

## Washington Interscholastic Activities Association STATUS OF CHEER and/or DANCE/DRILL PROGRAMS

WIAA rules and The Office for Civil Rights (OCR) considerations affect school programs: Each WIAA member school district will determine if cheerleading and/or dance/drill programs will be classified as an activity or as a sport. If a school declared cheerleading and/or dance/drill as a sport, the criteria under "as a sport" must be met.

**BUDGET** Determined by local school board. Determined by local school board.

**SEASON** Set by the local school board Defined beginning and ending dates

**TEAM SELECTION** Criteria may be subjective. Same as for other sports (athletic

Tryouts may be held at any time. skills). Tryouts may take place only

during the season.

**PURPOSE** Performance/school support. Competition only.

**PRACTICE** No restrictions. Class time cannot be utilized.

**CONCURRENT** No restrictions. Allowed only for 1B or 2B students.

**PARTICIPATION** A student could participate on both the activity and sport squads.

COACHES All coaches must meet WIAA coaches' standards, regardless of the

**REQUIREMENTS** classification of the program. The same person could <u>not</u> coach both

programs.

**OUT-OF-SEASON** Do not apply. Coach is restricted to coaching only during

**REGULATIONS** the designated season.

WIAA STATE Cheerleading State Championships are held at the end of January or the

CHAMPIONSHIP beginning of February; Dance/Drill State Championships are held the third

weekend in March. A separate sport division will be provided only if a minimum

of four schools per category qualify for state.
