- The School Board of Red Wing Public Schools believes that education is a shared responsibility of the student, family, school, and larger Red Wing community. Further, the Board recognizes that academic achievement and success of our students depend on the strength of the partnerships developed among students, families, schools and the community from birth through graduation and beyond.
- Red Wing is committed to the goal of providing quality education for every child in this district. To this end, we want to establish partnerships with families and with the community. Everyone gains if school and home work together to promote high achievement by our children. Neither home nor school can do the job alone. Families play an extremely important role as children's first teachers. Their support for their children and for the school is critical to their children's success at every step along the way.

## Part I. District Expectations

Red Wing Public Schools agrees to make sure there is effective involvement of families and to support a partnership with families and the community, each Title I school and the district will:

- Provide families of Title I students assistance in understanding FastBridge screening and progress monitoring assessments, the parent and family engagement rights of Title I, and work with their child's teachers to improve the academic success of their child(ren).
- Provide materials and training to help families work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement.

  - $\circ$  the carrying out of other activities, such as those described in section 1116 of the ESSA

#### Activities:

• The District Policy Handbook (Parent Handbook) is made available to all families in Red Wing annually and is also available on the district website. Topics include State and District assessments, academic content and achievement standards, Parents' Right to Know, volunteer opportunities, Parent Involvement Resource Center, and other district information. This handbook is available in a variety of languages and can be translated through the website.

• Curriculum links for activities and resources are shared through the building Title I newsletters

• A virtual Title 1 parent meeting is held each fall that covers the topics of Title 1 identification, Title 1 curriculum, Title 1 overview, and Parent Rights.

• The Title I Family-School Compact is shared with permission forms to families of students who qualify for Title I services. Through this meaningful, individualized conversation, the child's academic assessments are shared and academic goals are determined. The role of the school, family, and child is discussed to ensure that the child can reach his/her fullest potential to meet the rigorous academic state standards.

• Parent-Teacher conferences are scheduled in November and March and families are invited to stop in and meet with the Title I teachers.

5. Red Wing will, with the assistance of its Title I schools, provide materials and training to help families work with their children to improve academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to promote family engagement.

#### Activity:

Information, ideas, and materials will be shared with parents at Family Engagement events. Additional information about
improving student achievement will be shared with parents via monthly Title I newsletters. Three family engagement
events are hosted throughout the year.

6. Red Wing will, with the assistance of its Title I schools and parents/family members, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff, in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, in the value and utility of contributions of families, and in how to implement and coordinate programs and build ties between families and schools.

#### Activities:

• The Title I Building Leads will meet 3 times a year to discuss topics related to Title I. Topics will include Title I guidelines and compliance understanding, ways to help build the capacity of family engagement, and effective use of data driven instruction, recording and communication as well as reflection and cross district collaboration opportunities to review Title I program goals and progress.

• The Director of Teaching and Learning will host meetings with Title I Principals to review, revise and discuss the planning, implementation and evaluation of their Title I Plans. Family Engagement Plans, barriers, data-driven events, collaborative efforts, as well as examples of successful events will be discussed.

7. Red Wing will coordinate and integrate parental engagement programs and activities with federal, state, and local programs, to implement effective parent and family engagement strategies that improve student achievement and school performance.

#### Activities:

• Colvill Family Center, an early childhood center operated by the school district, houses public preschool programs, Head Start, public health services, and adult basic education. Collaborative outreach will continue to take place in such areas as early childhood screening, kindergarten readiness, kindergarten boot camp, and teacher training.

• During this school year, the district is developing a parent resource website that will include family engagement strategies and/or activities that will help support academic achievement.

8. Red Wing will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of families, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this family engagement plan in improving the academic achievement of Title I students and schools.

Reviewing and evaluating the parent and family engagement activities/programs to:
