RPI & LEAGUE STANDINGS



- RPI becomes more accurate as more scores are entered.
- ADs and officials have the ability to enter scores.
- If you notice incorrect scores, they must be corrected through Arbiter.
- If you notice an error in league standings, please notify WIAA staff member Nick Mendro.



SEEDING COMMITTEES



• RPI is what seeding committees use as their start

for seeding the qualified teams onto the brackets.

• The RPI does not take into account contests against different classifications, and games against out of state teams are calculated as 50% win.



SEEDING COMMITTEES



- Seeding committees take into account injuries or illness to key players, at what point in the season teams may be at their best performance, strength of schedule, league schedules, tournament play, and any other factors known about the qualified teams.
- The RPI is only ONE piece of what they use and teams may be moved up or down by the seeding committees.
- Input provided by each league representative on these committees is critical for placement of the teams on the bracket.

GAMES COMMITTEES



- Each league and WIAA District must establish a Games Committee for every sport offered.
- The Games Committee, not the WIAA staff, must rule on protests or appeals of ejections in which a subsequent contest will be played in less than two calendar days.
- Games Committees must also be prepared to handle any issues during postseason contests.



GAMES COMMITTEES



- If a team protests a contest, following a determination by a WIAA staff member that a rule has been misinterpreted or misapplied, the Games Committee would convene to determine the outcome.
- Video cannot be used.
- If a school is appealing an ejection due to a judgement call by an official, video MUST be provided.

PREGAME

Should occur before all contests at all levels:

- Includes: Officials, coaches, captains and game management
- Cover:
 - **EAP**
 - Contest interruption



CONTEST INTERRUPTION



Examples of harmful behavior to be reported include:

- Derogatory cheers, chants or slurs directed at teams or individual participants
- Hateful comments of any nature as it may relate to:
 - Race/Ethnicity
 - Gender Identity/Expression
 - Disability
 - \circ Religion
 - Age
- On court/field interactions between a coach, official, participant, crowd that are derogatory in nature

HANDBOOK



- MyWIAA Houses all relevant forms for ADs
- Membership houses Co-ops/Combines
- Classification will have all options and appeals
- Handbook has ejections/violations/waivers
- Utilize the search function to find what you need



STICKY WICKET

If your league offers tennis or golf in the fall in which students can qualify for the spring state championships, then also compete in a spring sport, or if students in a 1B or 2B school are allowed to participate in two sports at the same time, they could possibly qualify for a second State Championship, please understand that accommodations for changes in schedules or brackets are not possible due to the domino negative effect for the event.



STICKY WICKET

- There is absolutely no such thing that a change or accommodation will impact only that one individual.
- It is important to track these individuals.
- The WIAA Executive Board just dealt with violations of 25.2.8 by seven different schools whose athletes qualified for spring State Championship events and chose not to compete.
