

The DC Tuition Assistance Grant (DCTAG) expands higher education choices for District residents by providing grants of up to \$10,000 toward the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition at public four-year colleges and universities throughout the U.S. and its Territories. DCTAG also provides up to \$2,500 per academic year toward tuition at private colleges in the Washington, DC Metropolitan Area, private Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) nationwide and two-year colleges nationwide. Currently, DCTAG has students attending over 300 colleges and universities.

### DCTAG Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must be:

- A US citizen or have eligible non-citizenship status.
- One who is attending an eligible public or private college or university; and
- A District of Columbia resident for at least 12 consecutive months prior to the applicant's first time in college and continued residency throughout the applicant's college matriculation.

For dependent students (under age 24) residency domicile is established through the parent.

Parents of dependent students must have a citizenship status that enables them to establish domicile in the District of Columbia.

Many student athletes can receive the benefits of both the DCTAG Award as well as their Athletic Grant-In-Aid Award. In some instances, however, the Athletic Grant-In-Aid Award may have to be reduced to reflect the impact of the maximum DCTAG Award. Specific information will have to be obtained from an individual student's college or university financial aid office.
