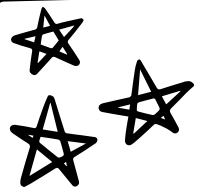
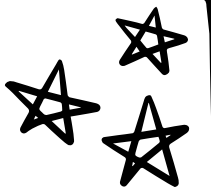


PSEO INFORMATION

What is it?



PSEO (Post-Secondary Enrollment Option) is a College program that allows 10th, 11th, & 12th grade students the opportunity to take college courses (through participating institutions), while in high school.



Need to Know:

- College is not high school!
- The PSEO student is a college student and is treated as such by the college.
- Instructors & Staff at the college work with the student directly, not parents.
- Parents/Guardians and Counselors do not have access to PSEO grades until the course is complete.
- FERPA law prohibits the release of student records to anyone but the student.
- Students must be enrolled full-time between RWHS and PSEO Institution.
- All PSEO classes will be entered on the high school transcript.
- Students are responsible for completing and submitting all the required PSEO forms by each institution's deadlines.
- Counselors are not available over the summer to fill out paperwork.
- Students should refer to each institution's website for information on application requirements, processes, & deadlines.
- Students are responsible for checking the school website for announcements.
- Students are responsible for following both RWHS and the PSEO institution's academic calendar

Responsibilities of Withdrawing

- Withdrawing - Students' responsibility to follow deadlines and procedures to withdraw from a course.
- If students want to withdraw from a course they must communicate with both their high school counselor and their PSEO Advisor.

Academic Warning/Suspension

- Academic Warning/Suspension looks different for each institution
- May affect enrollment in both PSEO and future Undergraduate courses!

Required:

- All students must complete a RWHS PSEO Contract Annually.
- Contracts are due to RWHS Counselors with a copy of their PSEO Schedule by May 10th for Fall Enrollments and Dec. 1st for Spring Enrollments.
- Students must meet with their high school counselor each semester to go over their PSEO/high school schedule, complete required forms, and track progress toward graduation.
