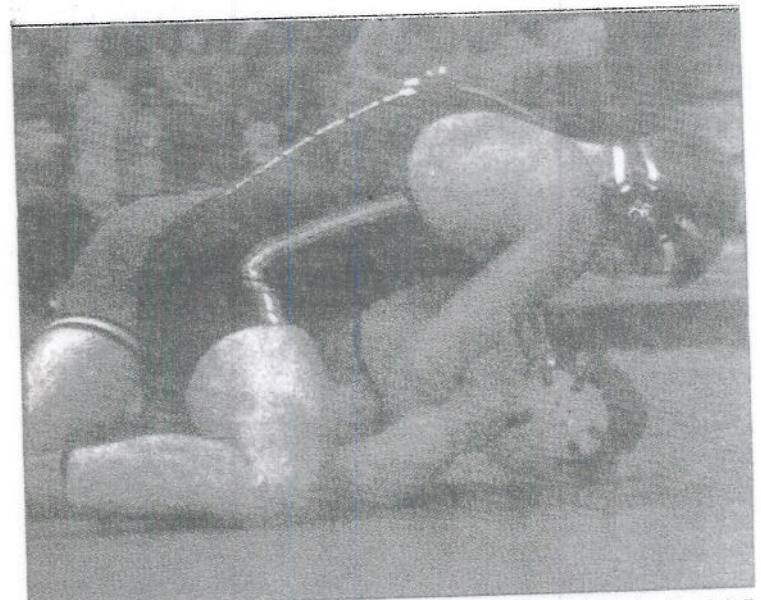

285 - Gabe Vargas was pinned in 45 seconds by eventual champion Tanner Welsh of Dover-Eyota, then he was eliminated by Triton's Adam Vacura who pinned him in 1:02 and went on to finish sixth.

"Gabe came into the season without much experience," said Vaith. "He's small for a heavy-weight but we need him in the lineup."

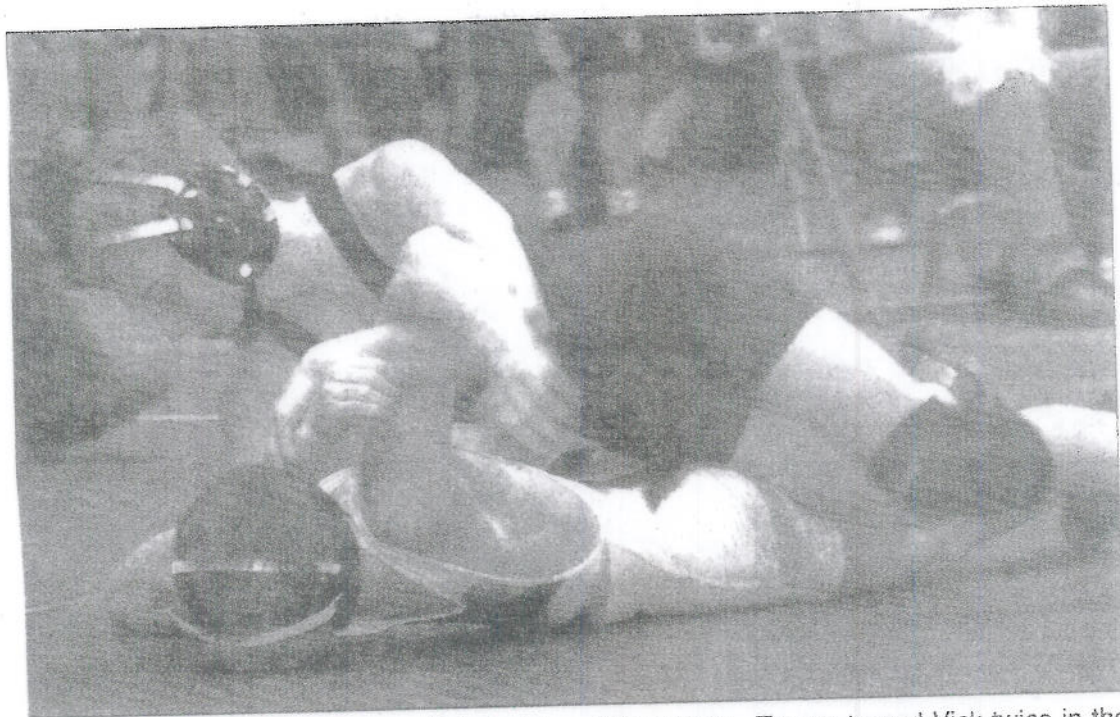
