## Nick Connelly Class of 2015 Scholarship Fund

Nick Connelly is a 2015 graduate of Red Wing High School. He and his younger brothers, Hunter and Christian grew up living in Welch and Red Wing, Minnesota. Nick's 8th grade started at Red Wing School. He participated in track and field throwing shot put and disc, played basketball a few years and really found his gift at excelling as a football player. Nick was a God gifted big young man with a frame to carry muscle and weight. Because of his size, his kind heart, and respectful attitude, Nick was often referred to as a "Gentle Giant". His dedication to working hard in the weight room made him an outstanding 2-way football lineman. Nick's achievements were recognized as All Conference-Big Nine, All Metro, All State, and The #2 ranked football player in Minnesota's class of 2015. Nick received a full ride athletic scholarship from Coach Jerry Kill to play football at the University of Minnesota. He played offensive tackle for the Golden Gophers for 3 seasons from 2015-2017. In December 2017, Nick resigned from football due to multiple concussions. Nick's high school and college coaches and teachers enjoyed working with him and appreciated his hard work, positive attitude and humble, teachable spirit.

Nick was a 3.3 GPA college student and was set to graduate in May of 2019 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminology and Social Deviance from the University of Minnesota. Nick's desire was to become a federal law enforcement agent.

Nick enjoyed his friends, hunting ducks, pheasants, geese and deer with his dad and brothers. He enjoyed grilling, smoking meat and cooking with his mom. Nick also enjoyed shooting sporting clays, snowboarding, golfing, fishing and staying in good physical shape. Nick's faith in Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior started at a very young age and remained central to his life to the very end. He attended River Valley Church - Minneapolis Campus. Nick had a 3 ½-month battle with Burkitt's Lymphoma. The evil cancer took Nick's life September 19, 2018, but Nick continues his life for eternity, with his savior Jesus, in heaven.

The Nick Connelly Class of 2015 Scholarship Fund is intended to be a tribute and memorial to the remembrance of Nick Connelly. The scholarship fund will function to recognize and award a Red Wing High school senior student that most exemplifies the life attributes of Nick Connelly. The scholarship fund will be comprised of an Executive Committee. The Executive Committee will provide oversight and decision making to ensure candidate selection and process fulfills the intent of the scholarship. The Executive Committee will work along with In Faith Foundation to help administer the funds to Red Wing High School local scholarship awards.

# DORIS GRUBER SCHOLARSHIP CAREER IN BUSINESS OR BUSINESS EDUCATION

Doris Gruber was employed by Independent School District #256 (Red Wing Schools) for over five decades. She served as the Office Education Coordinator and as a Business Teacher, along with serving as the co-curricular advisor of the Office Education Association (later known as the Business Professionals of America) for 34 years. After her official teaching retirement, she continued employment with the district as a substitute teacher and an assessment proctor/team member for ACT, MCA (Minnesota Comprehensive Testing), and the Advanced Placement Testing for the next 18 plus years with the Red Wing Schools.

This scholarship will serve as a tribute to Doris Gruber as a professional educator. The scholarship fund (granted from the Saint Paul & Minnesota Foundation and distributed by Red Wing Public Schools) will recognize and be awarded to a Red Wing High School senior student and/or a senior high school student of the MN BPA (Business Professionals of America) who desires to pursue a *business program* (technical, community college, or four-year college), OR a four-year business education degree program.

Please note that the Doris Gruber Scholarship *excludes application to Minnesota State College Southeast* (due to another local foundation scholarship fund).

The scholarship fund will be managed by an Executive Committee named by Doris Gruber (for the Red Wing Schools Scholarship). The Executive Committee will provide oversight and decision making to support the process and candidate selection of the scholarship recipient(s). The Red Wing High School senior recipient may be recognized at the high school's Senior Awards Night.
