

Phoenix Cheerleading Handbook

The Brawley School Cheerleaders should promote and uphold school spirit, demonstrate good sportsmanship and citizenship, and support the school's athletic programs. As a Phoenix Cheerleaden:

I will have <u>school spirit</u> and <u>be a positive role model</u> at school, athletic events, and in our community (BOTH in AND out of uniform). I understand that as a cheer<u>"leader</u>", I represent my school and need to emulate positivity, kindness, respect, and cooperation.

As a representative of The Brawley International Baccalaureate World School:
☐ My GRADES must be in good standing to participate in cheerleading. I must maintain a
70% or above in all subject areas. If my overall grade falls behind in any class, I will notify Coach
Stramenga to create an academic plan and attend morning study halls to continue participation in cheer until
my grade improves. If not, I will need to sit out to focus on my school work. My academics come first.
☐ I will be required to get a teacher achievement report filled out once per month during cheer season.
☐ My CONDUCT must remain in good standing to participate in cheerleading. Office
discipline referrals or write-ups will result in sitting out of (not dressing for) the next cheerleading event.
Any suspension or other disciplinary action will result in an equal suspension from cheerleading or dismissal
from the squad (coach/administrator discretion based on the seriousness of the infraction).
☐ I need to follow school rules and show respect to others in class, at school, at practice, and at athletic events. Demerits wi
be given for breaking school rules (this includes the lunchroom rules) or any infractions with school staff, teachers, coaches, or
students. (see demerit section).
☐ I need to clean up after myself at school, at practice, and at games/events. I will throw away my garbage, keep track of my
uniform pieces, care for school equipment, and put things away after I use them.

hair bow, all white cheer shoes with no-show white socks, and poms [See "Game Day
Expectations" for more details]
☐ JV Game Attire: White Cheer Team GameDay tee-shirt, JV uniform skirt, maroon
briefs/boyshorts*, hair bow, all white athletic shoes and no-show white socks

- SOCIAL MEDIA TAKEN DURING STUNTING BY ATHLETES.
- → I will come to practices and games with a **positive**, **caring attitude and an open-mind**. I will work hard and respect the coaches and captain's decisions. I can share ideas and respectfully disagree at appropriate times,

- which *should not* be during a game, event, or during the school day. <u>At no time should I interrupt my coach's</u> classes during the school day with disagreements. These can be made in writing or discussed after school.
- → If I miss the practice before a game or event (or leave early, missing content) without prior notice to the coach, even if it is an excused absence, I may be replaced in a stunt(s) or formation for that game/event and may possibly have to sit out for some of that game. This is not a punishment... If new material is taught/learned, I will not have learned the new material/changes and will not be able to perform them safely. It is also not fair to other parties to have to change the material back again. Please call the school and leave a message to be delivered to the coach in the event of last minute absences in which you plan to still be at the following day's event.
- → Repeated unexcused absences can lead to removal from the squad. (see Attendance Policy below)

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

Attendance is important for line-ups, formations, and stunt group purposes and for the learning of new content at practices to perform at events.

- > Cheerleaders are expected to attend all practices, games, and events on time and stay the entire time, unless prior arrangements are made and/or a commitment plan form is filled out. Captains and Junior Leaders need to be present as much as possible to lead appropriately.
- > Coach Stramenga should be notified as soon as possible through email at <u>alissa_stramenga@iss.k12.nc.us</u> in regards to all absences.
- Only a coach has the authority to excuse a cheerleader from practice or an event.
 Excuses will be granted for illness, emergencies, or prior commitments if accompanied by prompt written notification and/or documentation from the parent directly to the coach through the email provided above. Illnesses and emergencies must be documented as soon as reasonably aware by a parent/guardian or healthcare professional (doctor's notification preferable if seen). Prior commitments require a minimum of 24 hours notice to be counted as excused to allow for practice/event planning purposes.
- Absences without appropriate and timely written notification or prior approval are unexcused absences. For every unexcused absence, the cheerleader will be required to sit out the next game (not dress in uniform for that game). This policy starts upon signing this agreement. Absences without documentation are considered unexcused.
 - If a cheerleader leaves practice or an event early (or arrives late) 3 times without prior approval and appropriate notification, it equals 1 unexcused absence.
- > Five total unexcused absences or two unexcused game absences will result in suspension or removal from the squad or switching spots with an alternate.
- Fig a cheerleader misses the practice before a game without prior notification, even if it is excused, they may need to be taken out of stunts or formations

and/or be required to sit out for the portion of that game, in which stunting or new material was learned. They can dress for the game.

GAME DAY EXPECTATIONS:

- > At school, I will encourage school spirit and excitement for the event.
- > I will wear the planned game day outfit and hair choice to school.

 Unless otherwise noted, this will be my team tee, black bottoms, white shoes, and hair bow.
- > I will bring clean white socks, CLEAN white athletic/cheer shoes, team-appropriate uniform pieces, maroon briefs/boyshorts, a snack, and a water bottle with my name on it to school for the game.
- > No excessive make-up is permitted. Appropriate make-up to wear at the game= mascara, natural blush/eyeshadow, and a neutral lip color (nude colors, mauves, and maroon lip tones are fine). Gold cheek shimmer or glitter is permitted.

If I choose to wear eyeliner or eyeshadow, I will choose a neutral/natural color that will not clash with our uniforms (ie: gold, taupe, and brown shadows are all good choices and brown or black eyeliner is fine) and that looks natural with my skin tone.

- > At the game, I will know the cheers and chants required for that game and perform them to the best of my ability. I will maintain good posture, smile, cheer loudly, and encourage crowd involvement. I will also demonstrate good sportsmanship and promote school spirit.
- > I will pay attention to my coach and cheer captain(s) to see/hear called cheers and chants. I will not argue about performing content at games that has been pre-arranged/agreed upon at practice. I can share my opinions for changes during/before/after practice time or through email/written suggestions.

DEMERIT SYSTEM:

- > Demerits can be given for not following any/all of the above expectations. Written notification will be given for each demerit after one warning is received. Warnings are not guaranteed for all first offenses.
- > One demerit can lead to the demotion of captains or junior leaders. Squad leaders are expected to act as positive examples and should not receive demerits.
- > Three demerits [or any 1 school discipline write up] = sitting out of one game or event
- > Five demerits = squad dismissal (or a written behavior plan per coach discretion)
